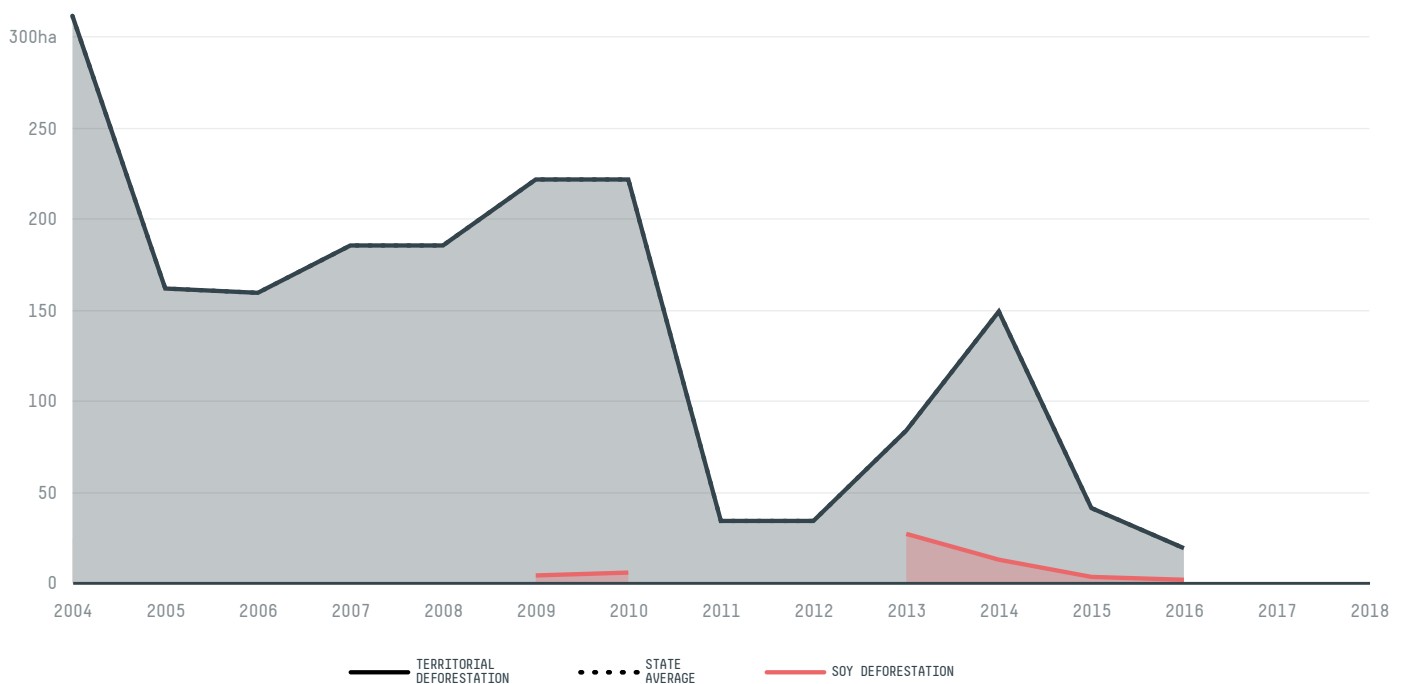
AREA PRODUCTION OF SOY SOY LAND

In 2018, Angatuba produced 31,500 t of soy occupying a total of 7,500 ha of land. With 0.03% of the total production, it ranks 657th in Brazil in soy production. The largest exporter of soy in Angatuba was Louis Dreyfus, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was China (Mainland).

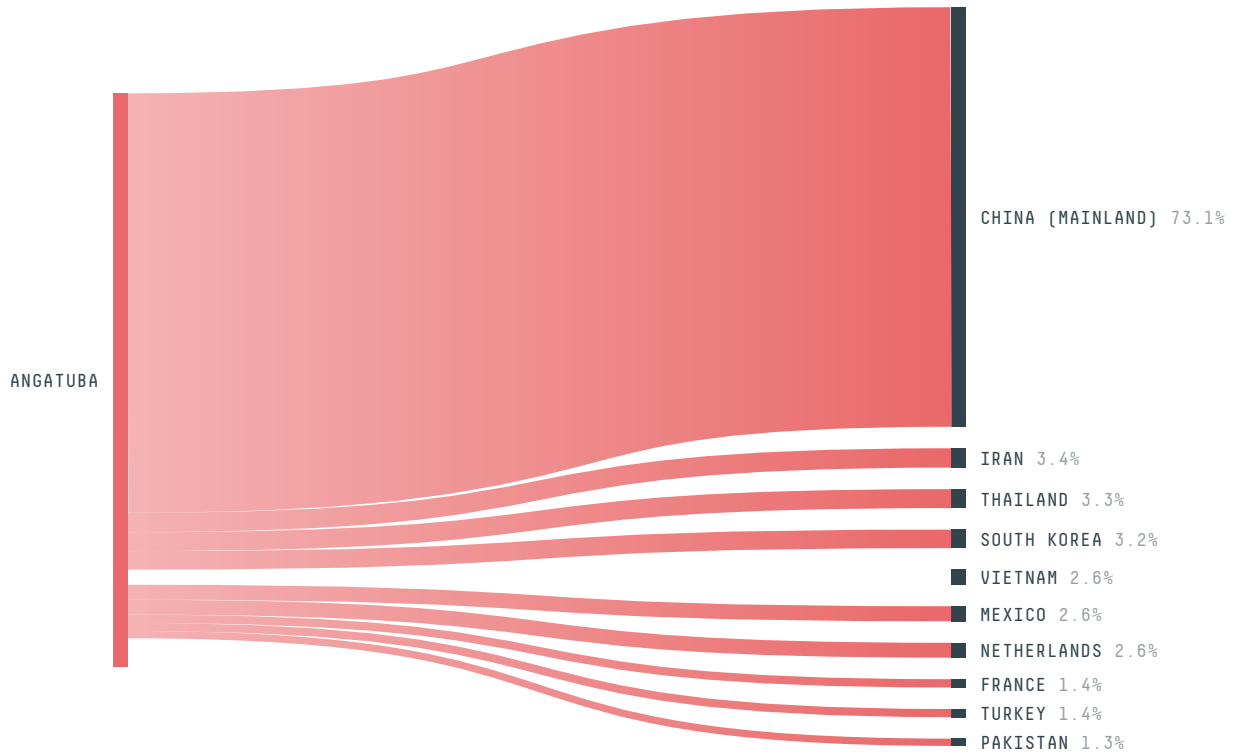

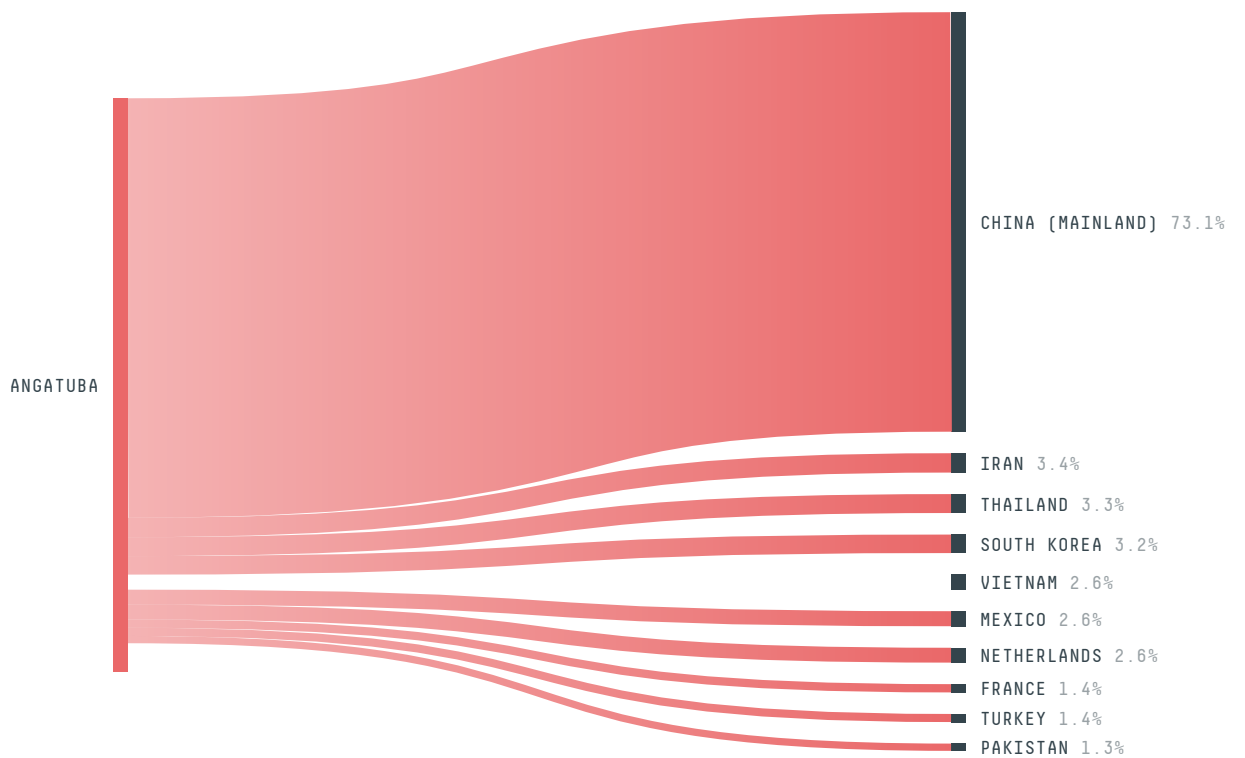
## DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF ANGATUBA
