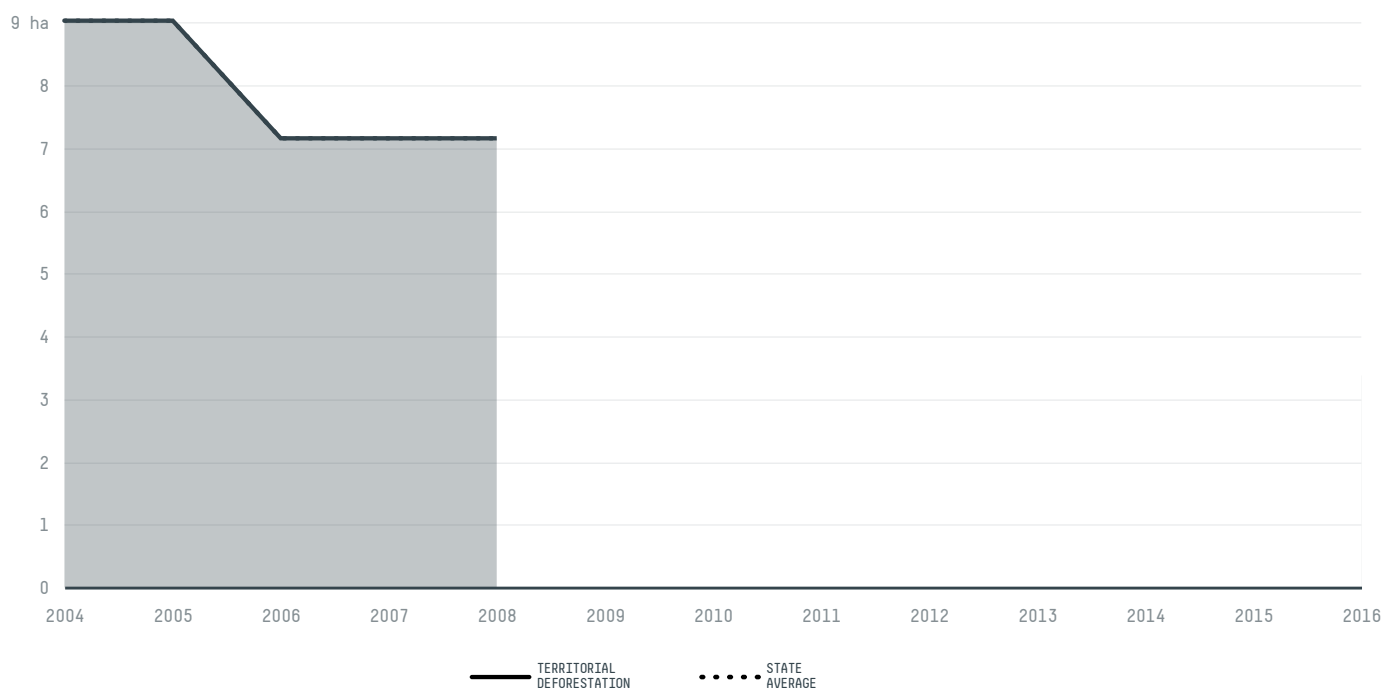

The largest exporter of coffee in Ibirapitanga was Eisa Empresa Interagrica, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was France.

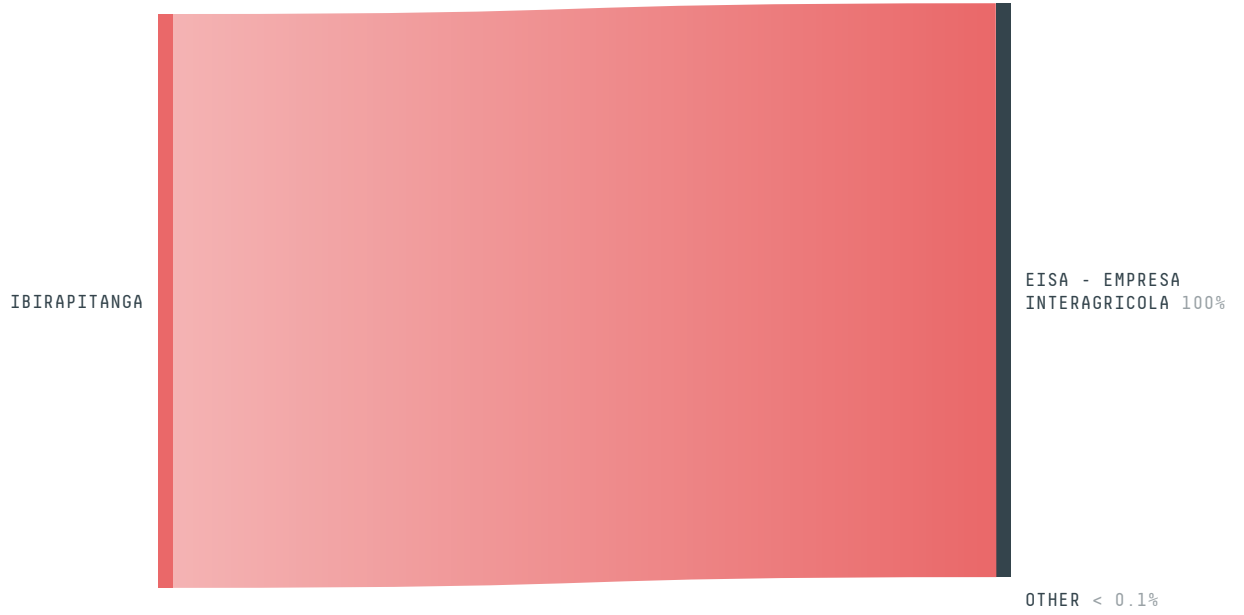
