In 2017, Vitoria Da Conquista produced 4,350 t of coffee occupying a total of 7,299 ha of land. With 0.13% of the total production, it ranks 155th in Brazil in coffee production. The largest exporter of coffee in Vitoria Da Conquista was Unicafe Companhia De Comercio Exterior, which accounted for 50.9% of the total exports, and the main destination was United States.

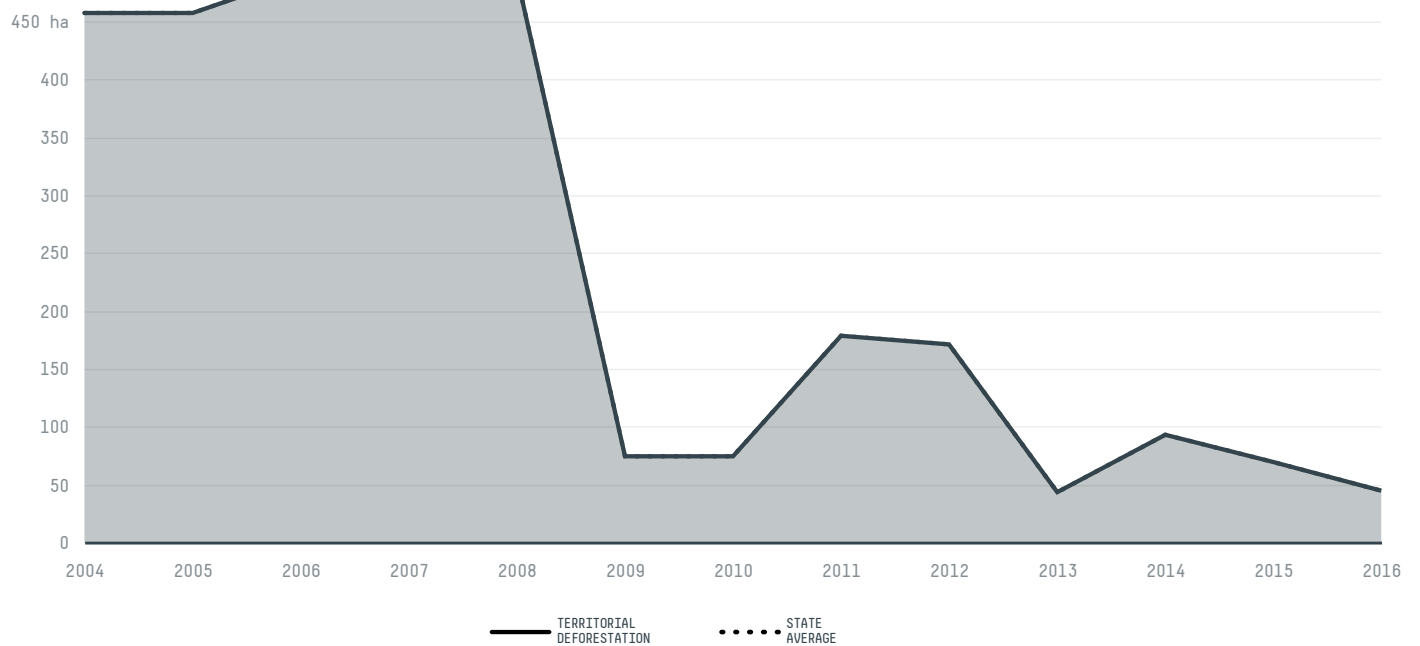

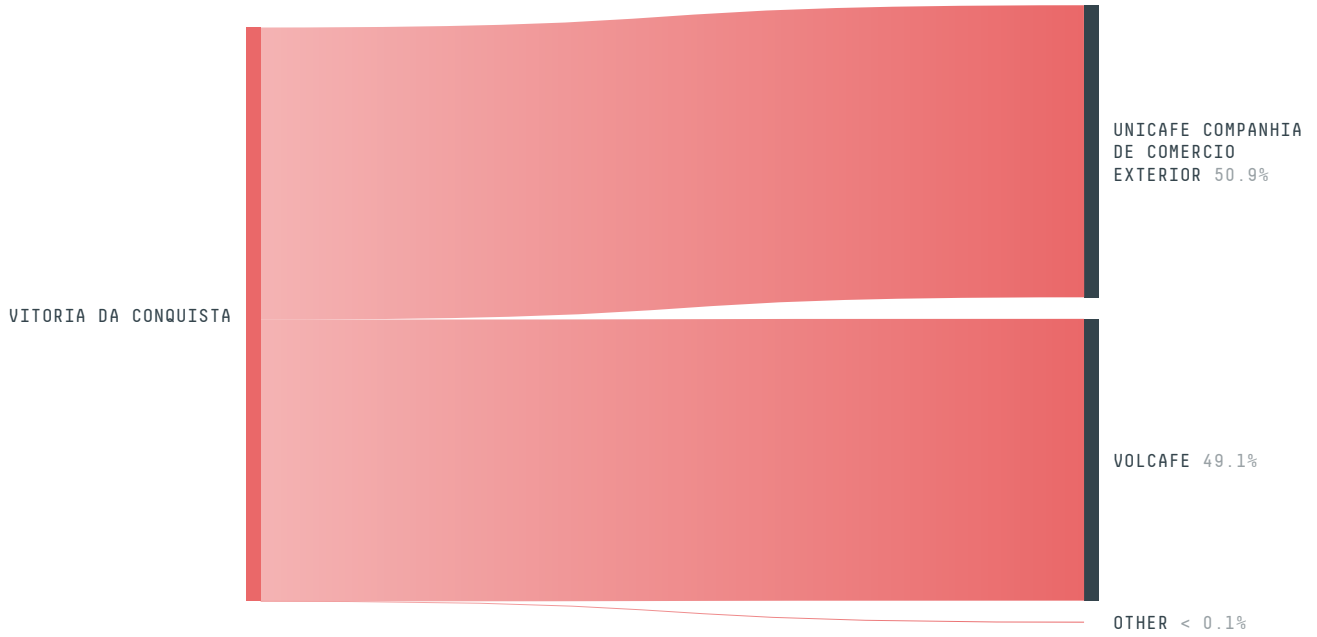

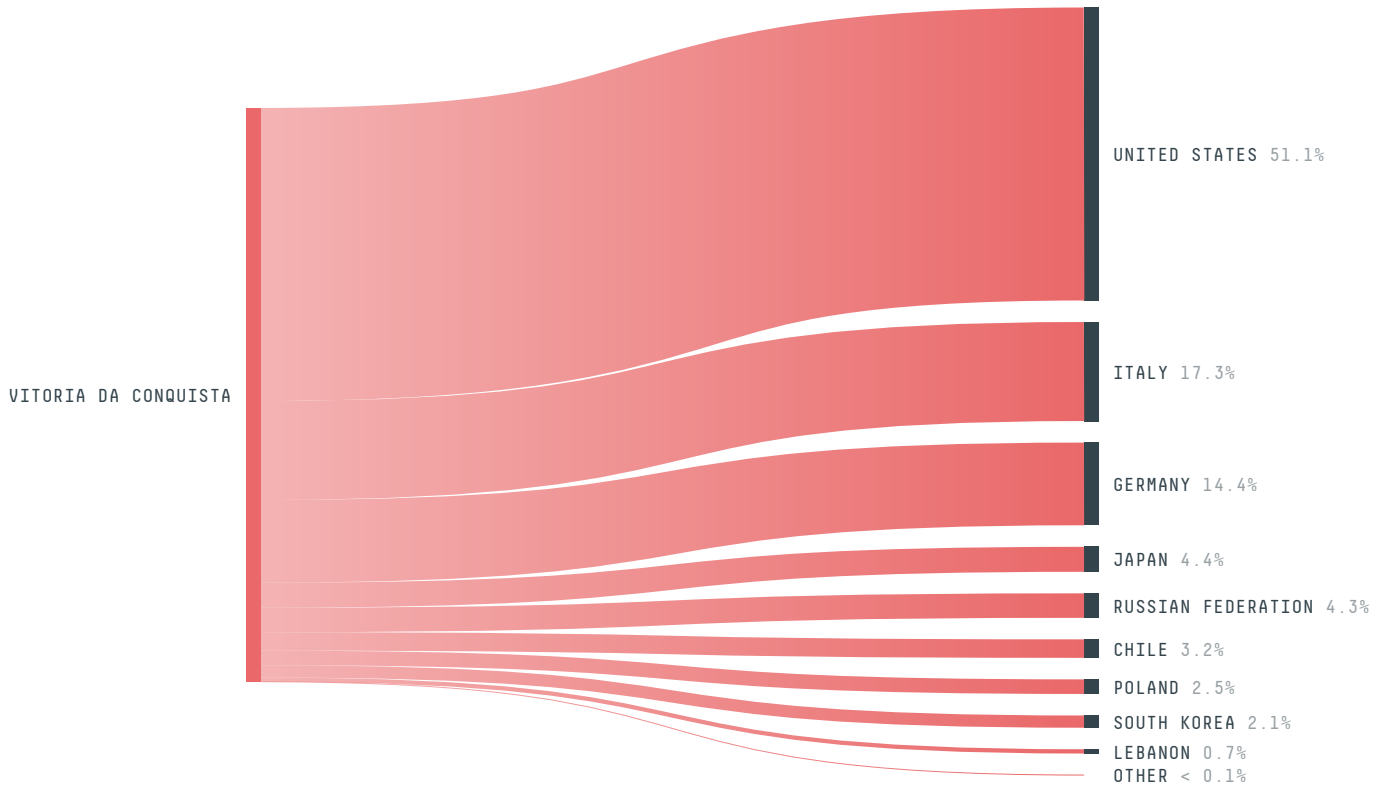
DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF VITORIA DA CONQUISTA
