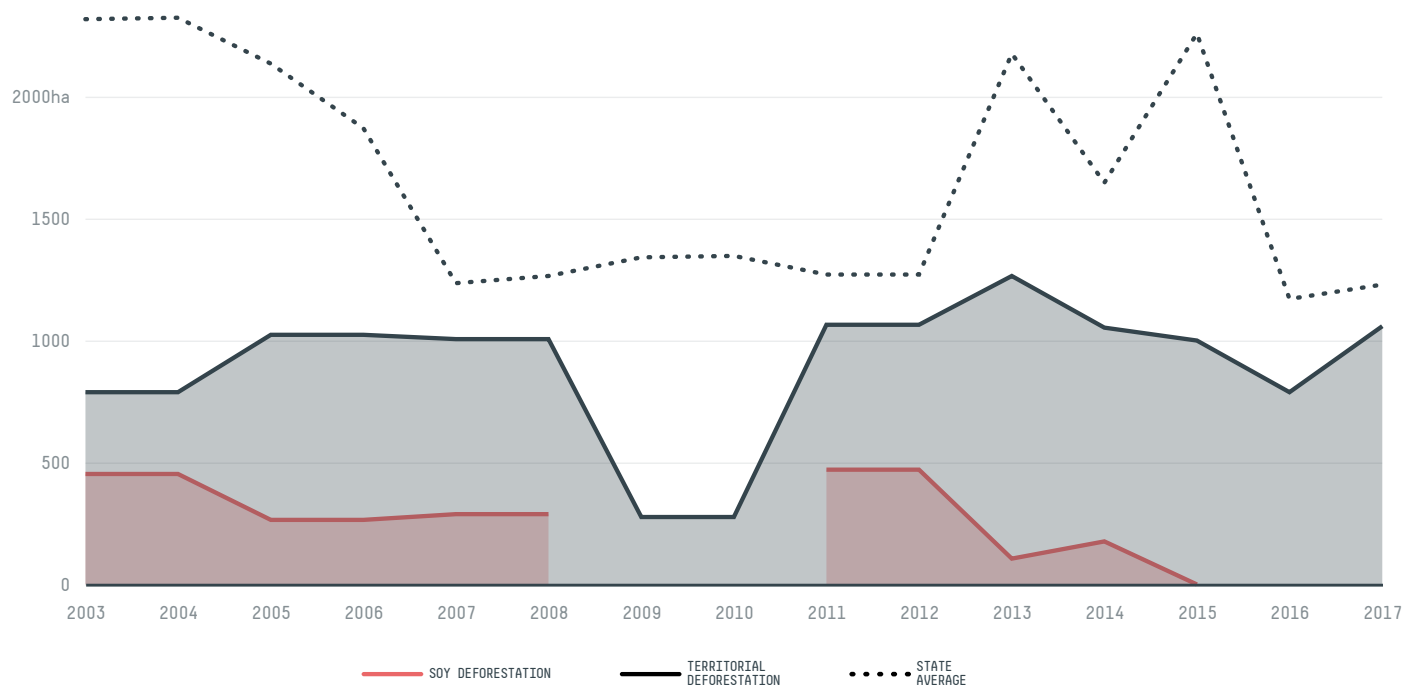
In 2017, Lizarda produced 4,500 t of soy occupying a total of 1,500 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 1176th in Brazil in soy production, and 65th in the state of Tocantins. The largest exporter of soy in Lizarda was Gavilon, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was China (Mainland).

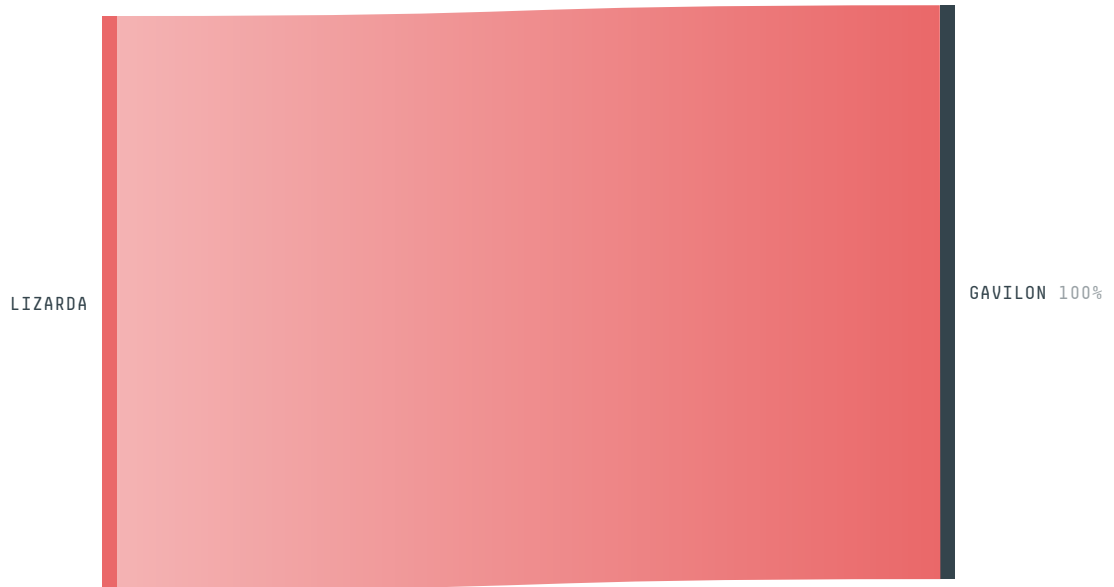

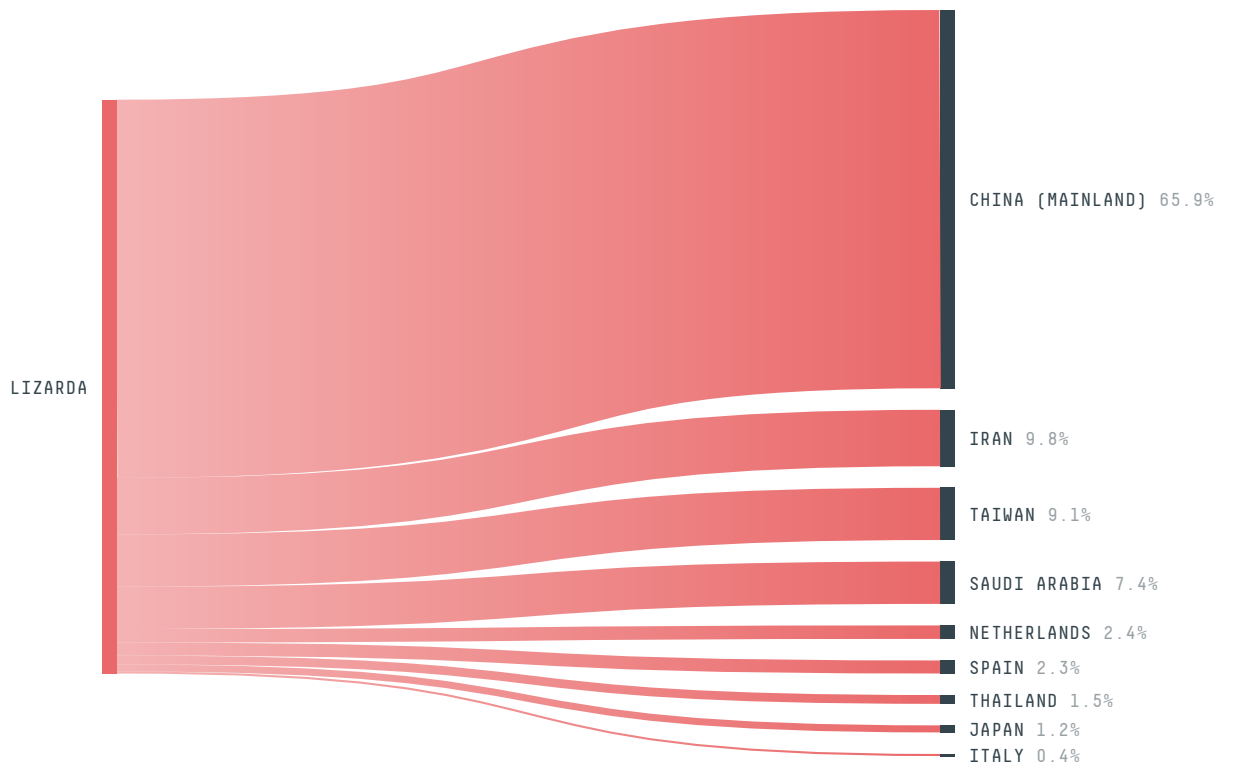
DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF LIZARDA
