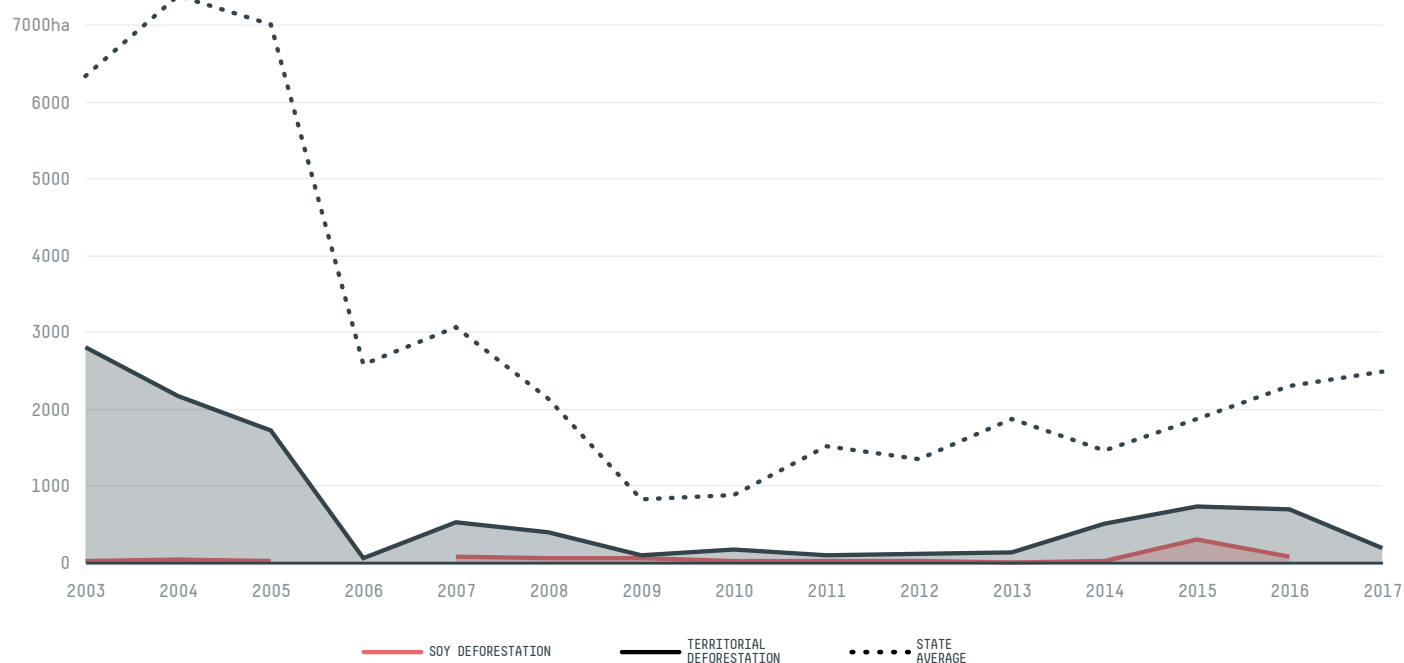
In 2017, Cabixi produced 70,320 t of soy occupying a total of 21,309 ha of land. With 0.04% of the total production, it ranks 370th in Brazil in soy production, and 6th in the state of Rondonia. The largest exporter of soy in Cabixi was Cargill, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Brazil.

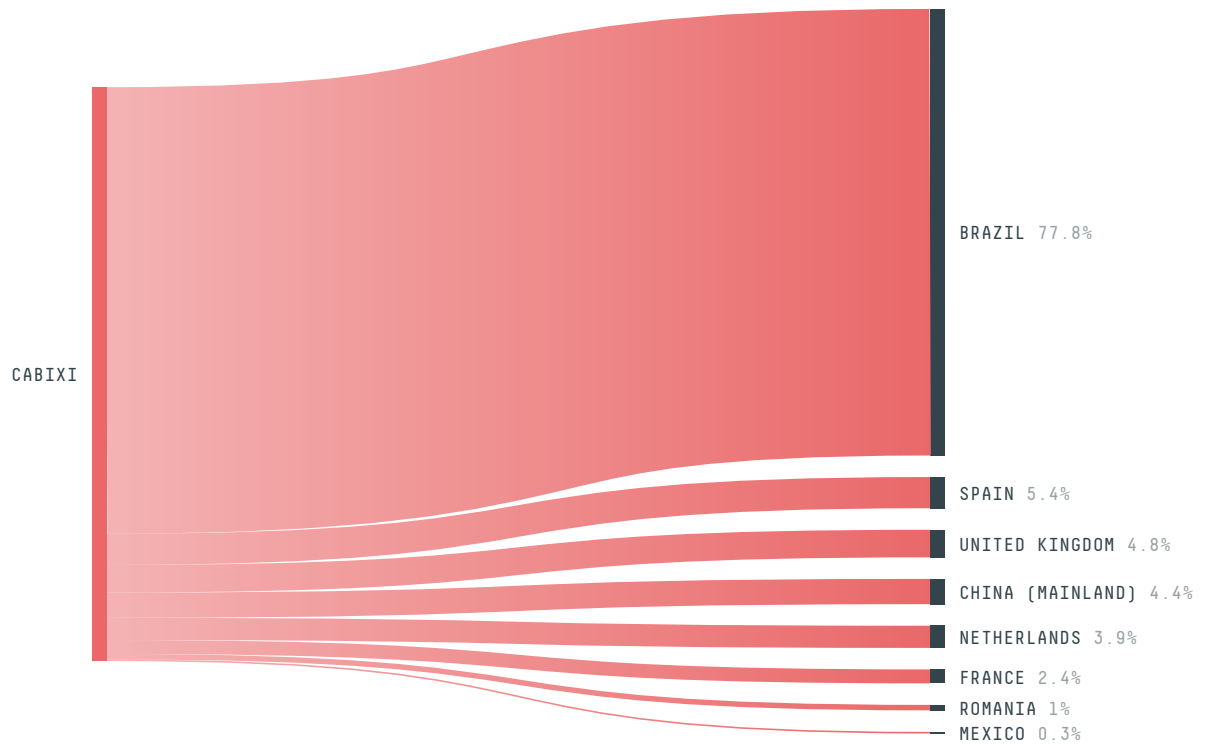
DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF CABIXI
