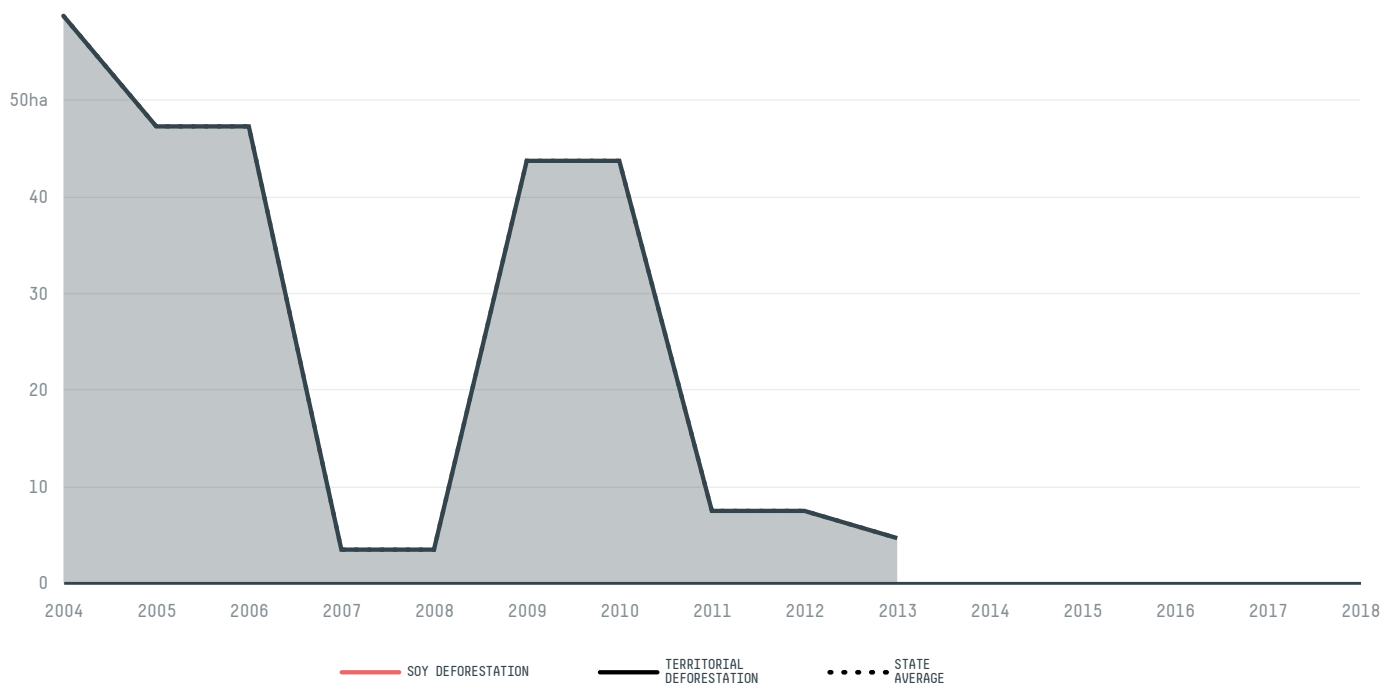
AREA PRODUCTION OF SOY SOY LAND

In 2009, Itobi produced 80 t of soy occupying a total of 24 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 1123rd in Brazil in soy production. The largest exporter of soy in Itobi was Louis Dreyfus, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was China (Mainland).

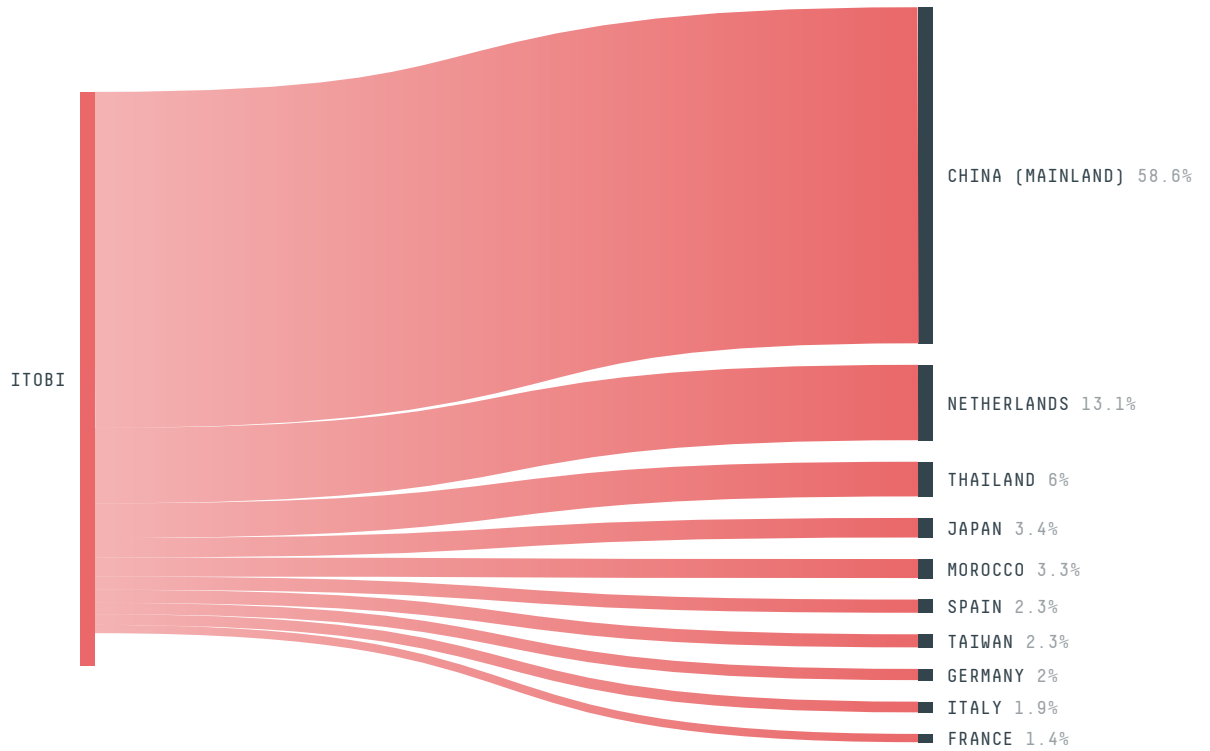

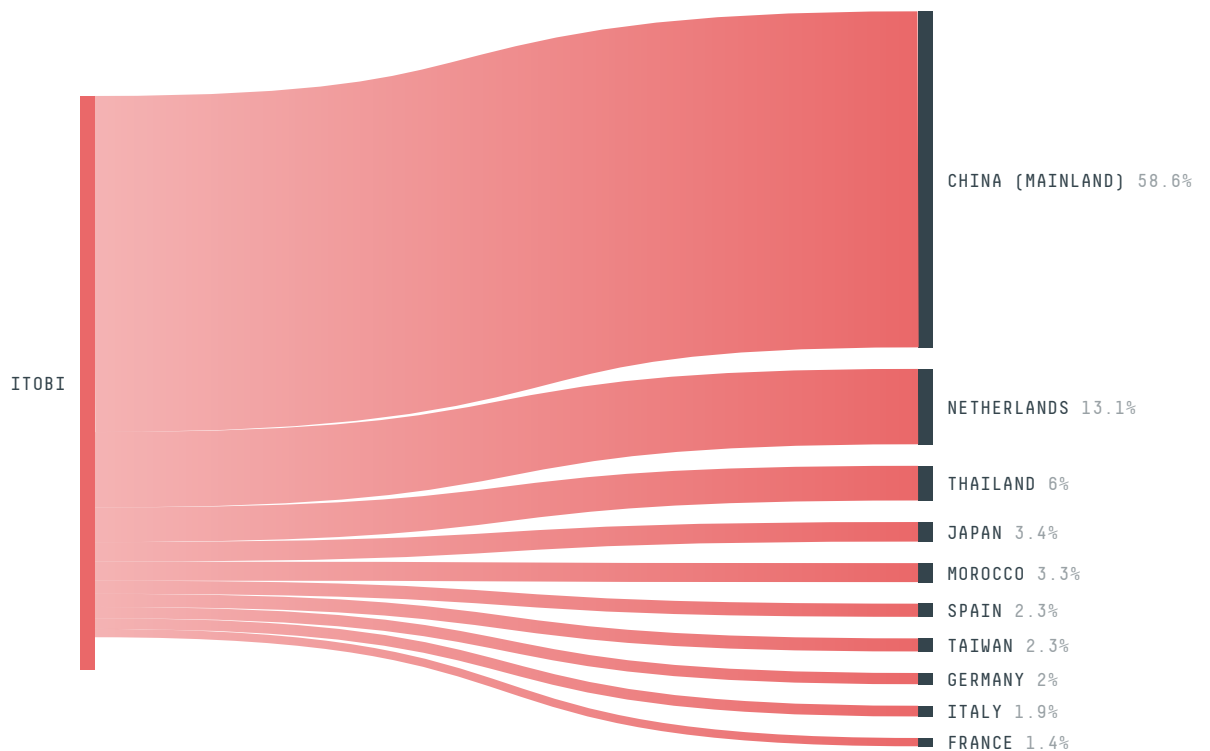
DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF ITOBI
