In 2014, Senador Guiomard produced 820 t of soy occupying a total of 300 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 1238th in Brazil in soy production, and 1st in the state of Acre. The largest exporter of soy in Senador Guiomard was Pacific Traders Imp. E Exp., which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Peru.

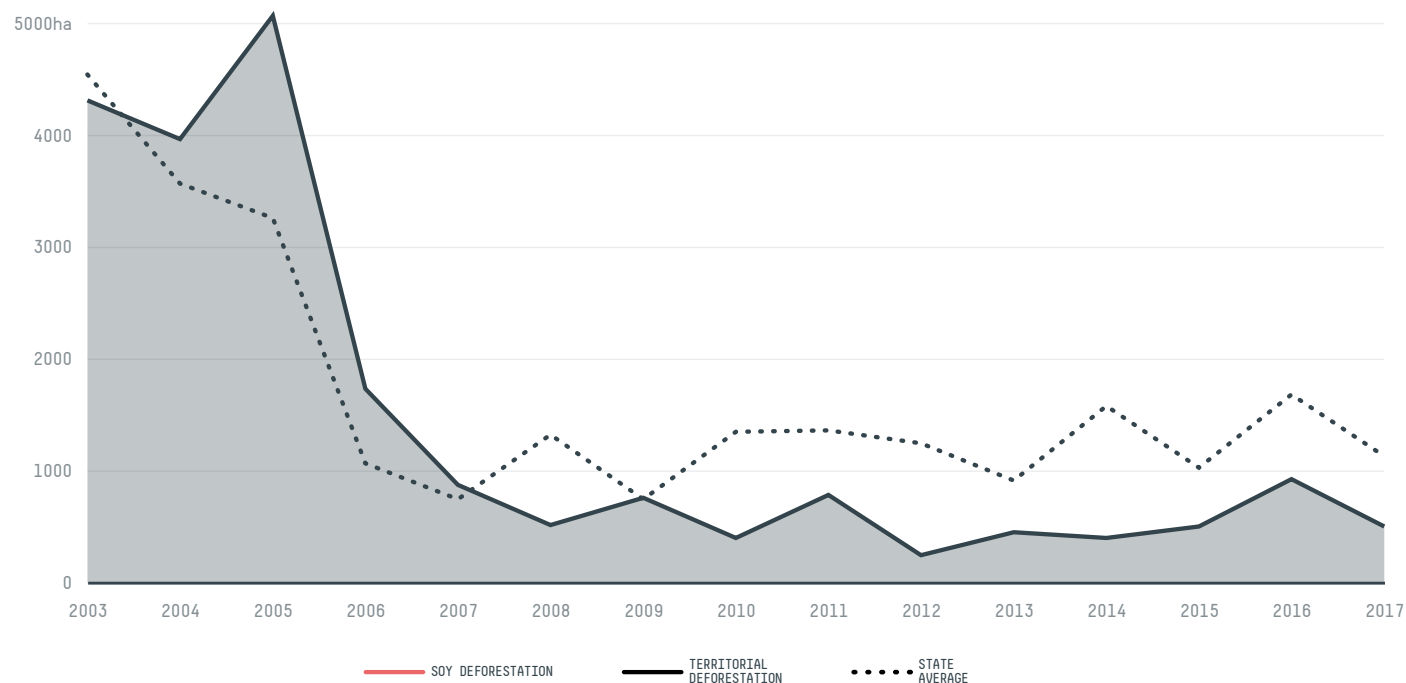
