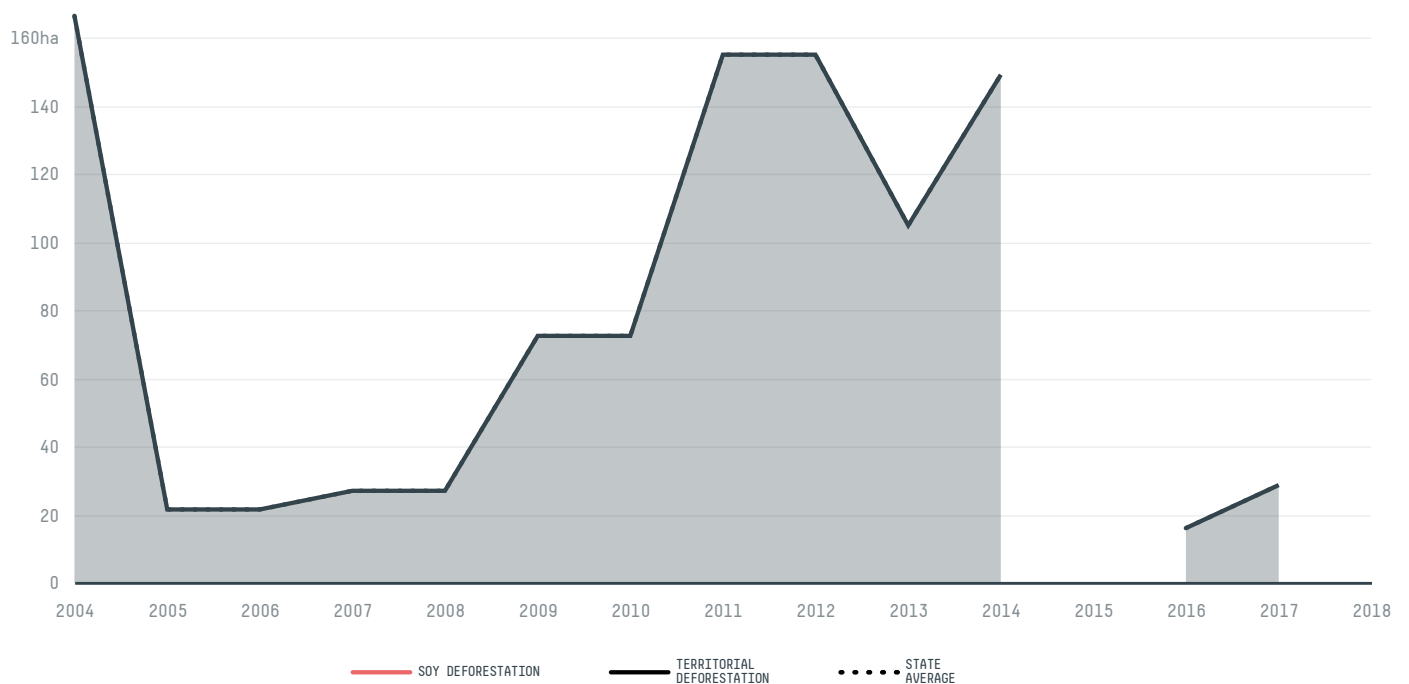

In 2016, Serra Da Saudade produced 66 t of soy occupying a total of 32 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 1450th in Brazil in soy production. The largest exporter of soy in Serra Da Saudade was Louis Dreyfus, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was China (Mainland).

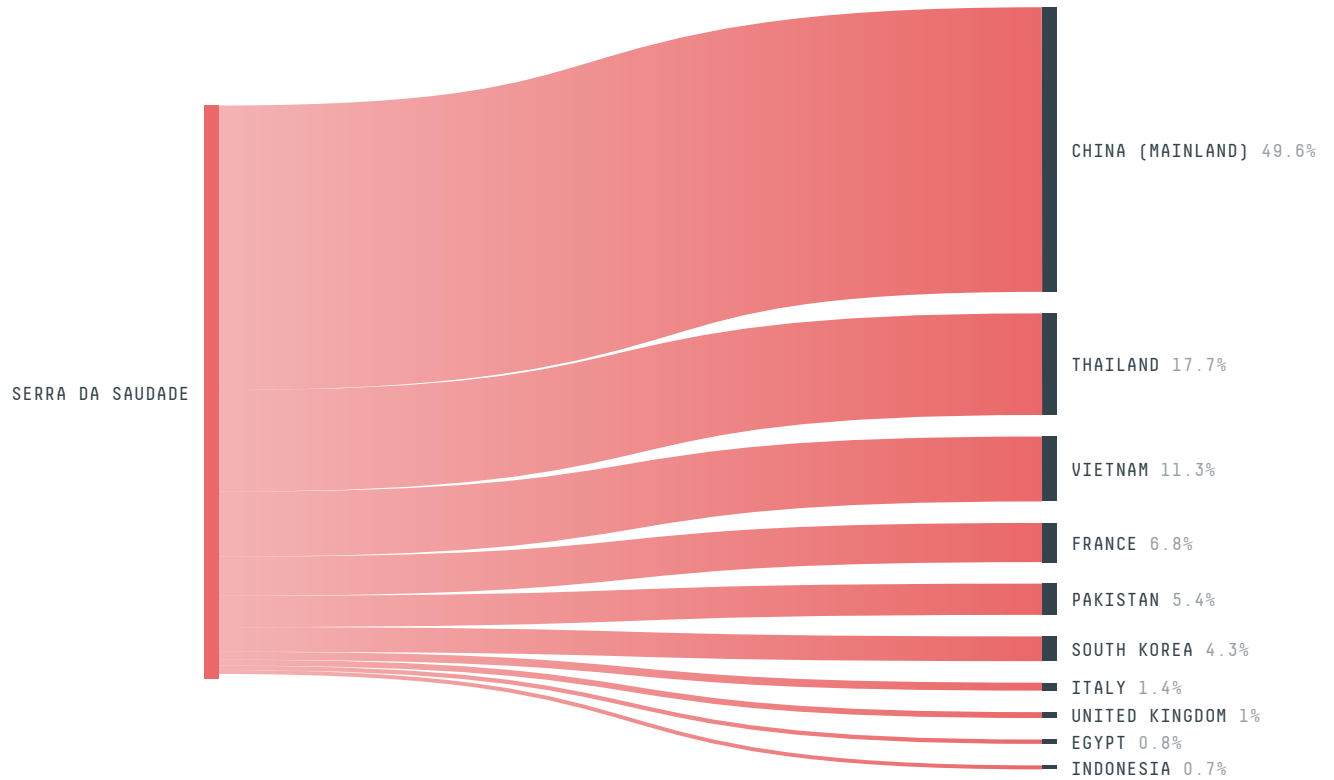

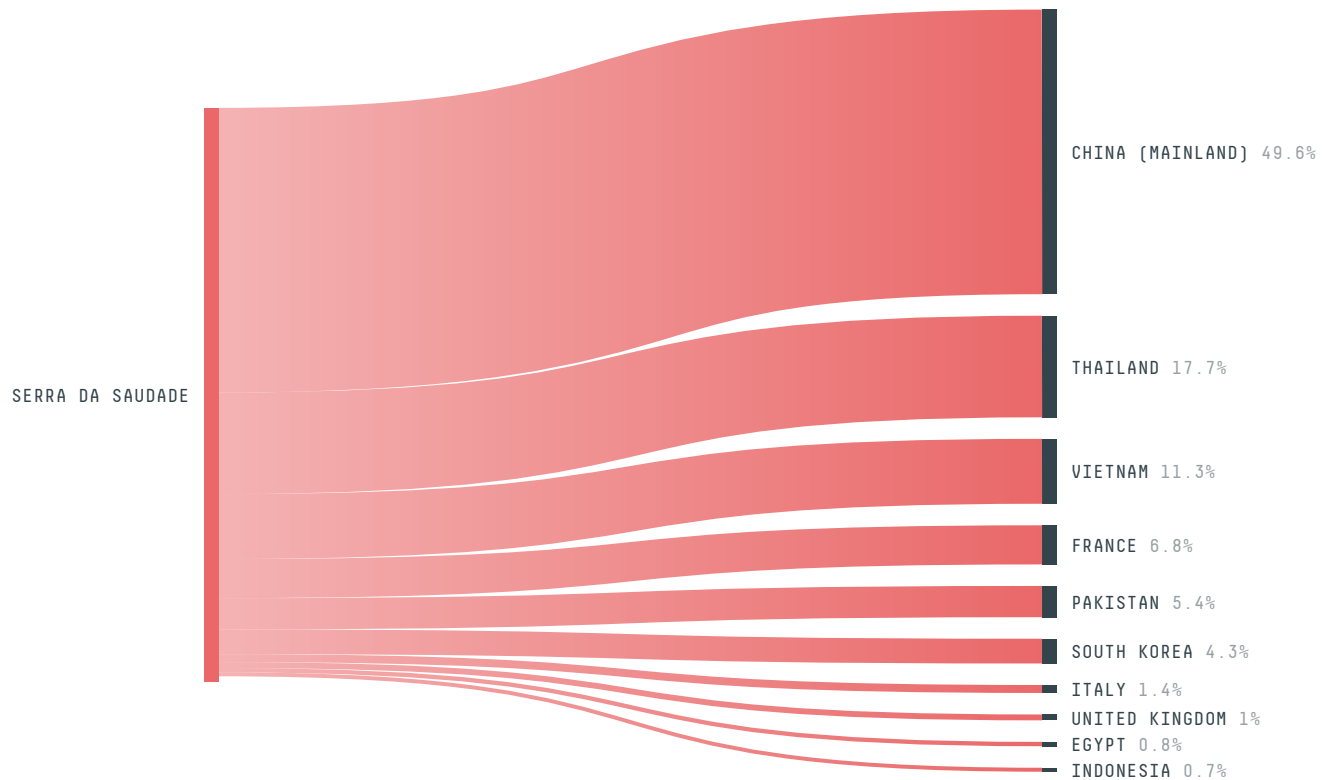
## DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF SERRA DA SAUDADE
