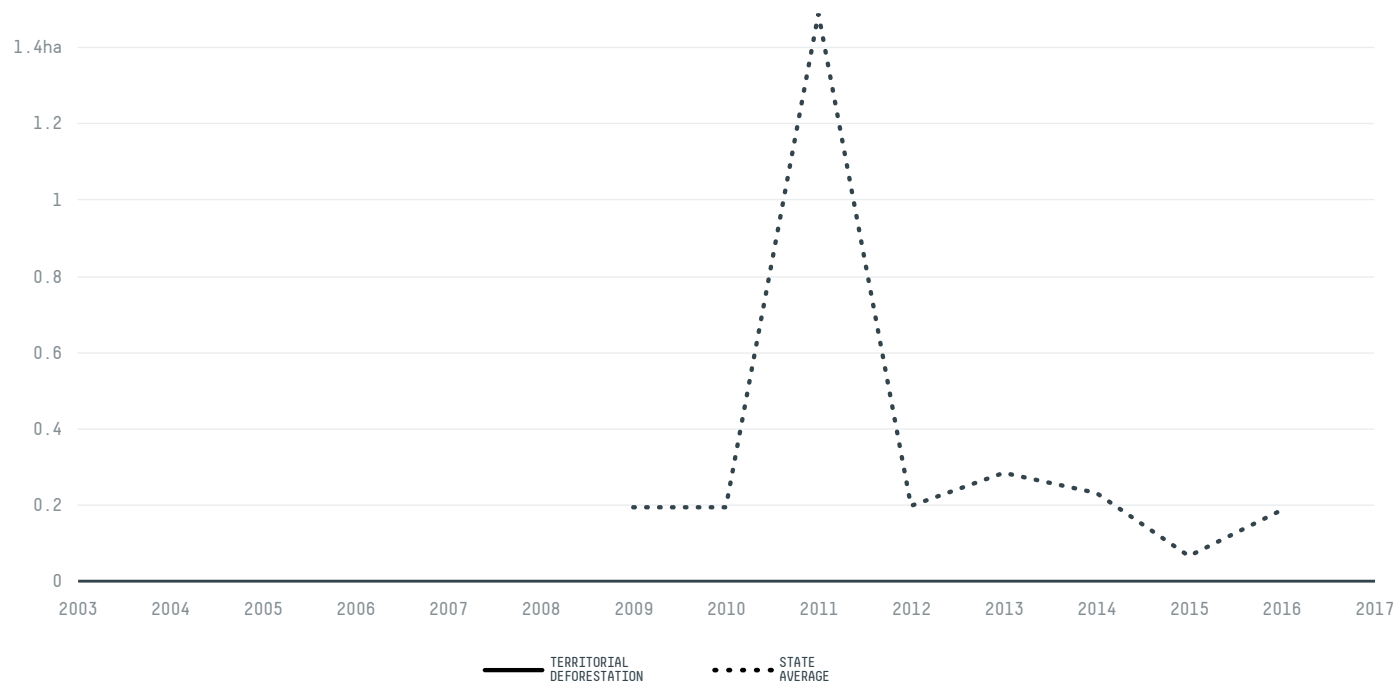
In 2004, Taquarana produced 90 t of soy occupying a total of 30 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 1222nd in Brazil in soy production, and 3rd in the state of Alagoas. The largest exporter of soy in Taquarana was Acrinor Acrilonitrila Do Nordeste S A, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Iran.

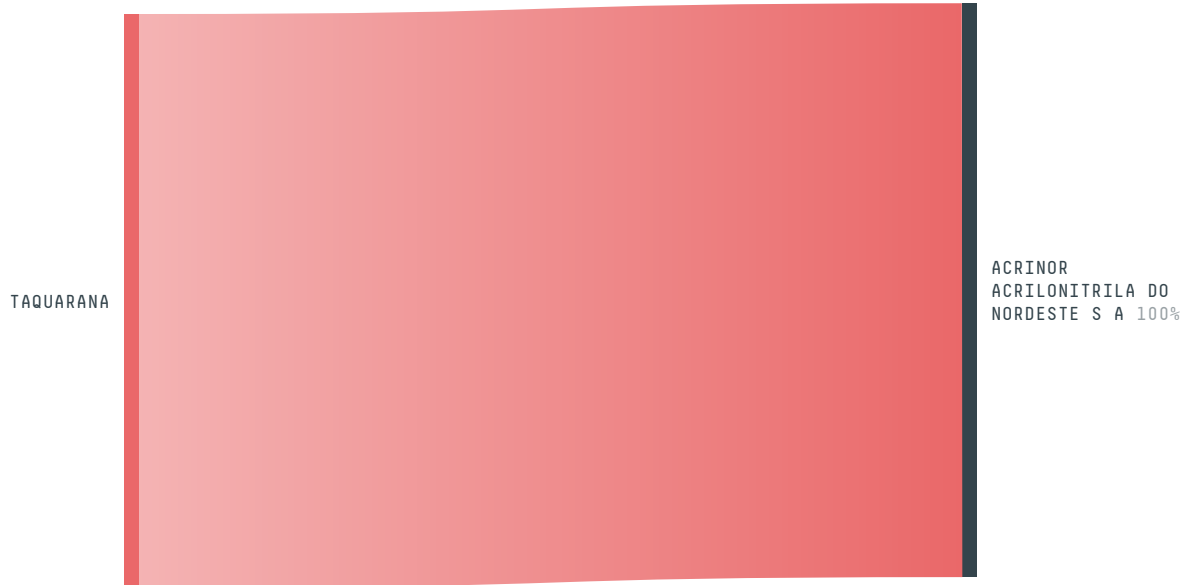
