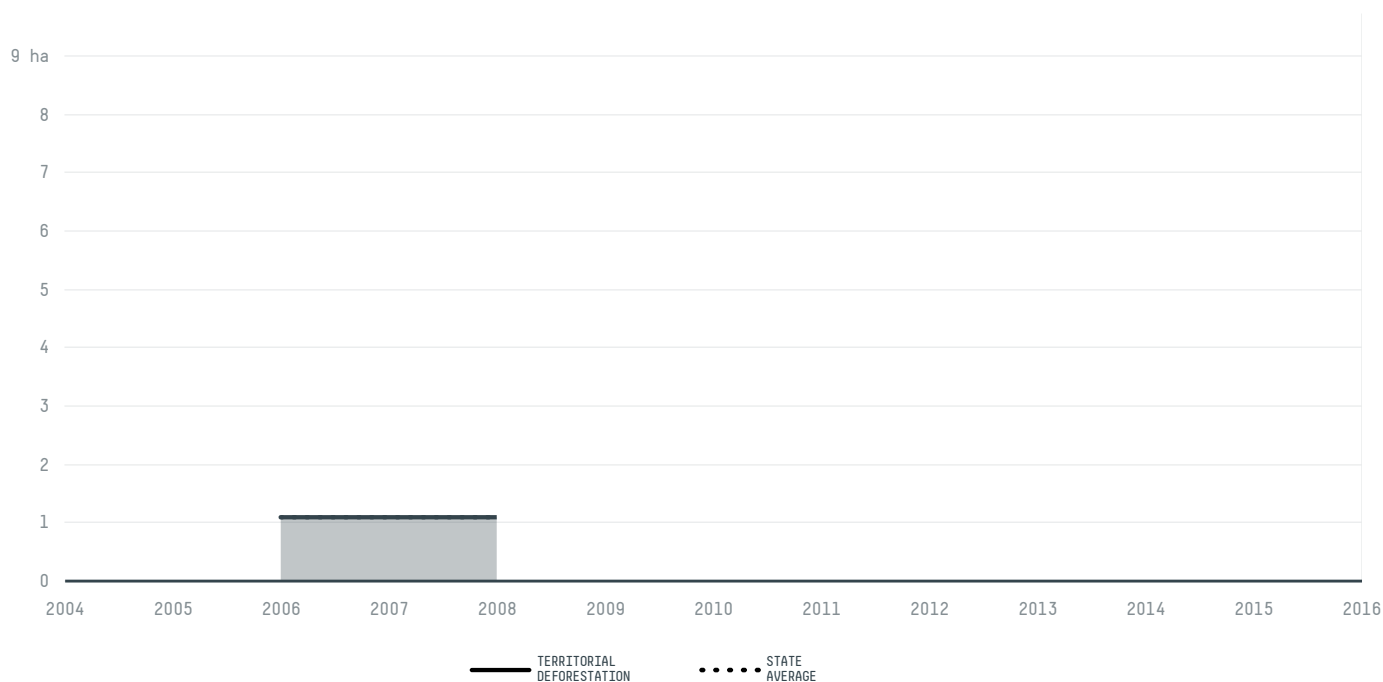
AREA PRODUCTION OF COFFEE COFFEE LAND

In 2017, Itapitanga produced 38 t of coffee occupying a total of 40 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 500th in Brazil in coffee production. The largest exporter of coffee in Itapitanga was Eisa Empresa Interagrica, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Belgium.
