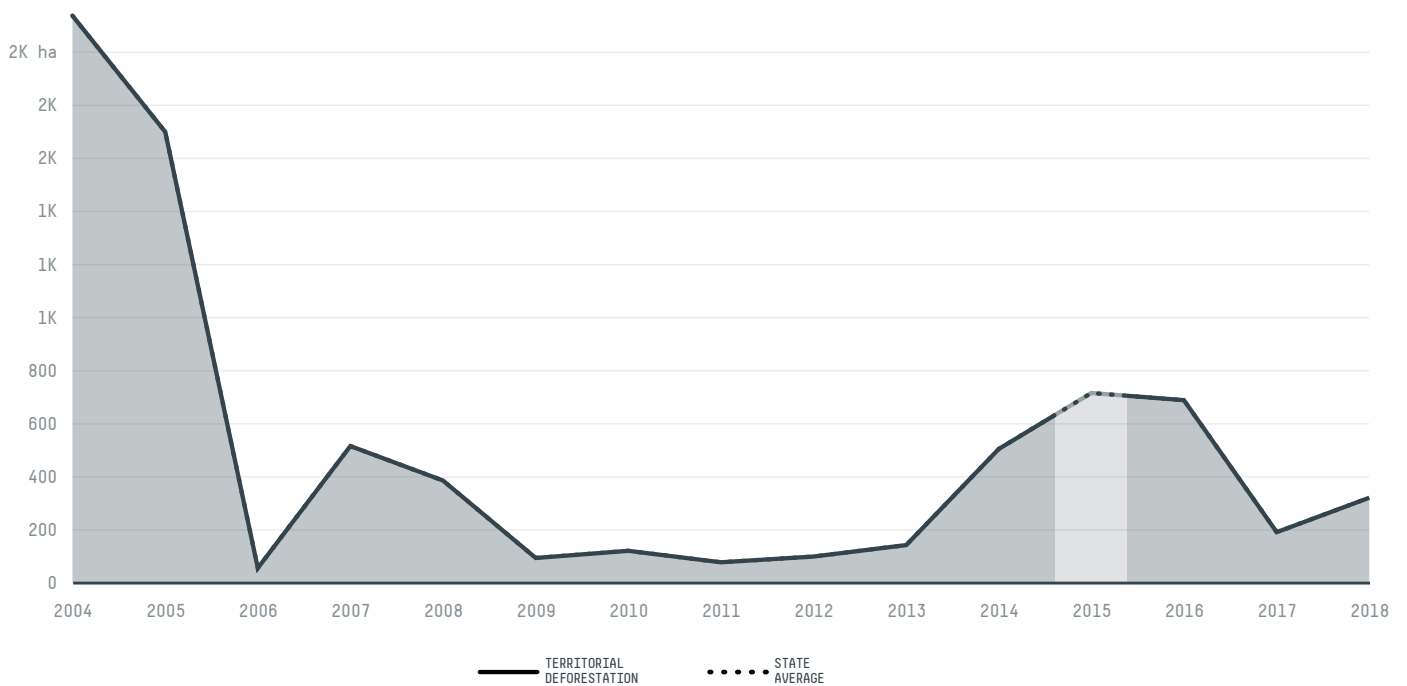
AREA PRODUCTION OF COCOA COCOA LAND  
**1,314 km<sup>2</sup> 10 t 28 ha**

In 2015, Cabixi produced 10 t of cocoa occupying a total of 28 ha of land. With 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 34th in Brazil in cocoa production. The largest exporter of cocoa in Cabixi was Joanes Industrial Ltda, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Argentina.

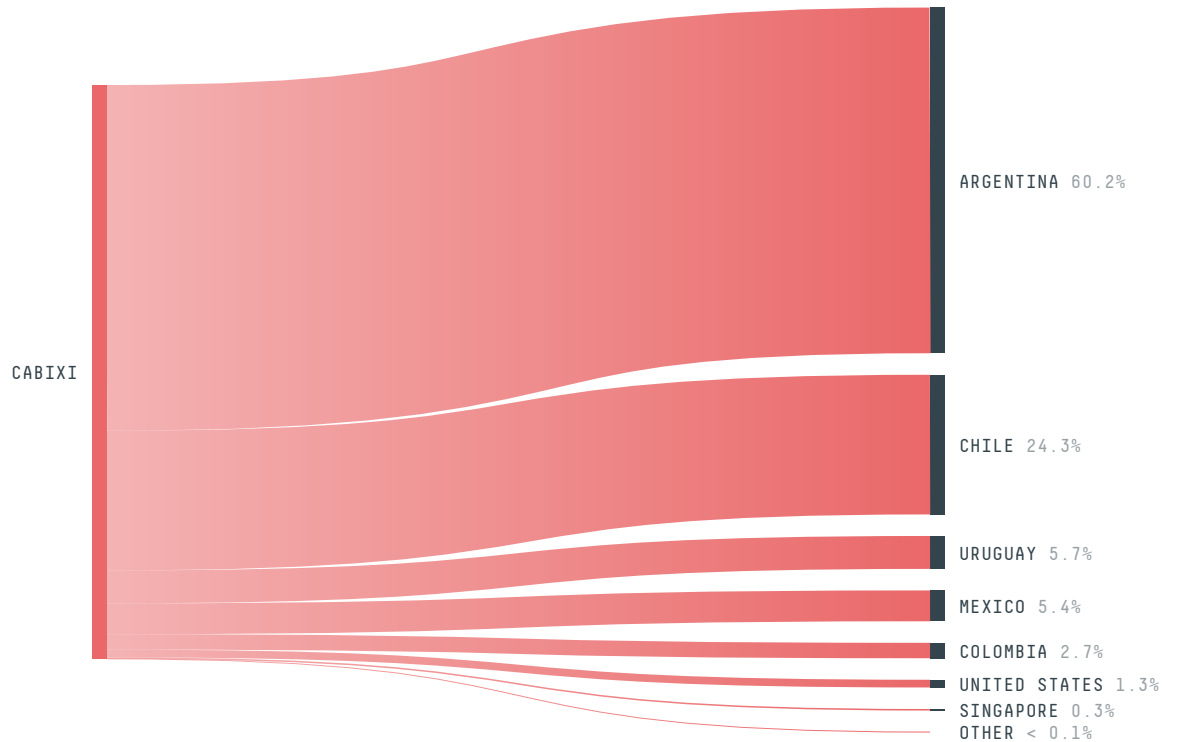
## DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF CABIXI
