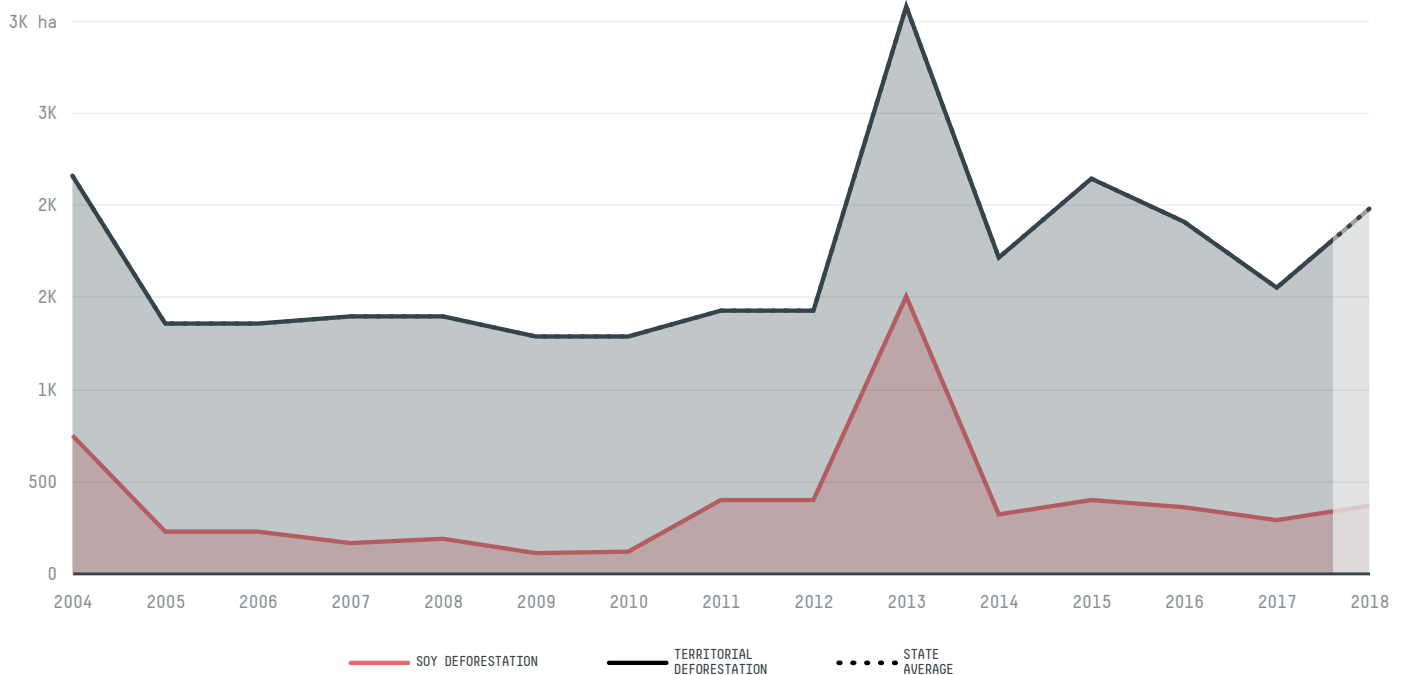
In 2018, Bom Jesus Do Tocantins produced 26,127 t of soy occupying a total of 9,749 ha of land. With 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 721st in Brazil in soy production. The largest exporter of soy in Bom Jesus Do Tocantins was Bunge, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was China (Mainland).

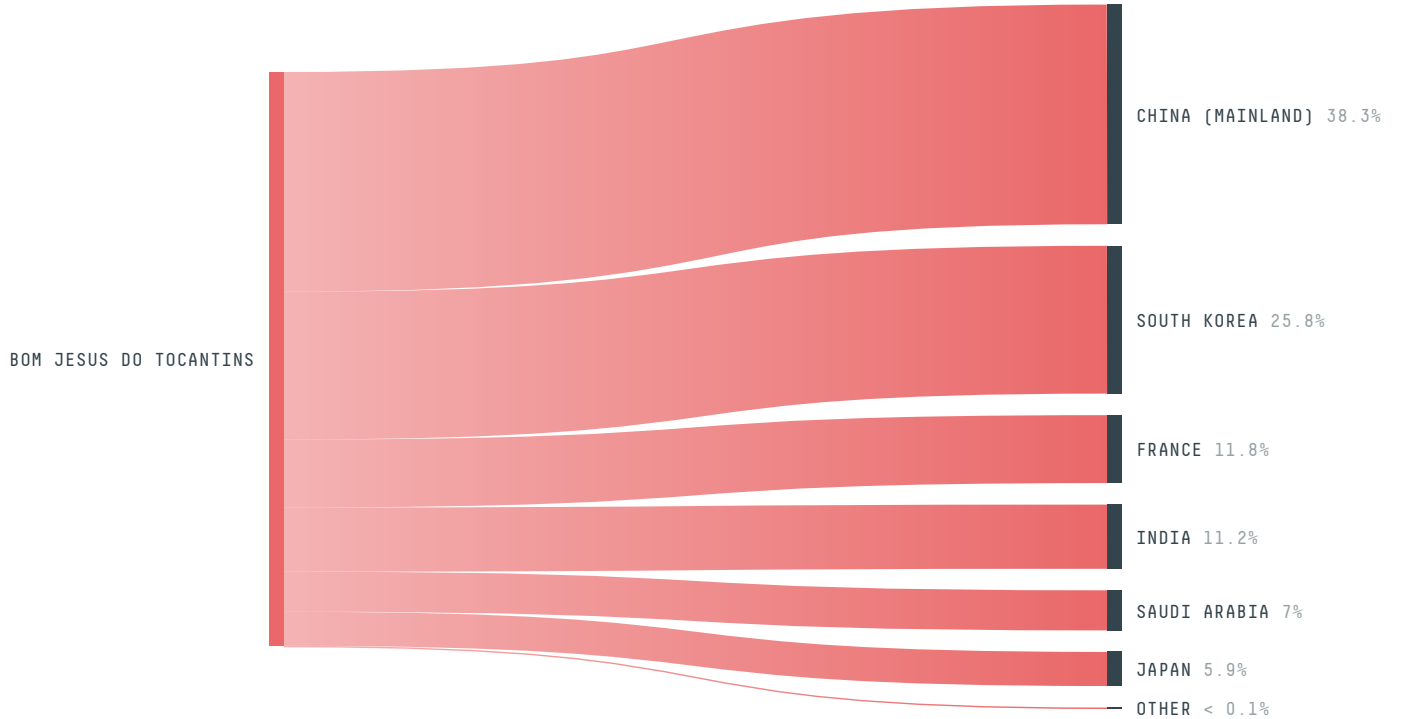
DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF BOM JESUS DO TOCANTINS
