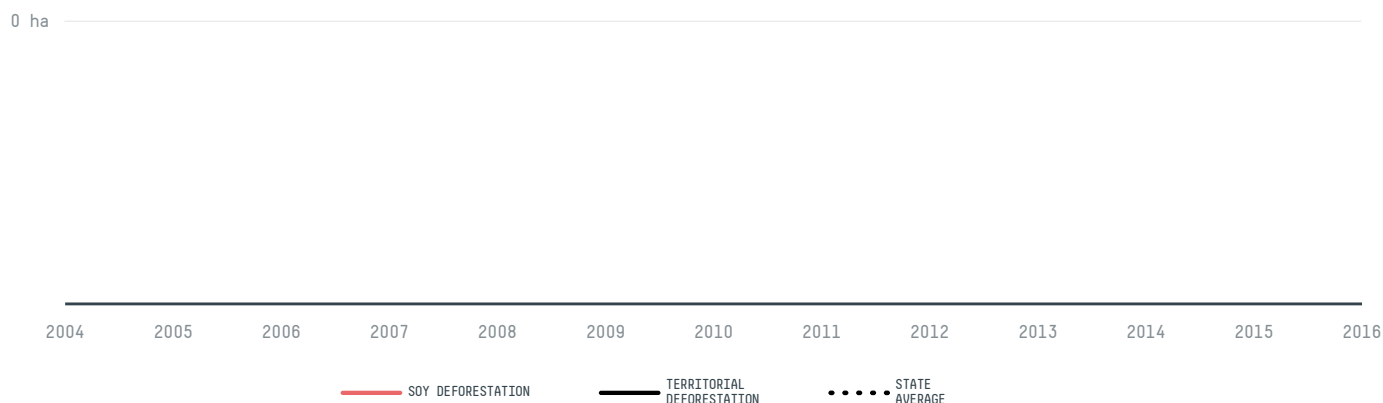
AREA PRODUCTION OF SOY SOY LAND

In 2016, Coruripe produced 300 t of soy occupying a total of 100 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 1391st in Brazil in soy production. The largest exporter of soy in Coruripe was Ms Pescados Comercio, Importacao E Exportacao, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Netherlands.

TOP TRADERS OF SOY IN CORURIFE IN 2016

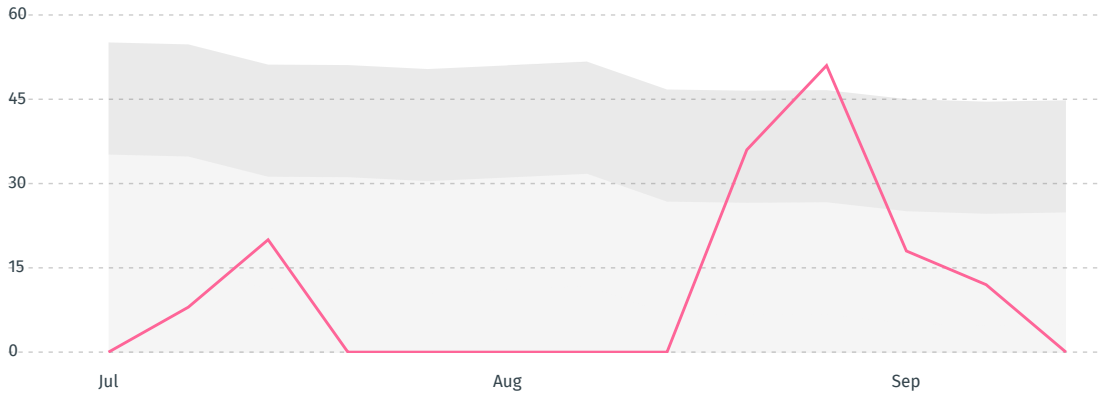


TOP IMPORTING COUNTRIES OF SOY FROM CORURIFE IN 2016
