In 2017, Brejinho De Nazare produced 59,220 t of soy occupying a total of 21,000 ha of land. With 0.03% of the total production, it ranks 435th in Brazil in soy production, and 12th in the state of Tocantins.

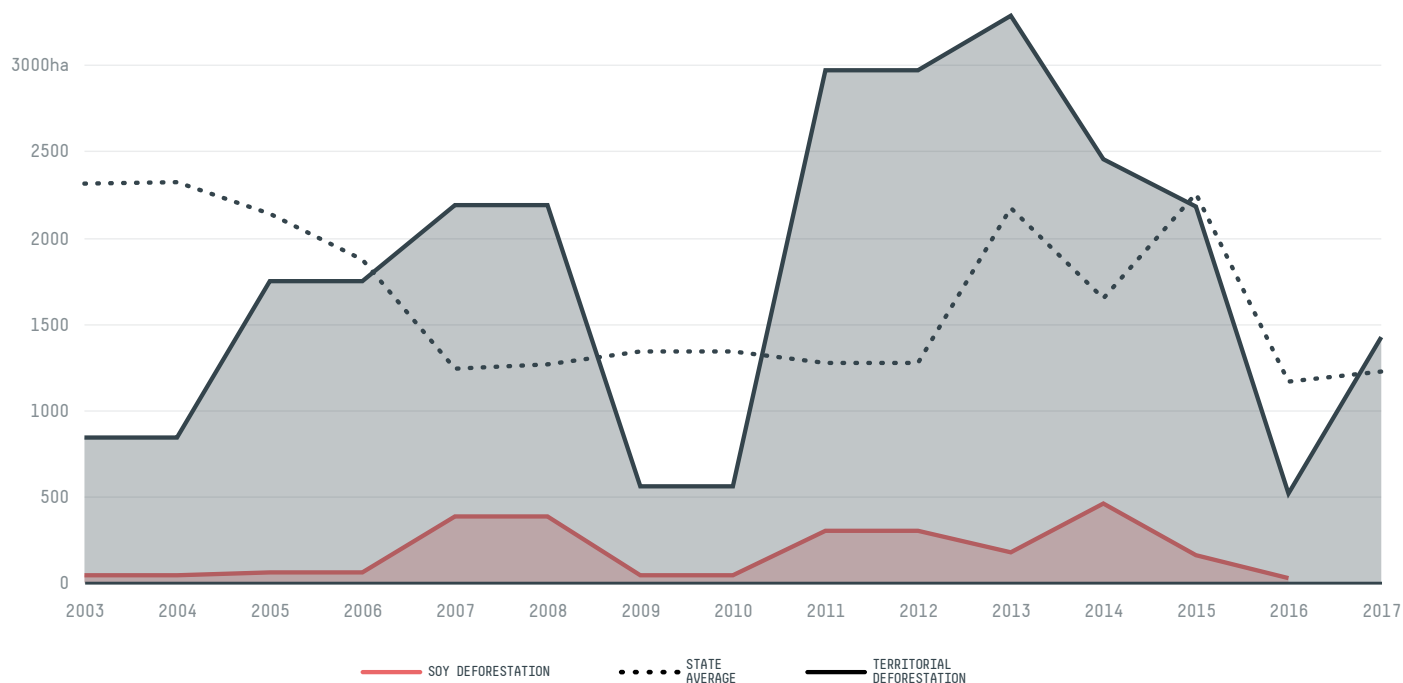
