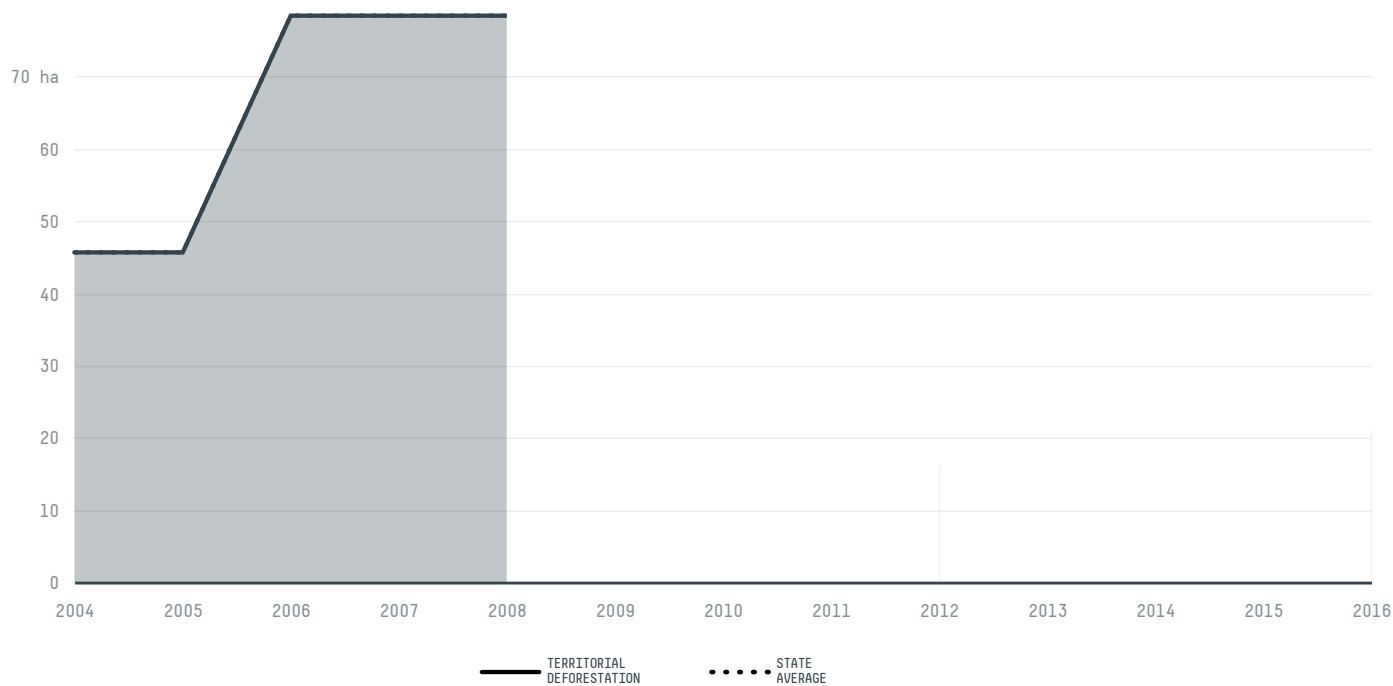
AREA PRODUCTION OF COFFEE COFFEE LAND
1,139 km² 7 t 20 ha

In 2017, Ibicui produced 7 t of coffee occupying a total of 20 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 531st in Brazil in coffee production. The largest exporter of coffee in Ibicui was Eisa Empresa Interagropecuária, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Turkey.
