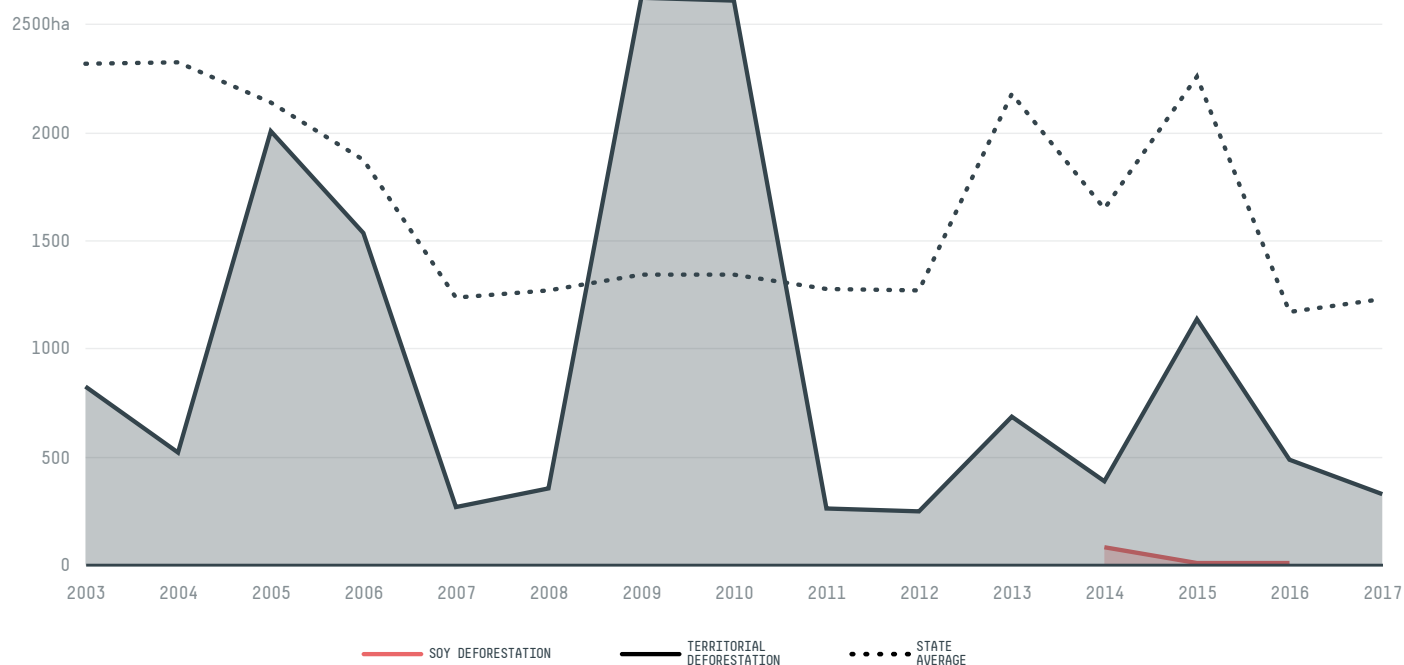

In 2017, Pequizeiro produced 432 t of soy occupying a total of 180 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 1555th in Brazil in soy production, and 83rd in the state of Tocantins. The largest exporter of soy in Pequizeiro was Amaggi & Ld Commodities, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was China (Mainland).

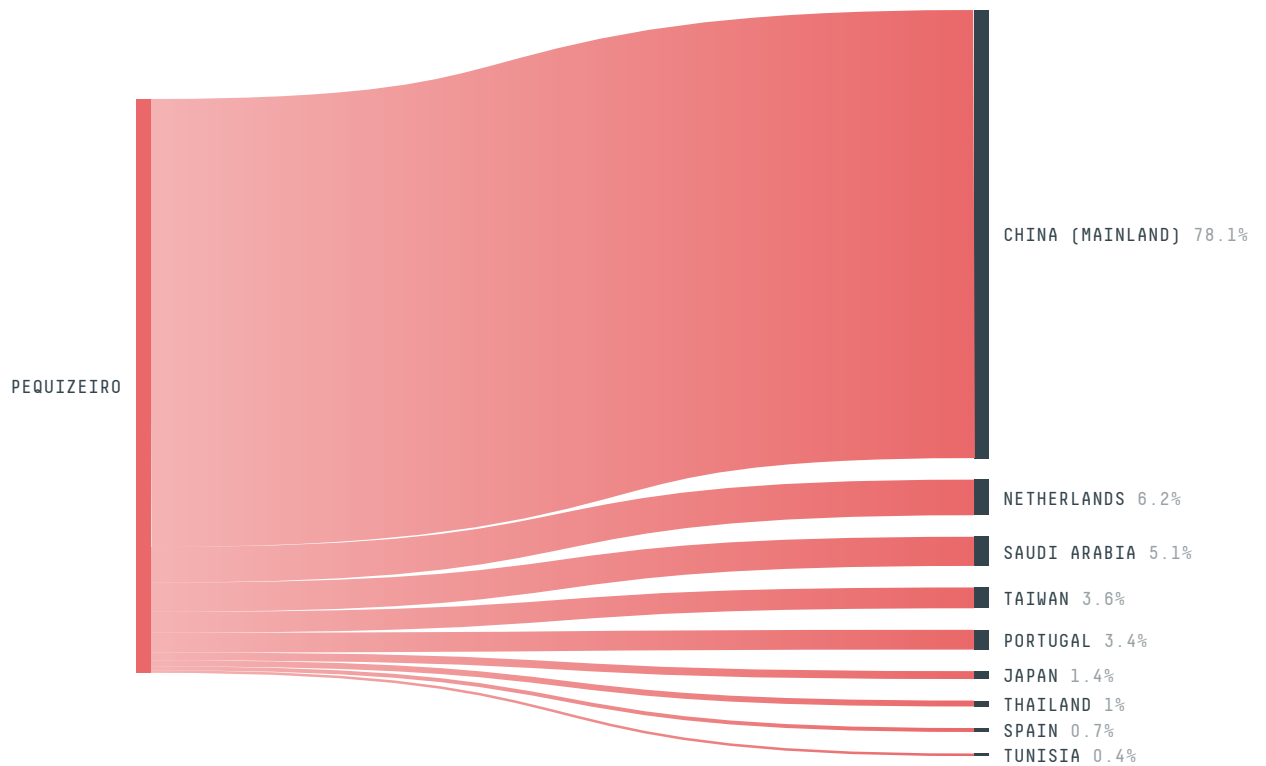
## DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF PEQUIZEIRO
