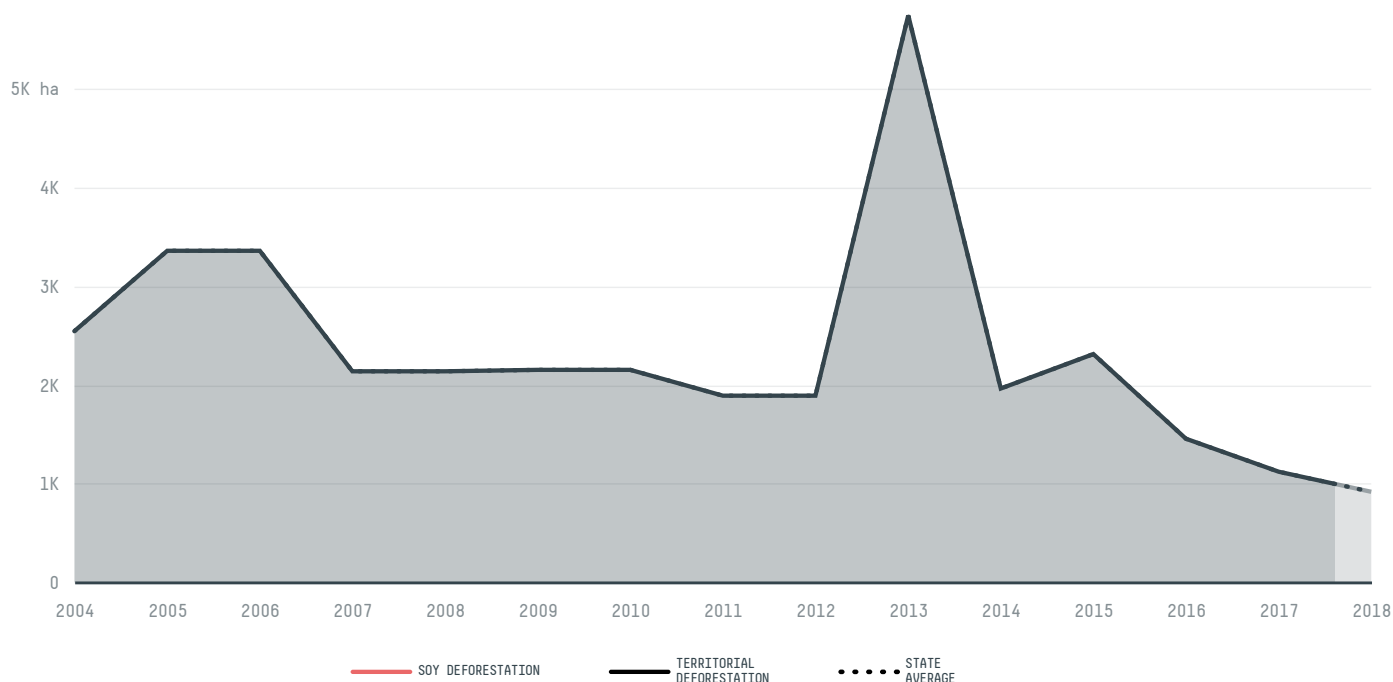
AREA PRODUCTION OF SOY SOY LAND
2,529 km² **600 t** **150 ha**

In 2018, Carinhanha produced 600 t of soy occupying a total of 150 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 1511th in Brazil in soy production. The largest exporter of soy in Carinhanha was Unigel Plasticos, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was India.

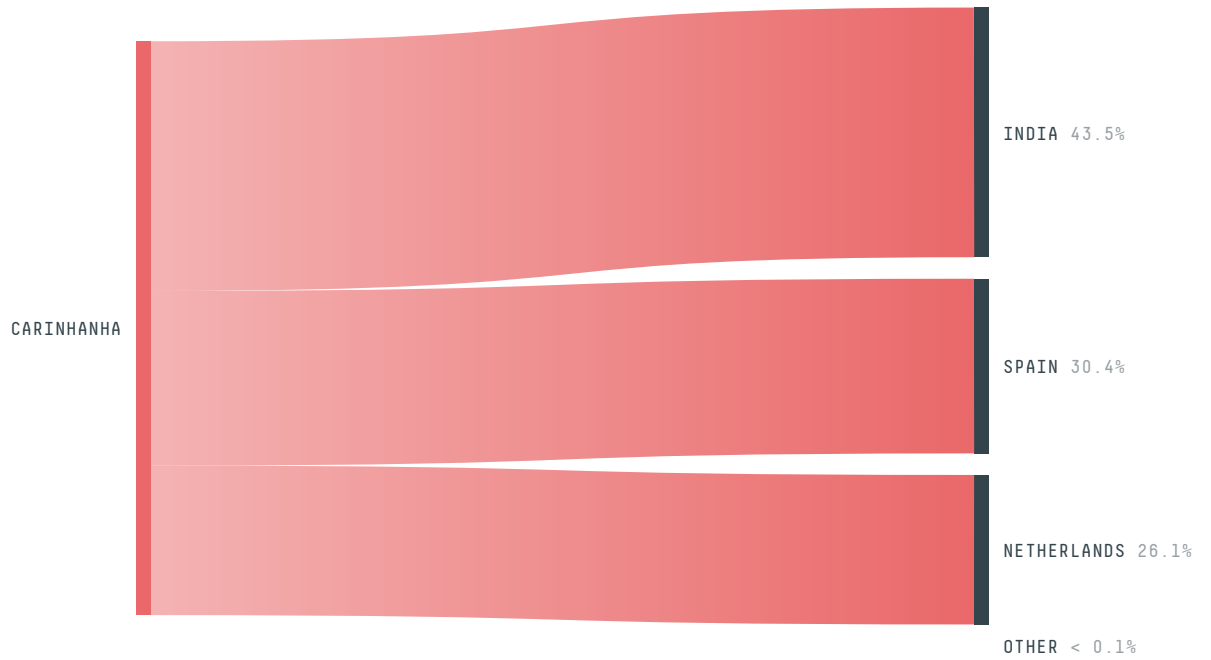
DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF CARINHANHA



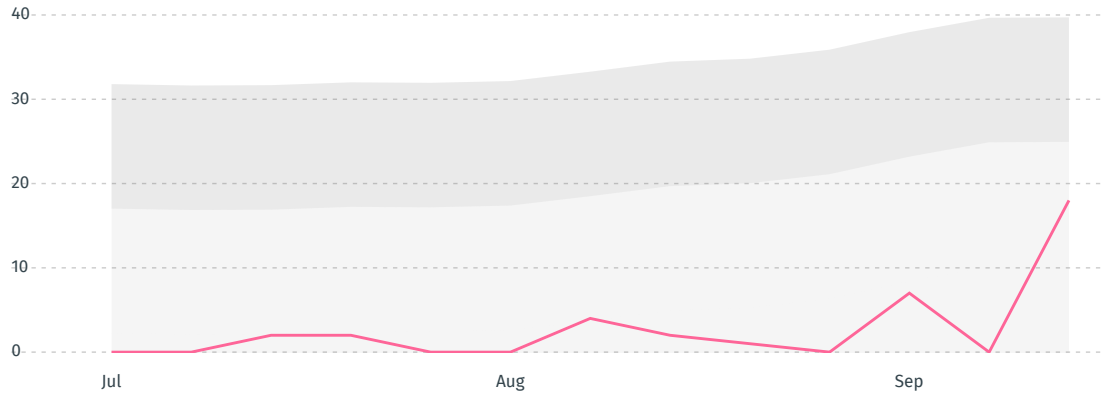
TOP TRADERS OF SOY IN CARINHANHA IN 2018
