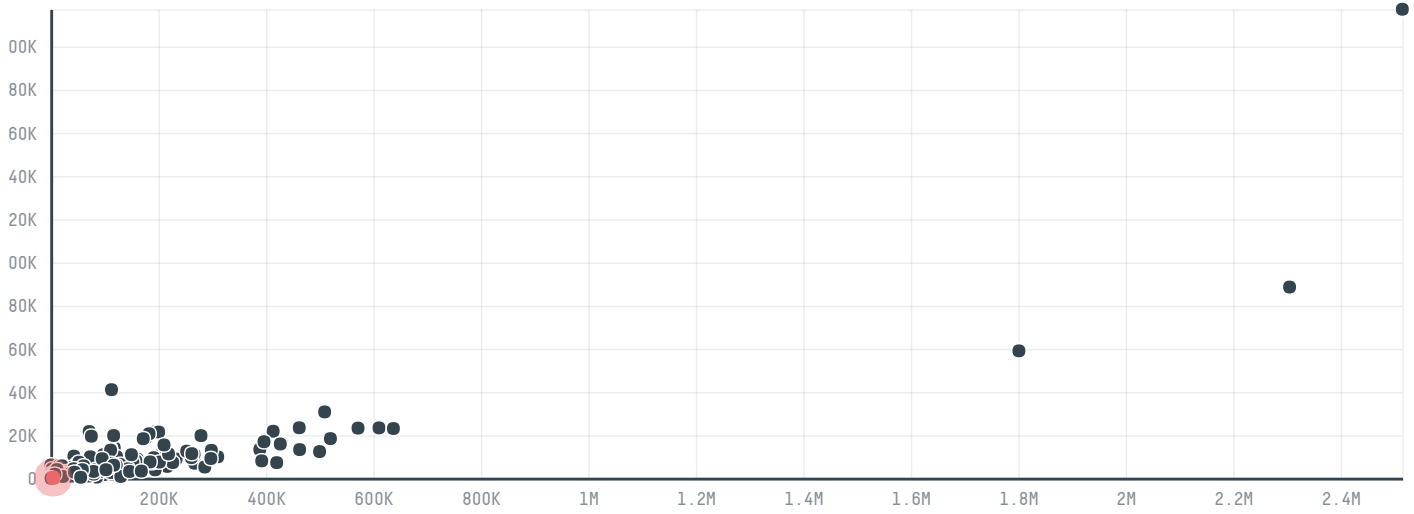
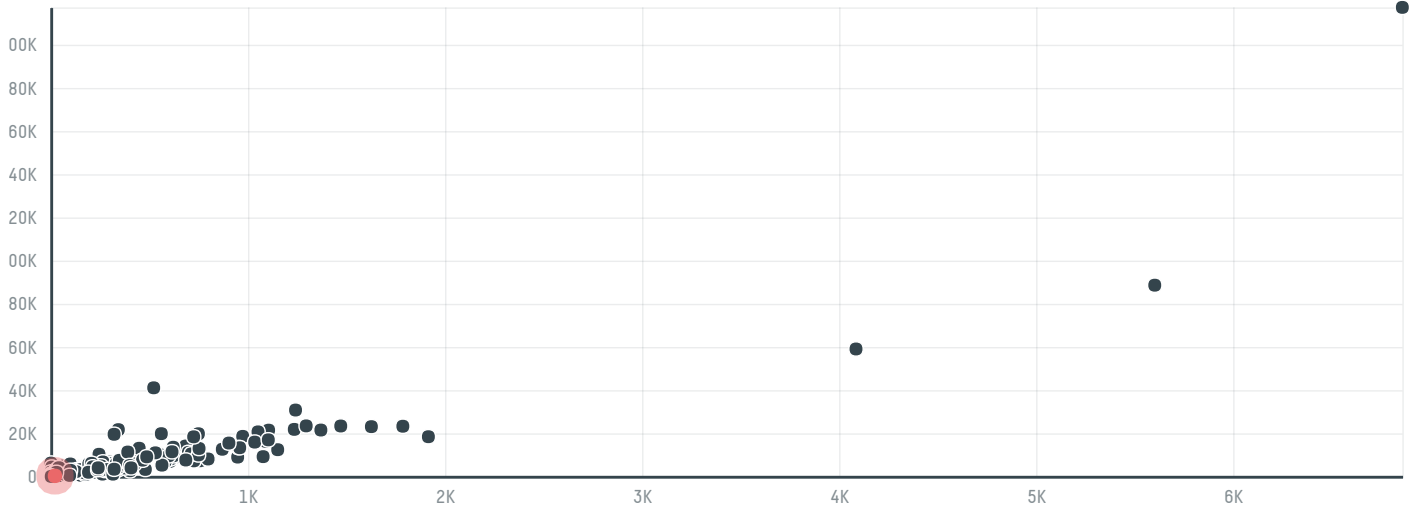
## Congelados herbania

Congelados herbania was the 648th largest importer of beef from BRAZIL in 2017, accounting for 303 tons. This is a 141% increase vs the previous year. As an importer, Congelados herbania sources from 153 municipalities, or 5% of the beef production municipalities. The main destination of the beef imported by Congelados herbania is Spain, accounting for 89% of the total.
