In 2016, Coruripe produced 300 t of soy occupying a total of 100 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 1391st in Brazil in soy production, and 2nd in the state of Alagoas. The largest exporter of soy in Coruripe was Oleoplan, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Brazil.

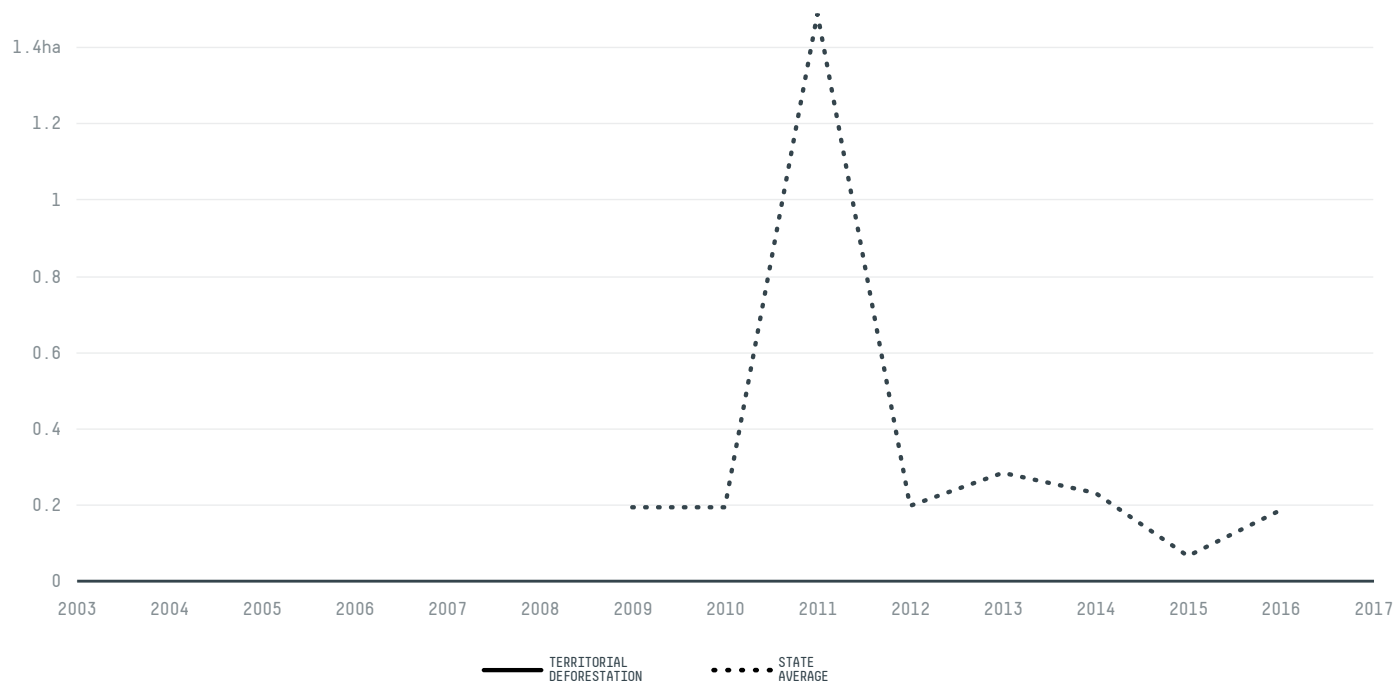
