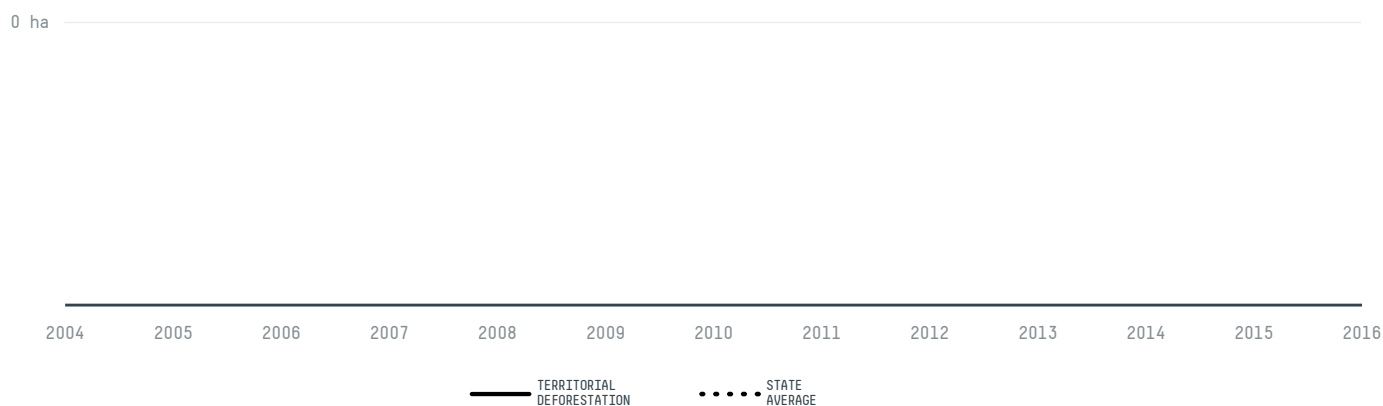
AREA PRODUCTION OF COFFEE COFFEE LAND

In 2017, Itajuípe produced 132 t of coffee occupying a total of 120 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 439th in Brazil in coffee production. The largest exporter of coffee in Itajuípe was Eisa Empresa Interagícola, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Japan.

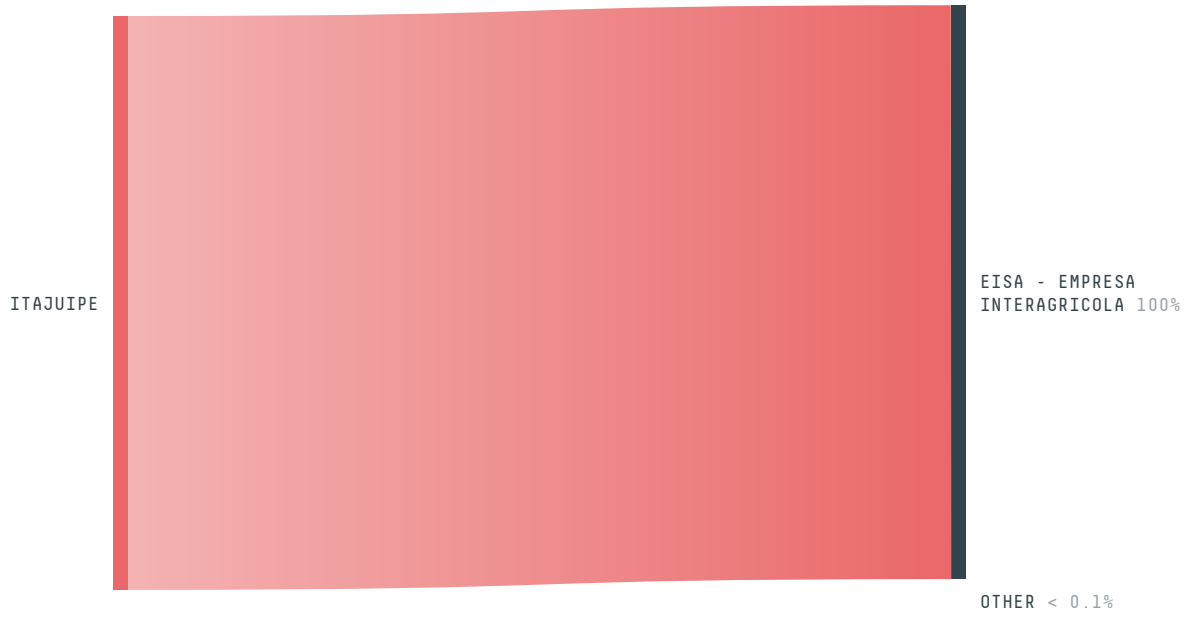
