AREA PRODUCTION OF SOY SOY LAND
713 km² 924 t 330 ha

In 2016, Barrolandia produced 924 t of soy occupying a total of 330 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 1286th in Brazil in soy production, and 76th in the state of Tocantins. The largest exporter of soy in Barrolandia was Amaggi & Ld Commodities, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was China (Mainland).

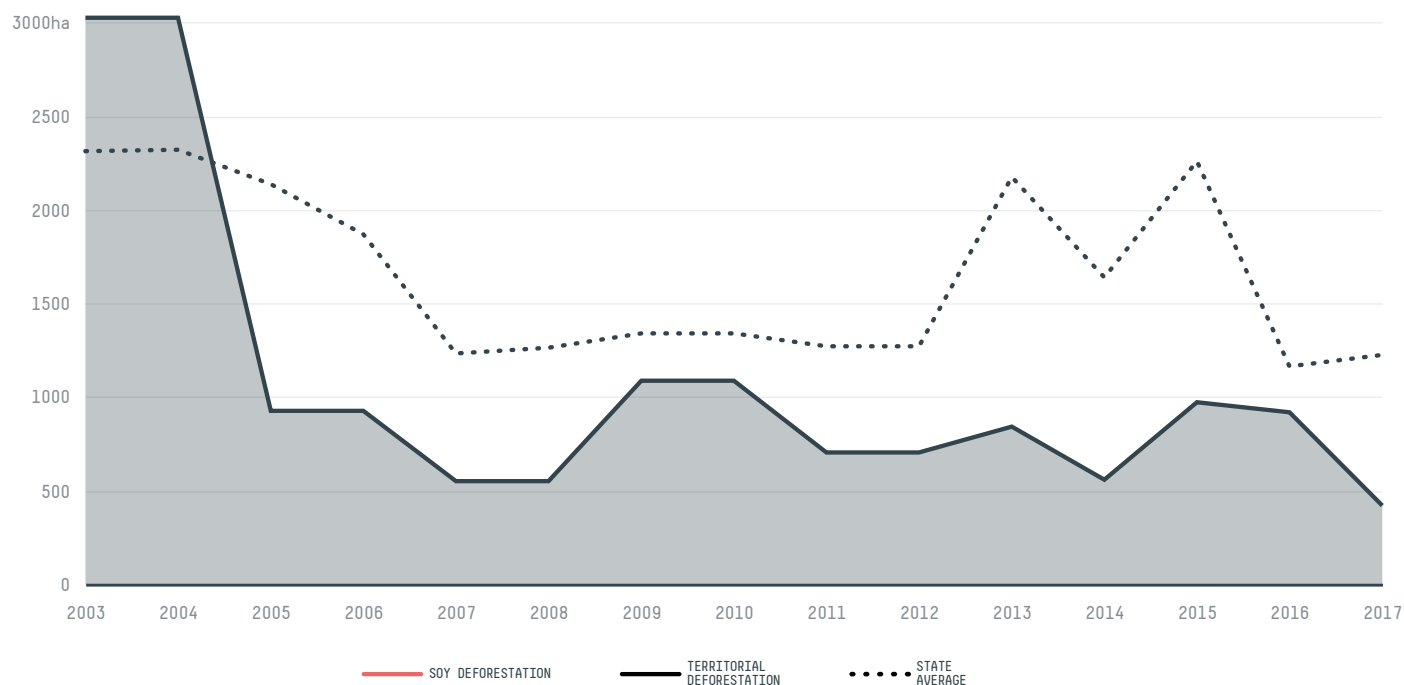

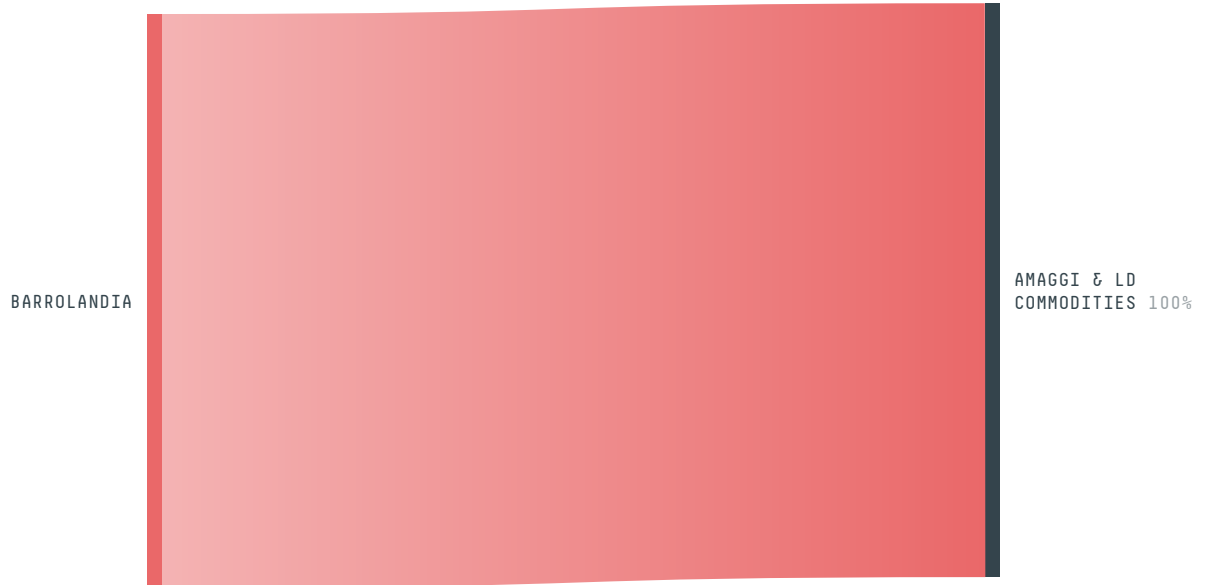
