As an importer, Ift sal sources from 2 municipalities, or 1% of the pork production municipalities. The main destination of the pork imported by Ift sal is Congo democratic republic of the, accounting for 100% of the total.

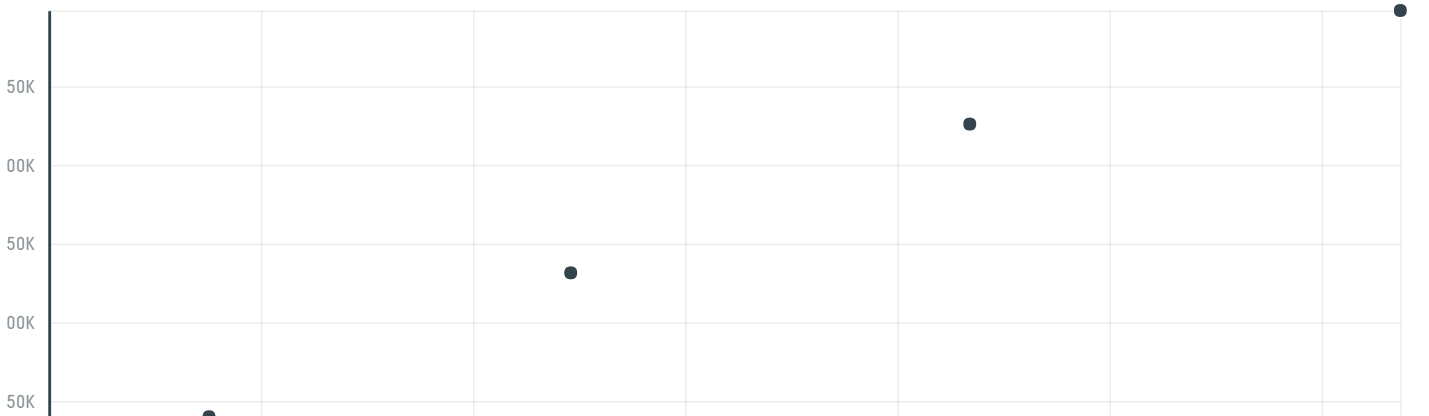
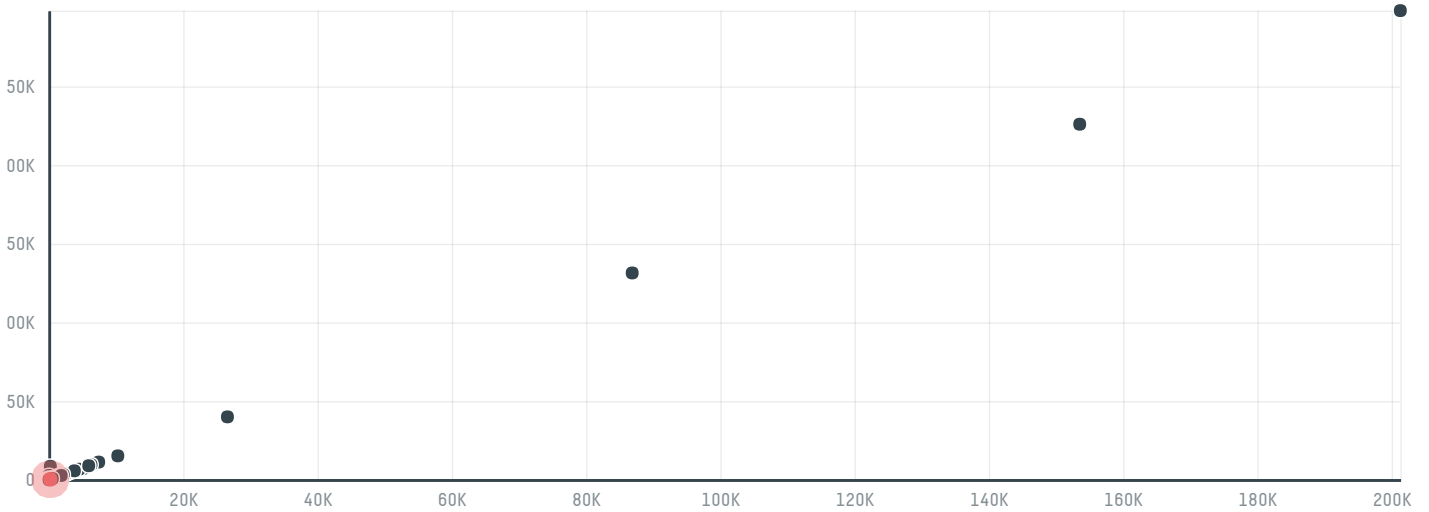
