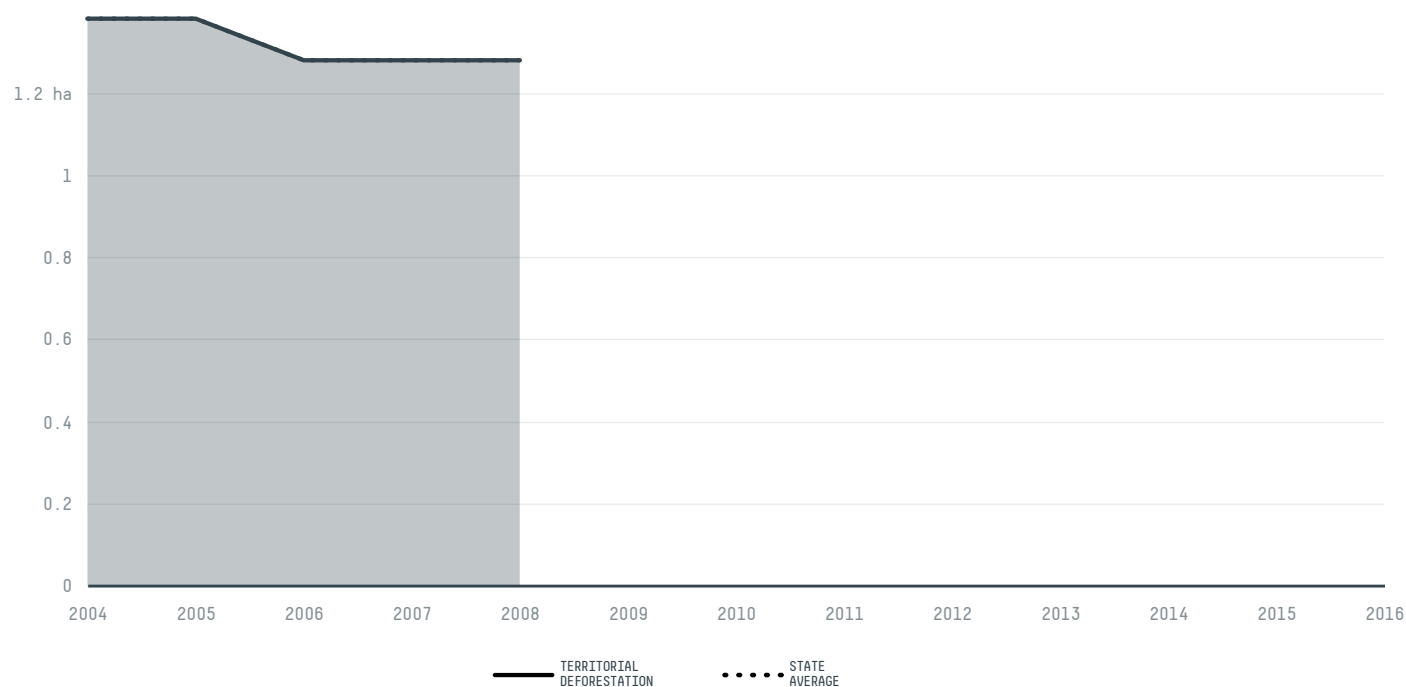
AREA PRODUCTION OF COFFEE COFFEE LAND  
**322 km<sup>2</sup> 1,200 t 1,600 ha**

In 2015, Itirucu produced 1,200 t of coffee occupying a total of 1,600 ha of land. With 0.04% of the total production, it ranks 270th in Brazil in coffee production. The largest exporter of coffee in Itirucu was Brandao Filhos S A Comercio Industria E Lavoura, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Greece.

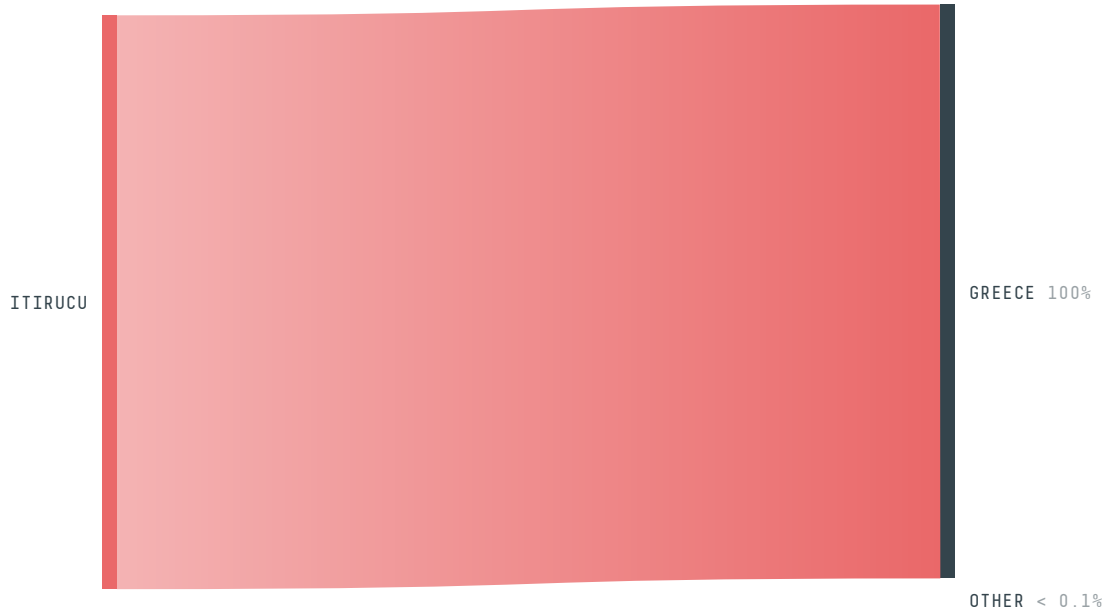
### DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF ITIRUCU
