In 2017, Palmas produced 48,266 t of corn occupying a total of 22,039 ha of land. With 0.03% of the total production, it ranks 361st in Brazil in corn production. The largest exporter of corn in Palmas was Gaviolon, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Spain.

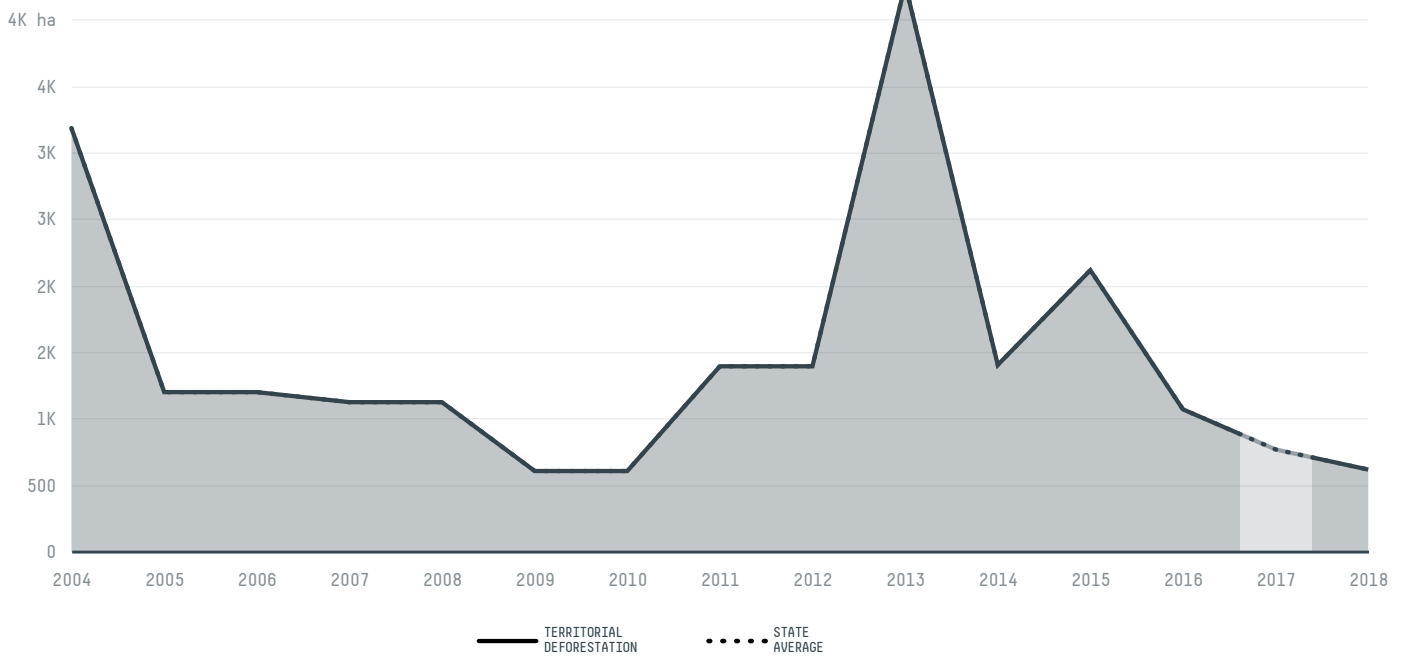

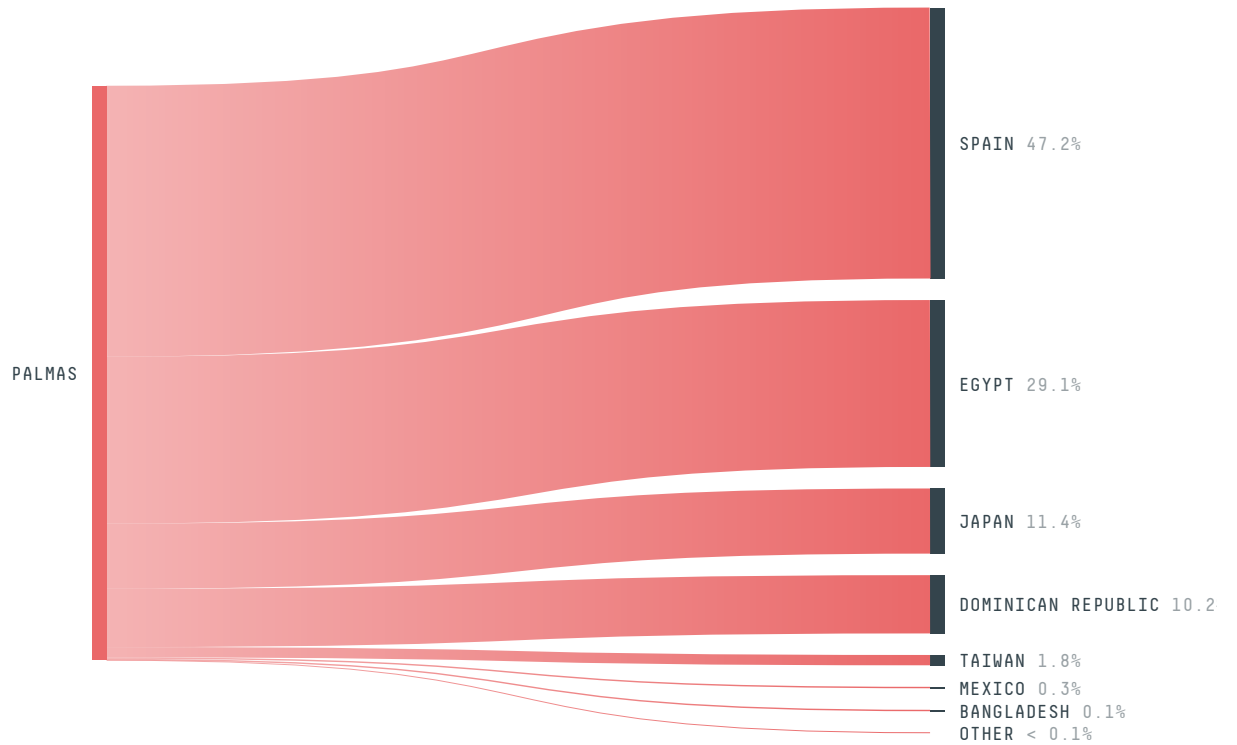
DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF PALMAS
