AREA PRODUCTION OF SOY SOY LAND
2,545 km² 45,560 t 13,400 ha

In 2017, Buriticupu produced 45,560 t of soy occupying a total of 13,400 ha of land. With 0.02% of the total production, it ranks 522nd in Brazil in soy production, and 12th in the state of Maranhao. The largest exporter of soy in Buriticupu was Abc Industria, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Brazil.

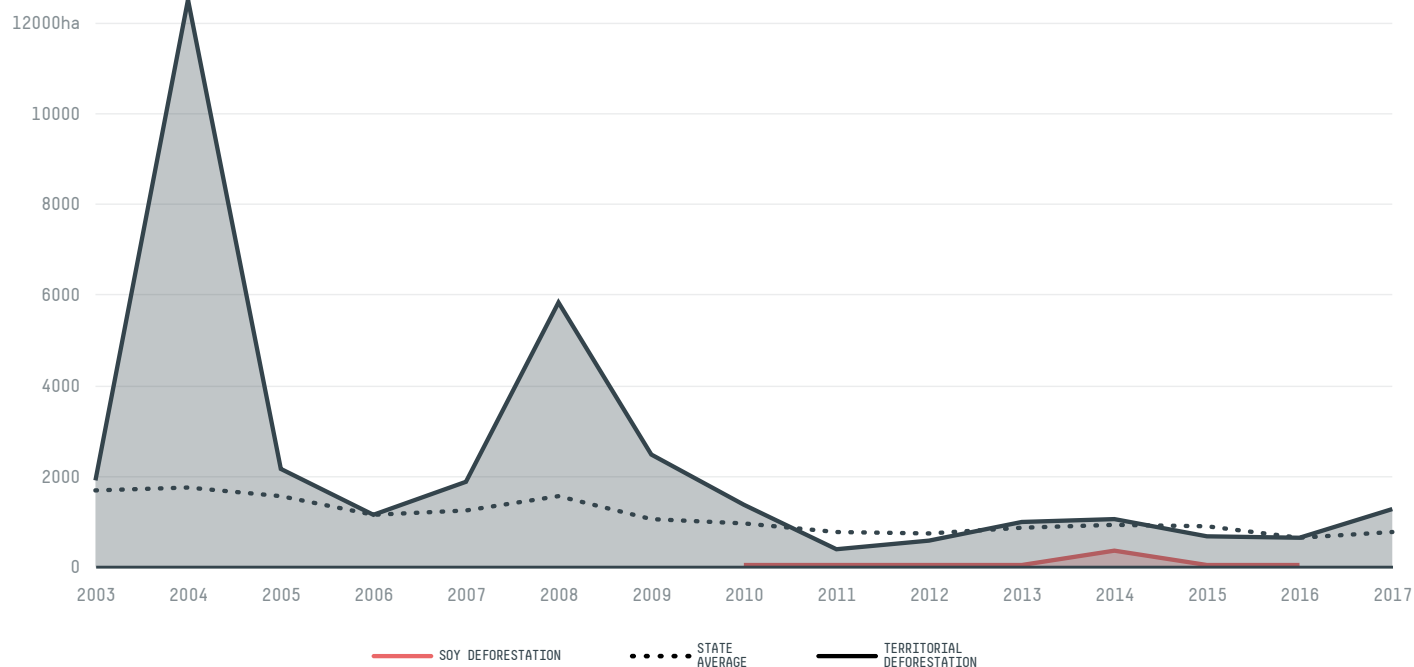
