In 2017, Colinas Do Tocantins produced 135 t of corn occupying a total of 50 ha of land. With less than 0.01% of the total production, it ranks 2105th in Brazil in corn production. The largest exporter of corn in Colinas Do Tocantins was Gavilon, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Spain.

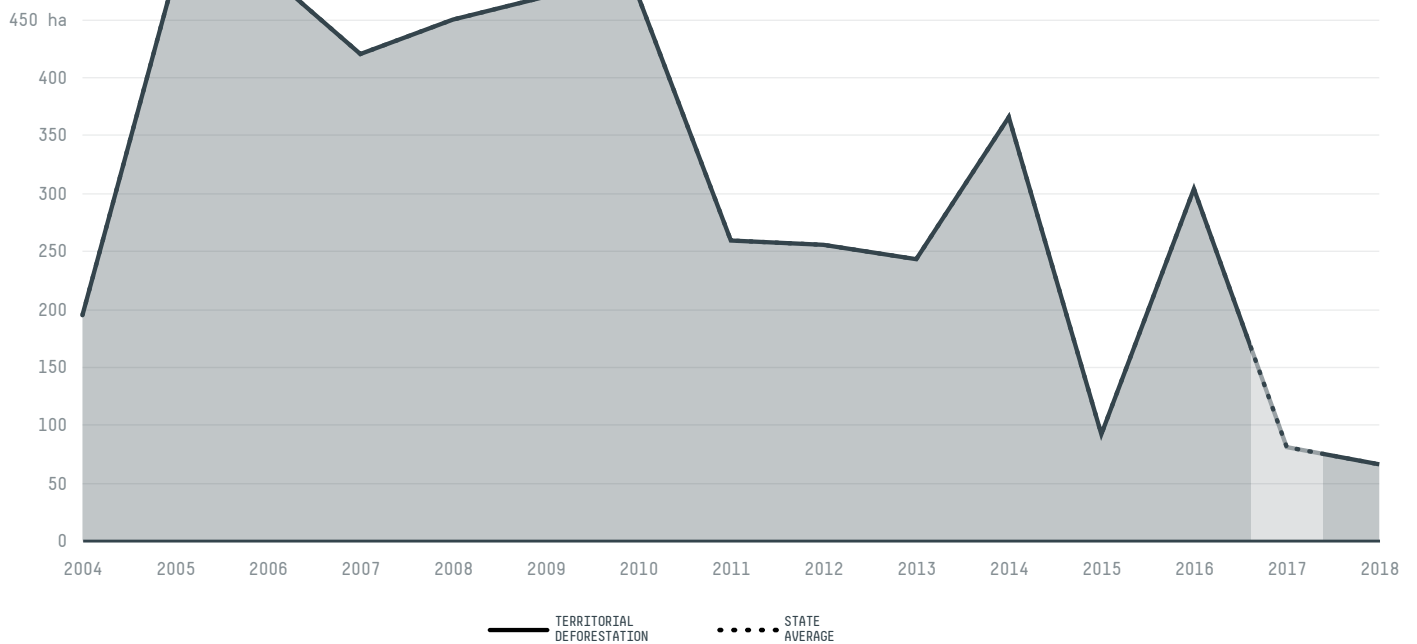

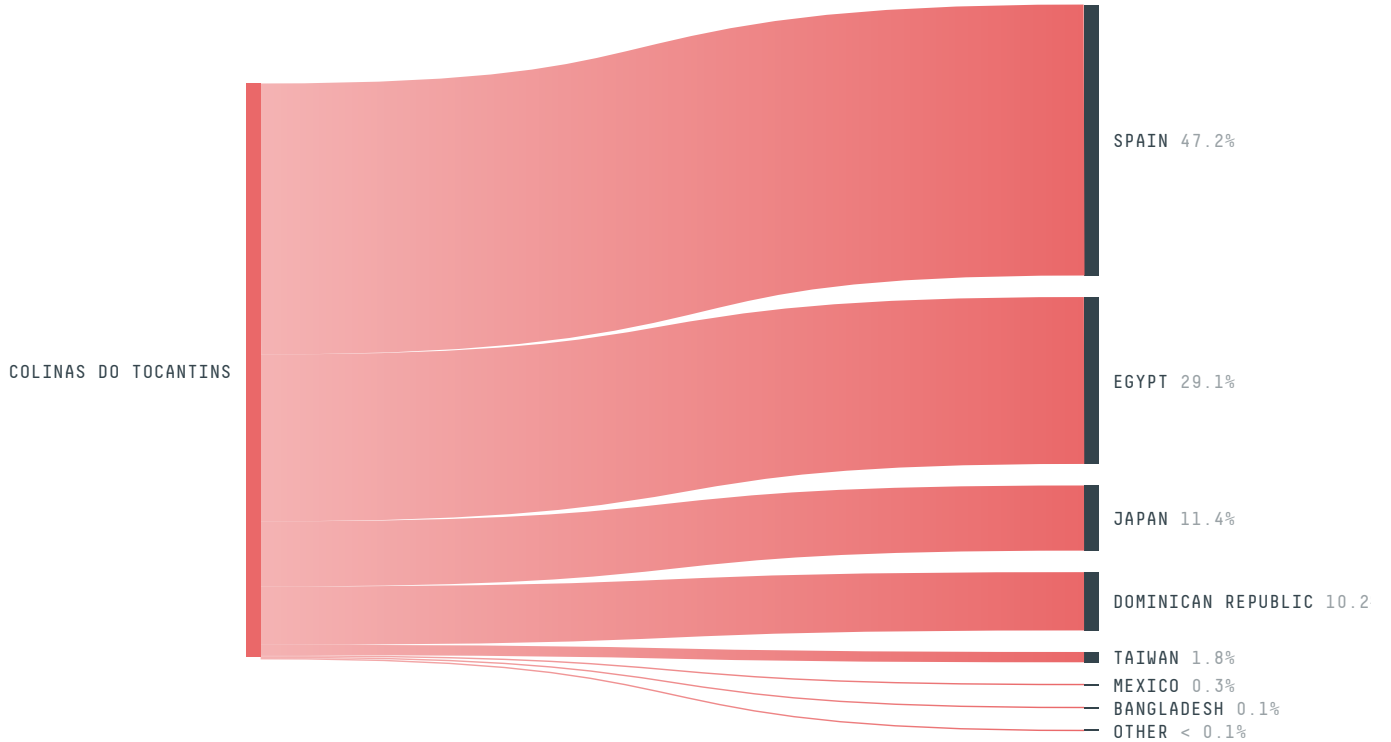
DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF COLINAS DO TOCANTINS
