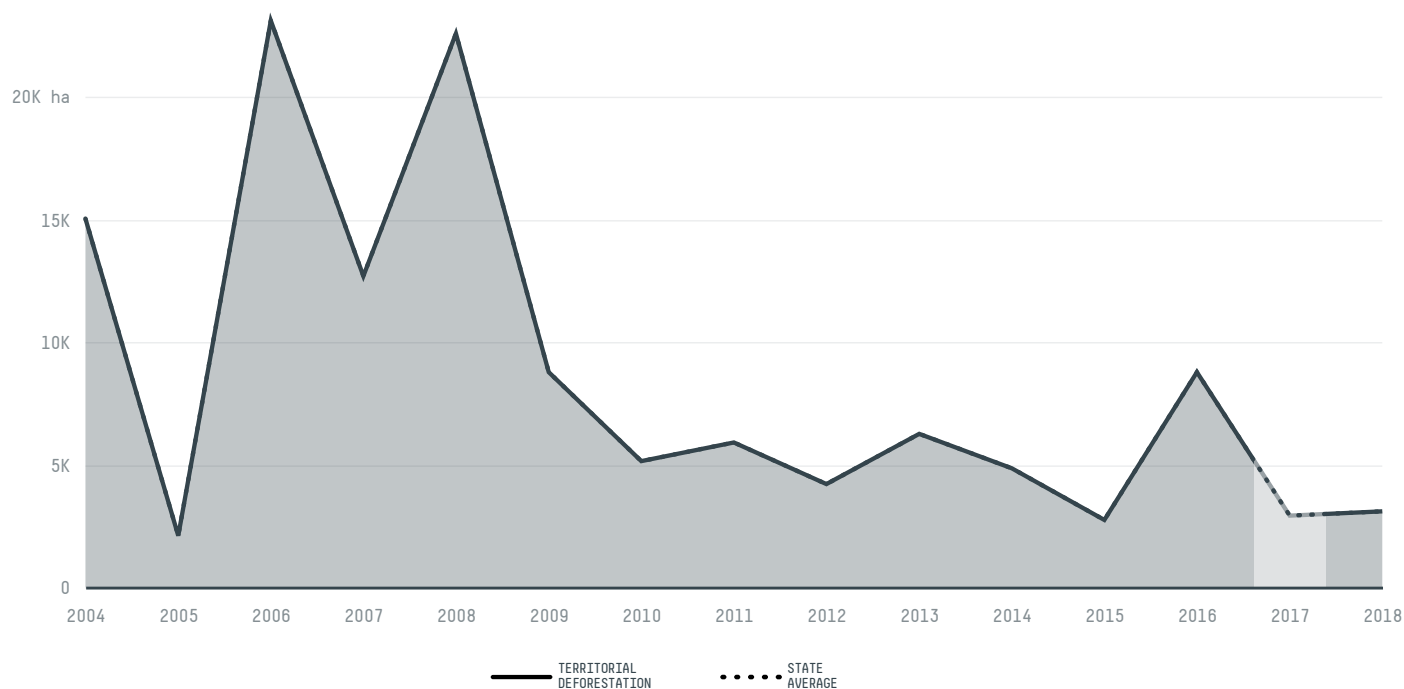

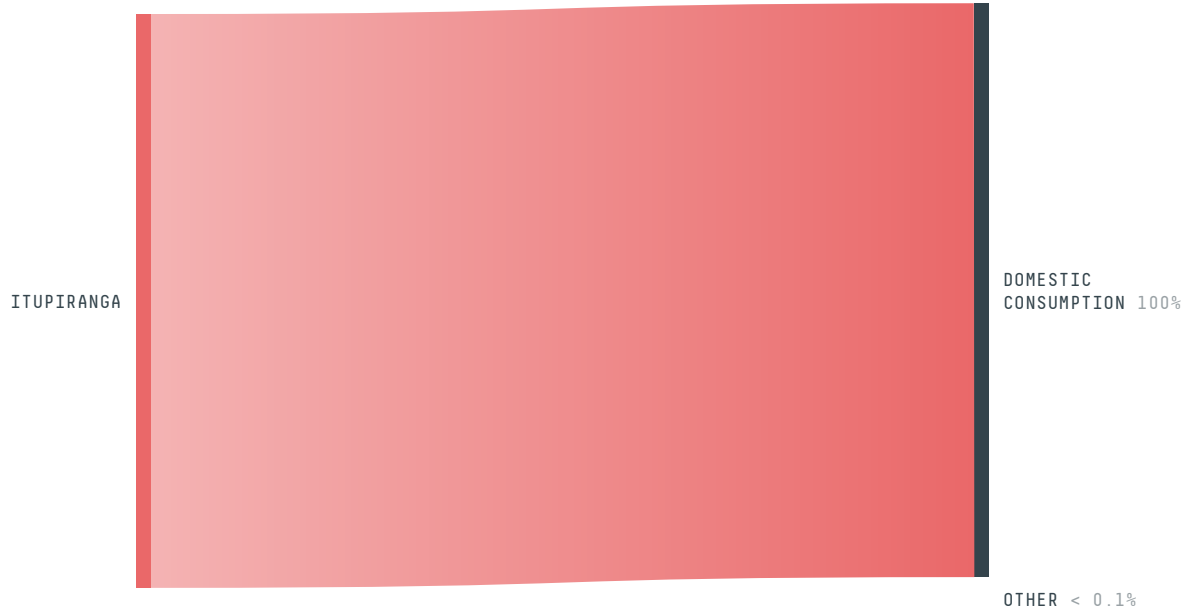

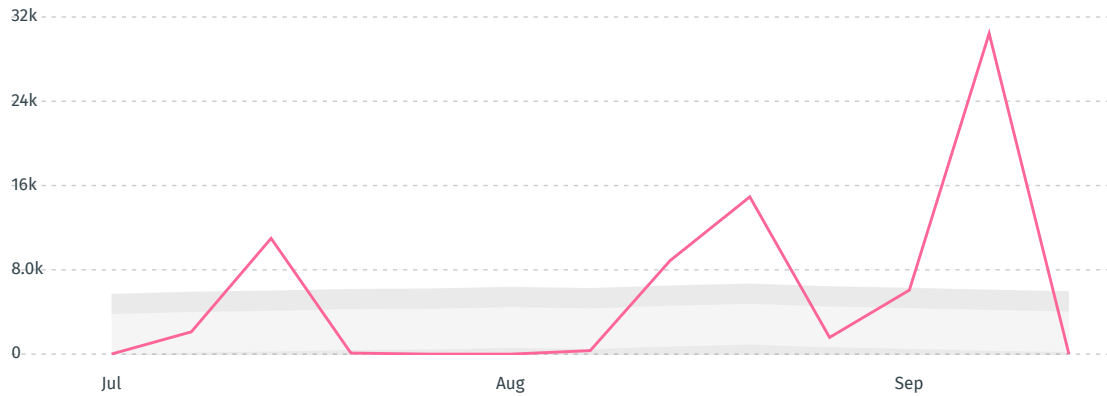


## TOP IMPORTING COUNTRIES OF CORN FROM ITUPIRANGA IN 2017
