In 2017, Vila Nova Dos Martirios produced 9,084 t of soy occupying a total of 2,770 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 1023rd in Brazil in soy production, and 31st in the state of Maranhao. The largest exporter of soy in Vila Nova Dos Martirios was Cargill, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was China (Mainland).

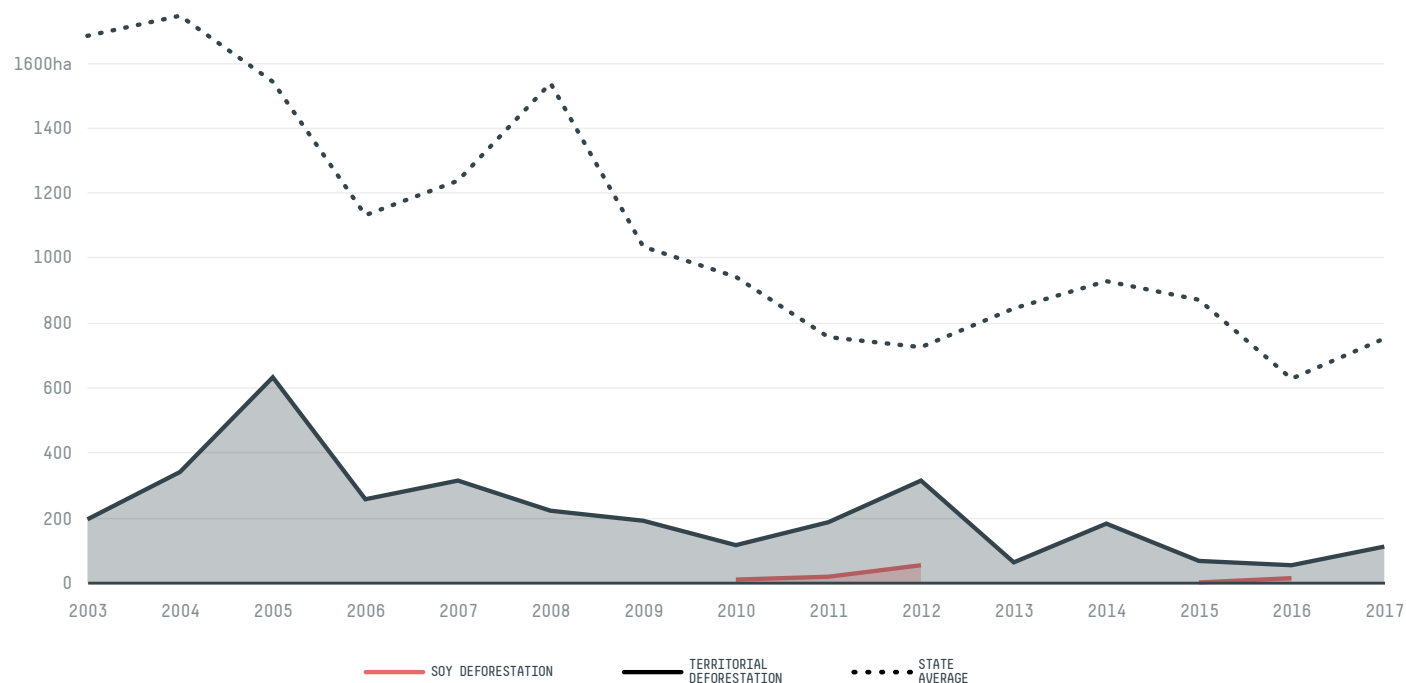

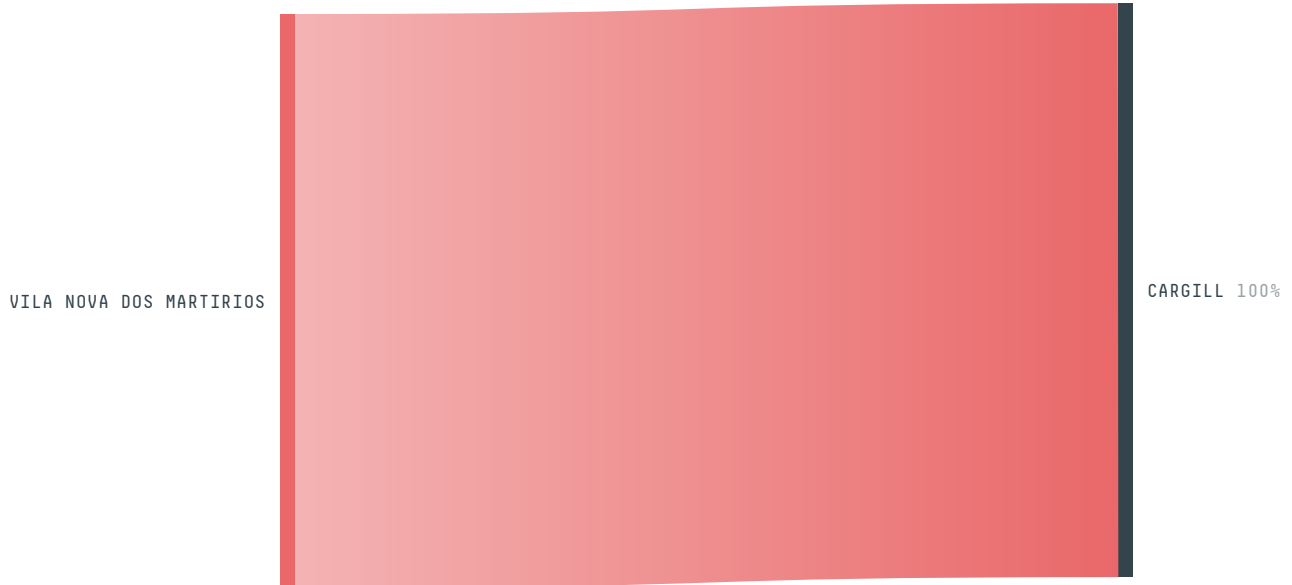

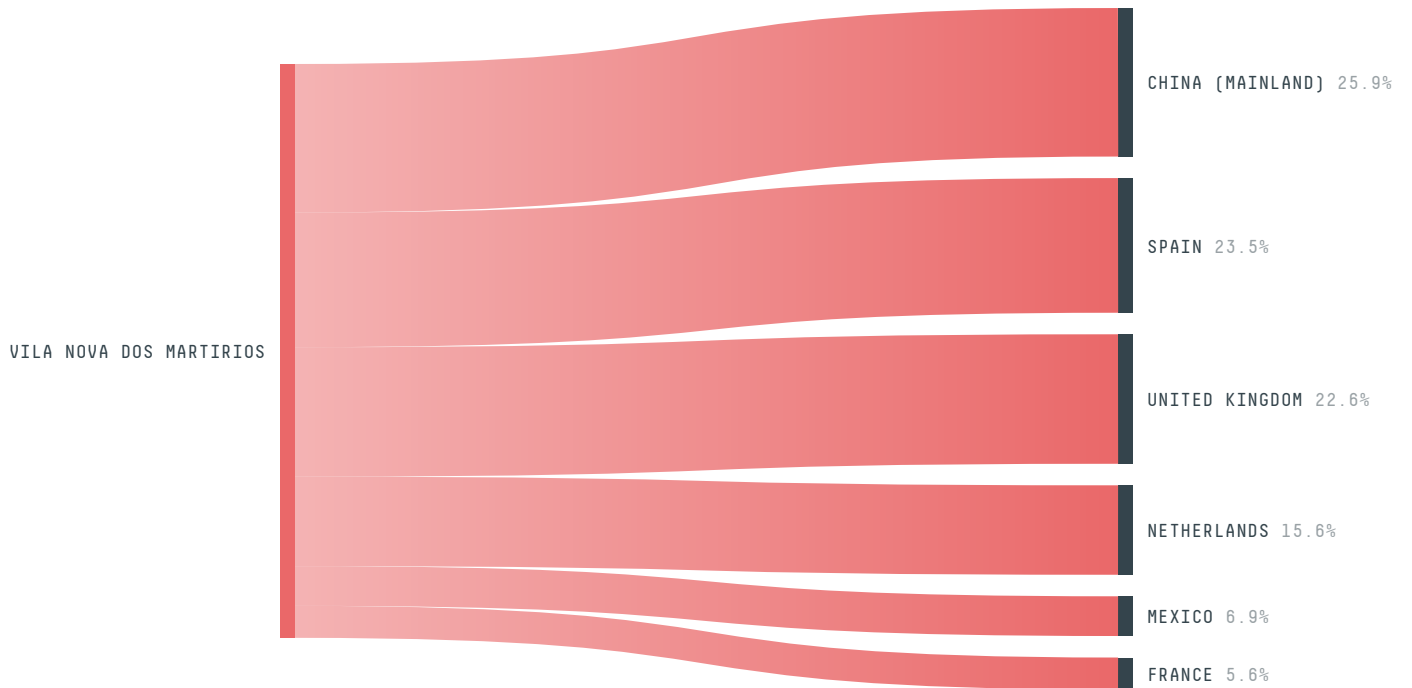
DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF VILA NOVA DOS MARTIRIOS
