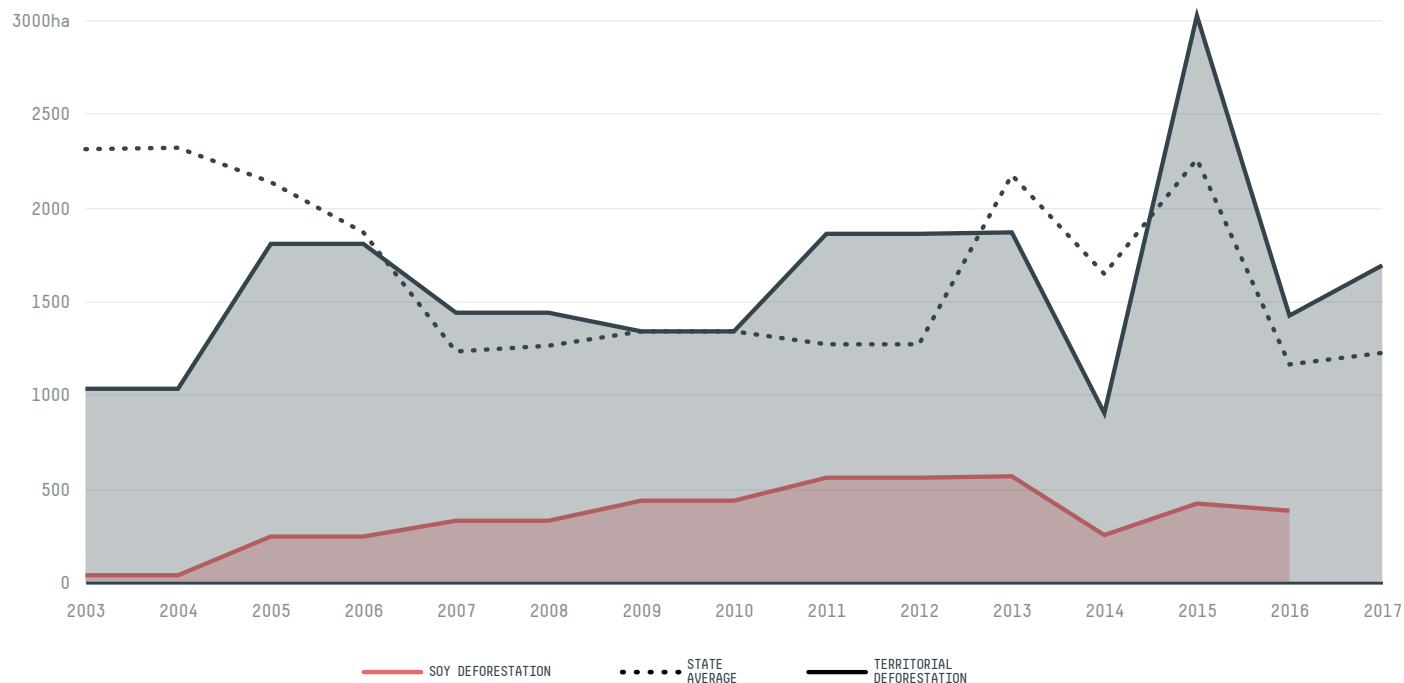

In 2017, Barra Do Ouro produced 6,342 t of soy occupying a total of 2,360 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 1111th in Brazil in soy production, and 60th in the state of Tocantins. The largest exporter of soy in Barra Do Ouro was Cargill, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was China (Mainland).

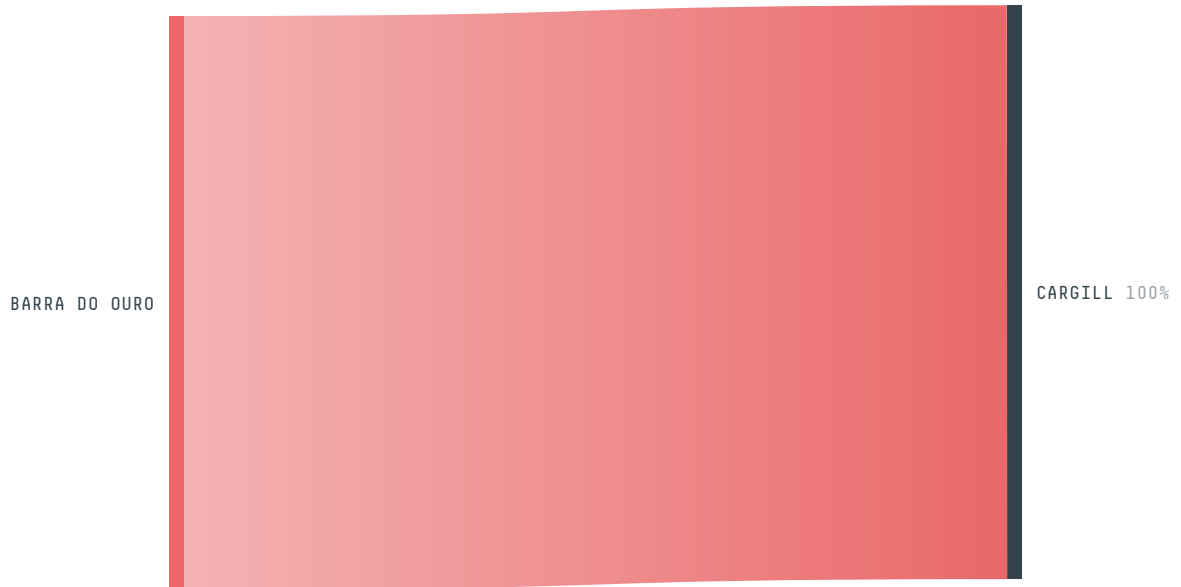

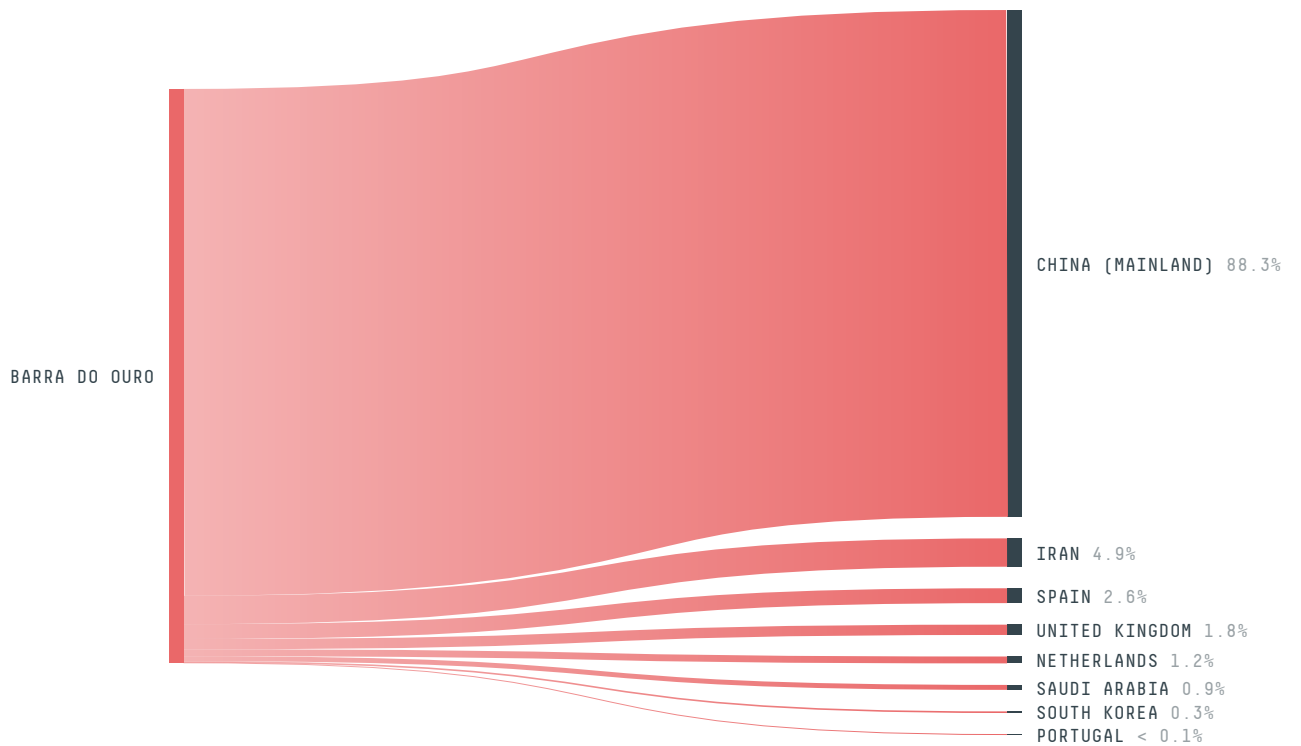
## DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF BARRA DO OURO
