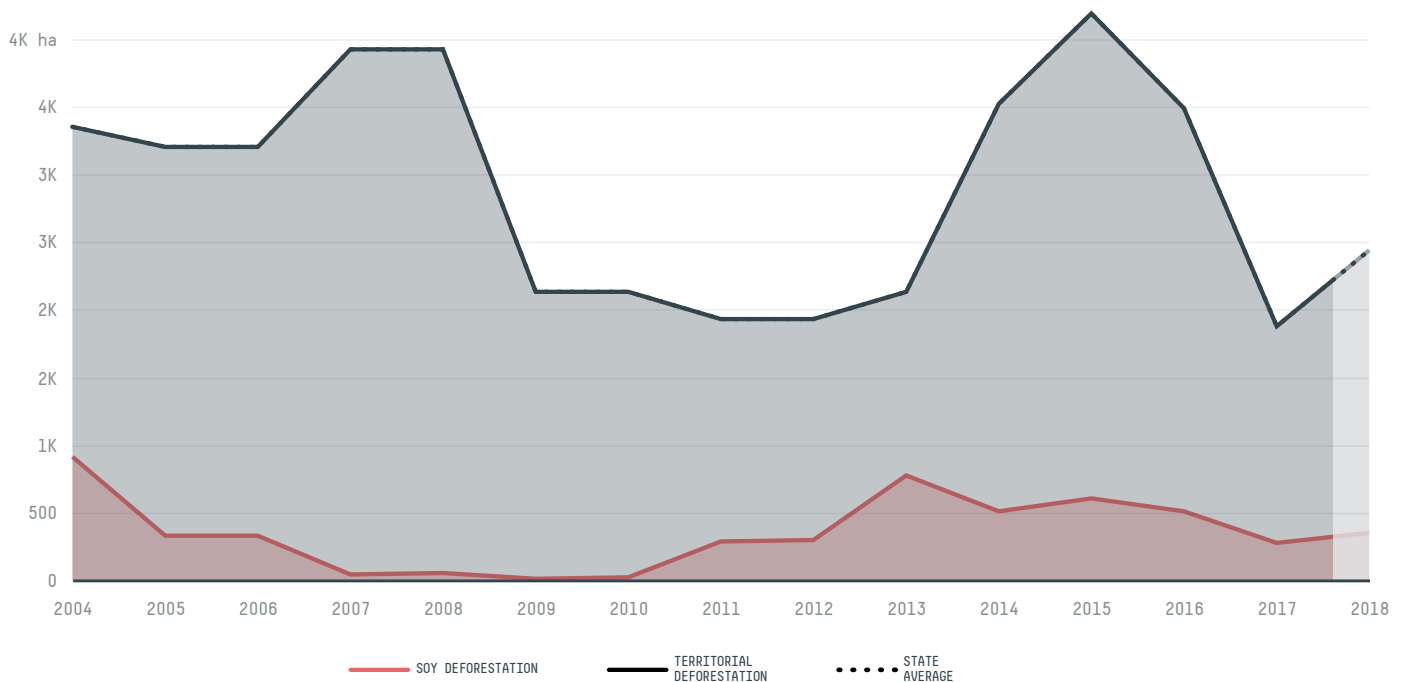
AREA PRODUCTION OF SOY SOY LAND

In 2018, Itacaja produced 19,000 t of soy occupying a total of 7,600 ha of land. With 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 827th in Brazil in soy production. The largest exporter of soy in Itacaja was Bunge, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was China (Mainland).

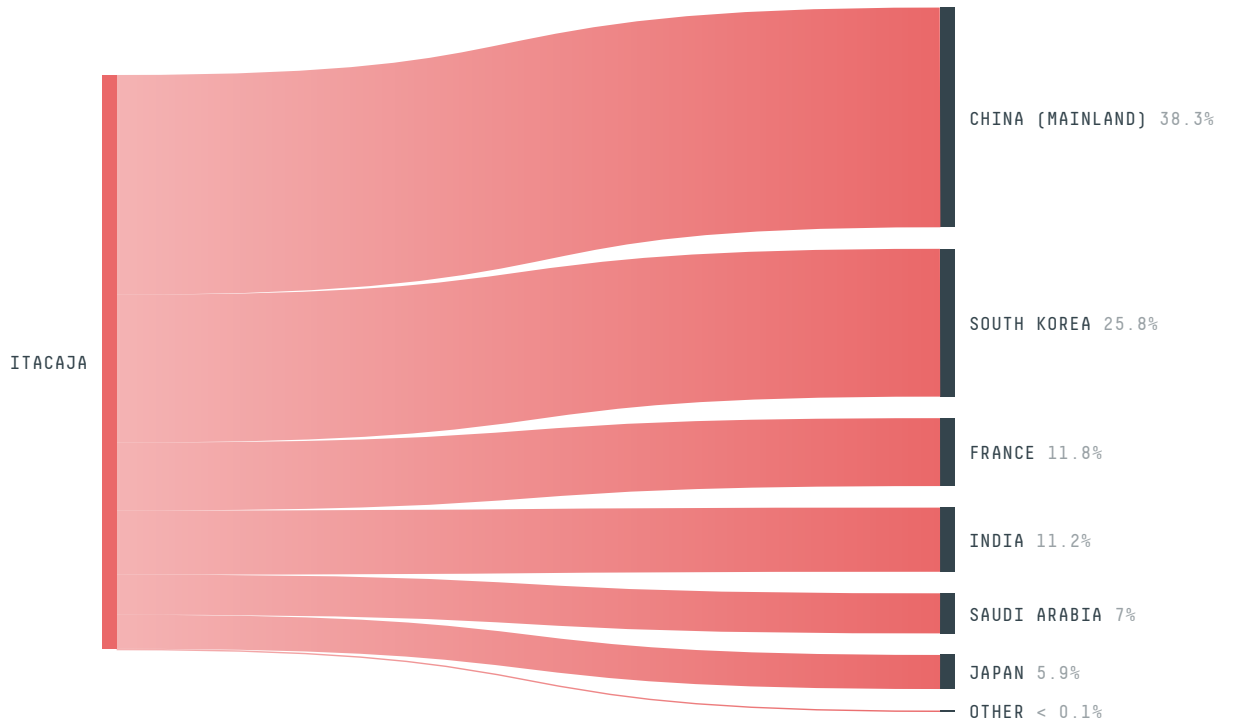
## DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF ITACAJA
