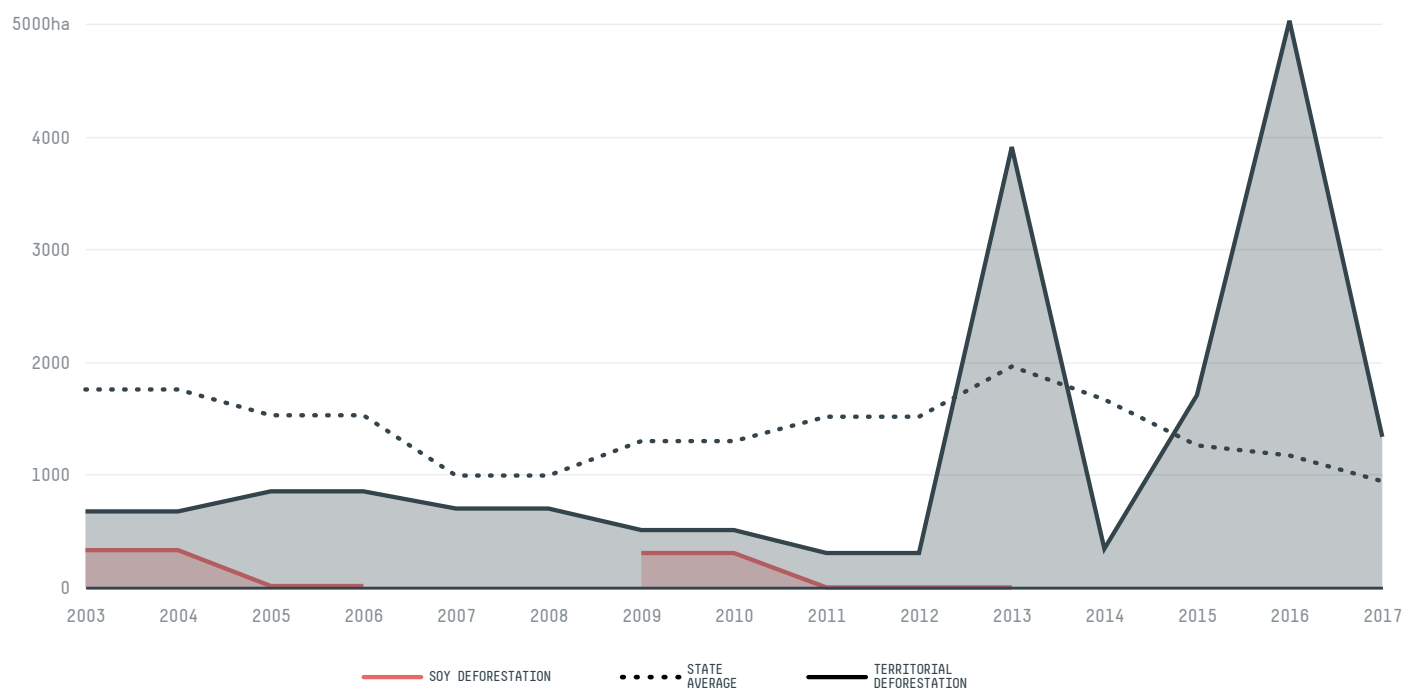
AREA PRODUCTION OF SOY SOY LAND

In 2008, Manoel Emidio produced 4,372 t of soy occupying a total of 1,375 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 772nd in Brazil in soy production, and 14th in the state of Piaui.
