In 2017, Tanhacu produced 68 t of coffee occupying a total of 100 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 479th in Brazil in coffee production. The largest exporter of coffee in Tanhacu was J. R. Comercio E Exportacao De Cafe Ltda, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Montenegro.
