In 2017, Ipueiras produced 19,584 t of soy occupying a total of 7,155 ha of land. With 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 813th in Brazil in soy production, and 39th in the state of Tocantins. The largest exporter of soy in Ipueiras was Bunge, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Brazil.

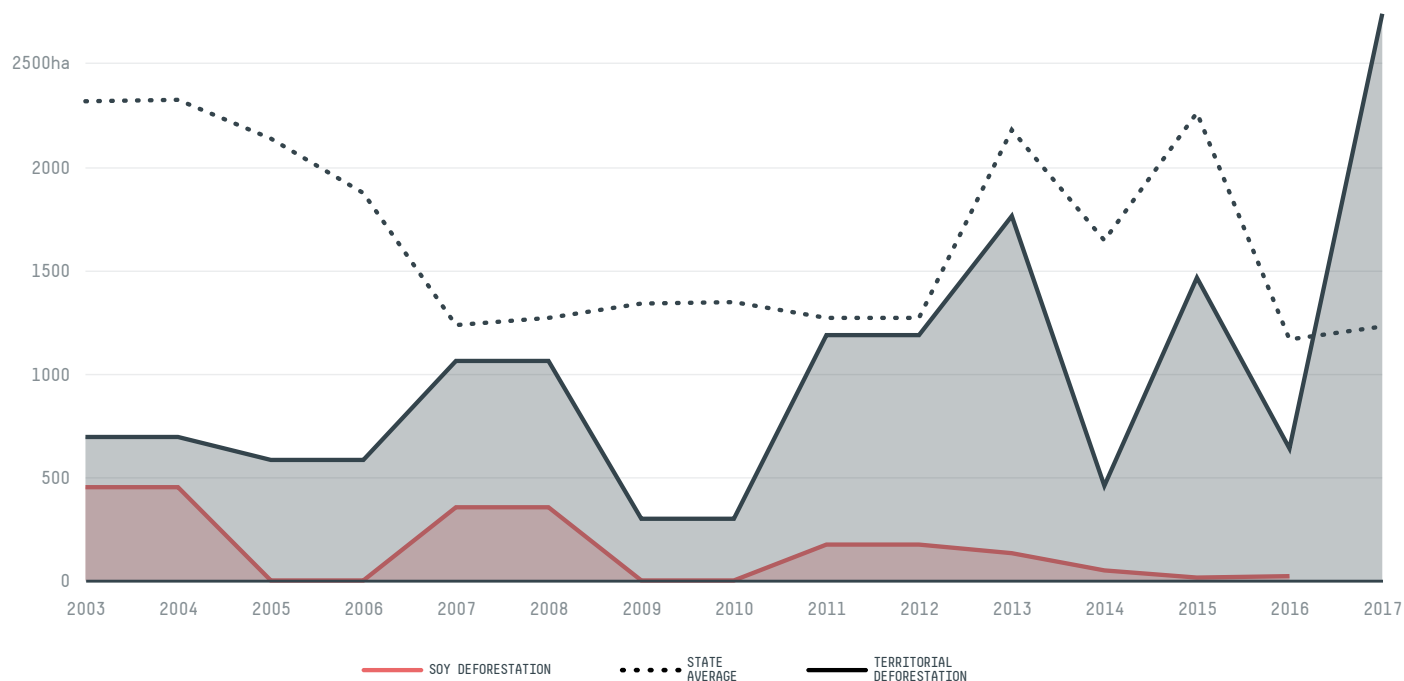

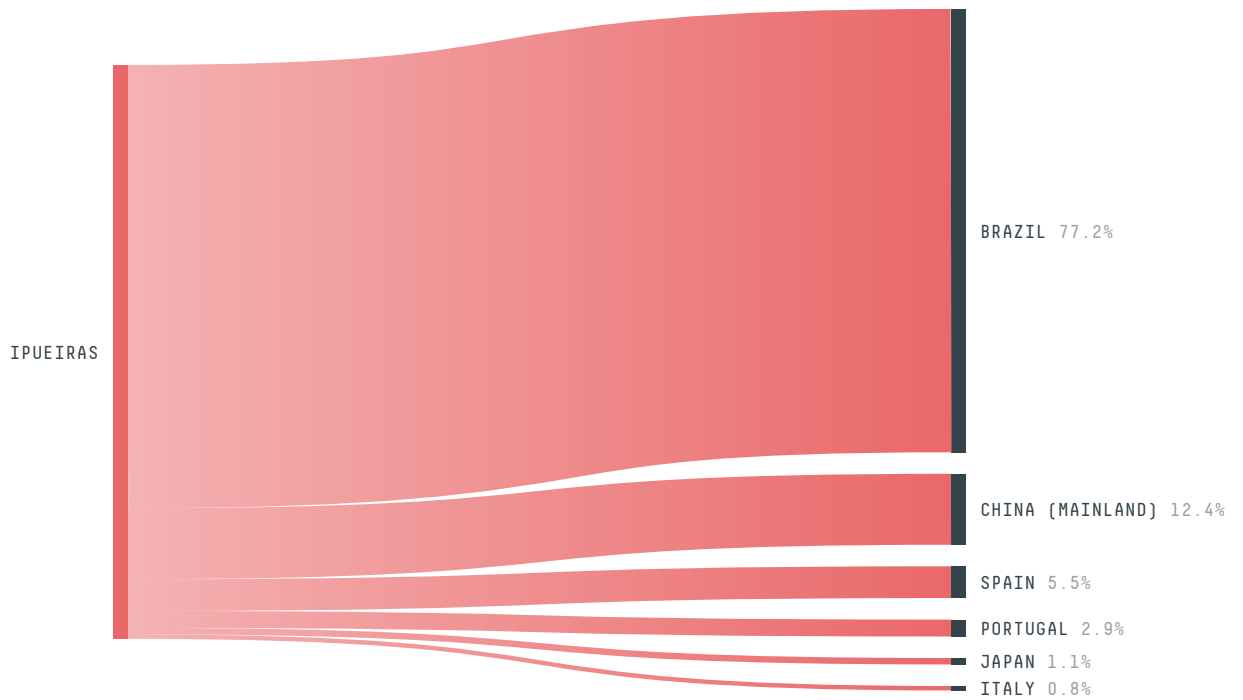
## DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF IPUEIRAS
