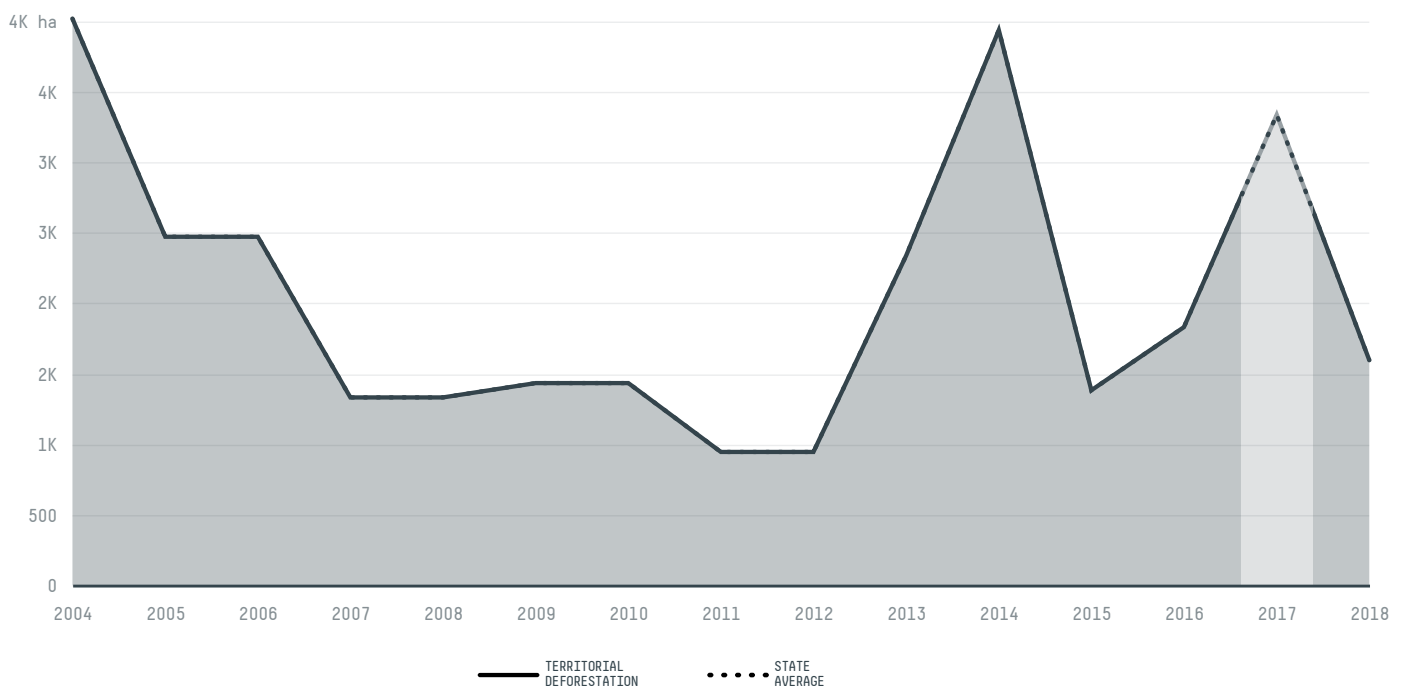
AREA PRODUCTION OF CORN CORN LAND

In 2017, Sambaiba produced 43,814 t of corn occupying a total of 11,622 ha of land. With 0.03% of the total production, it ranks 383rd in Brazil in corn production. The largest exporter of corn in Sambaiba was Adm, which accounted for 60.9% of the total exports, and the main destination was Brazil.

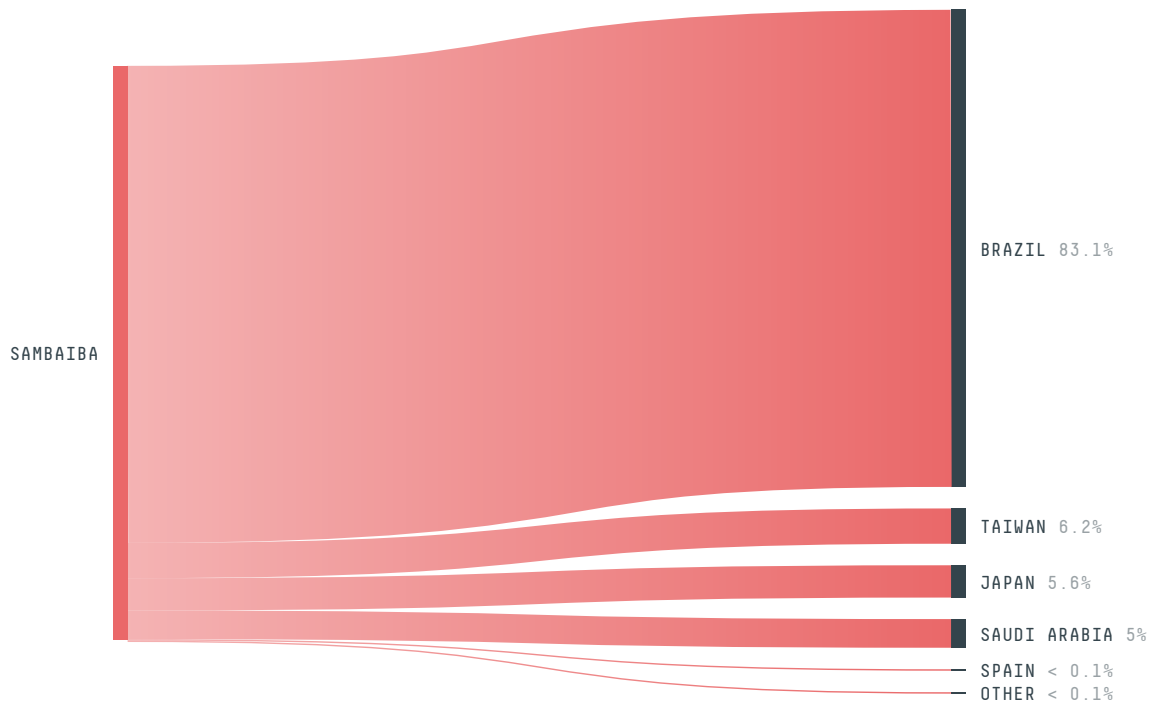
DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF SAMBAIBA
