In 2017, Tiangua produced 33 t of coffee occupying a total of 252 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 505th in Brazil in coffee production. The largest exporter of coffee in Tiangua was Cafe Dom Camilo Ltda, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was China (Mainland).
