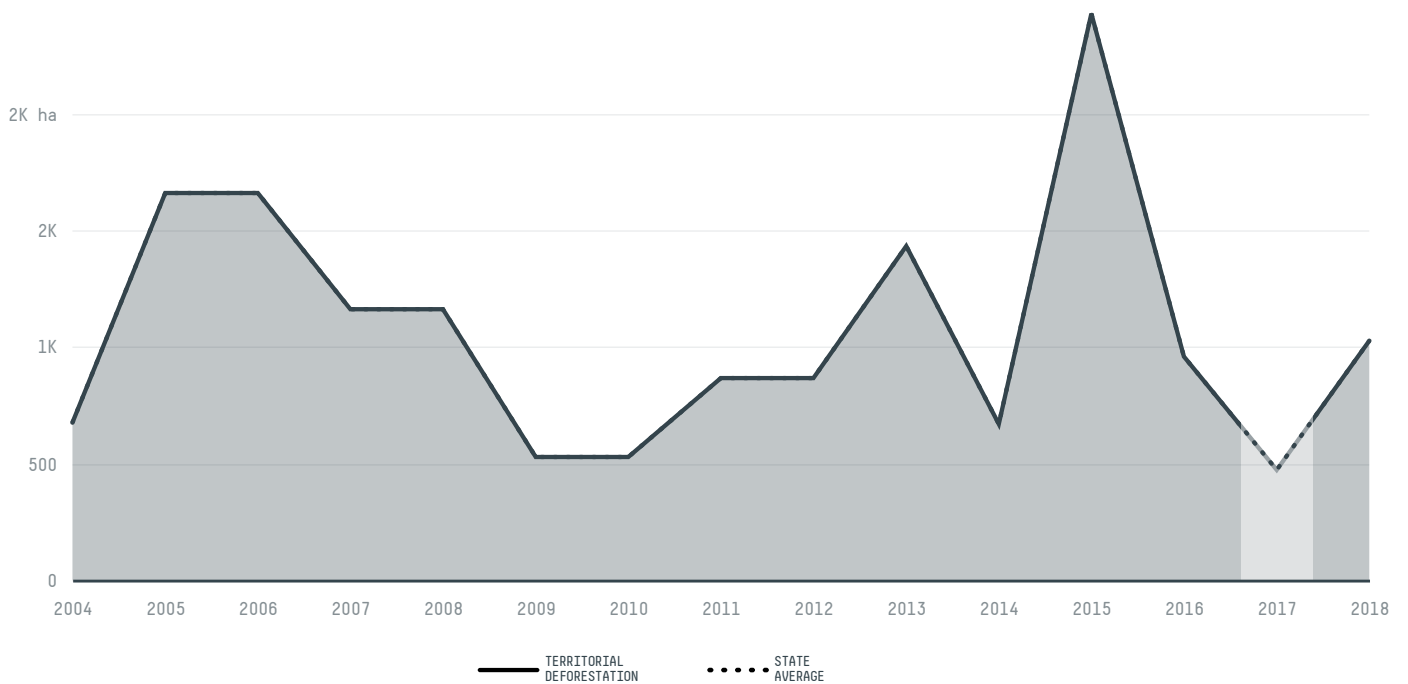

TOP TRADERS OF CORN IN LAJEADO NOVO IN 2017

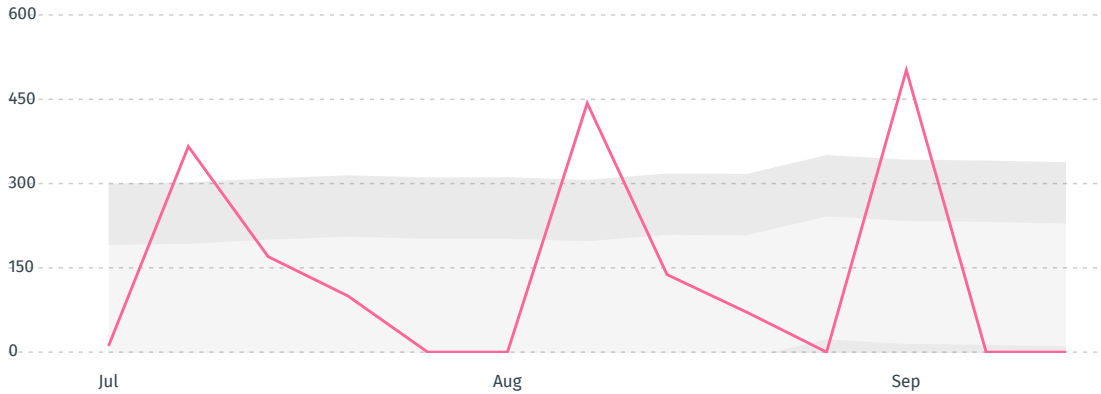


TOP IMPORTING COUNTRIES OF CORN FROM LAJEADO NOVO IN 2017
