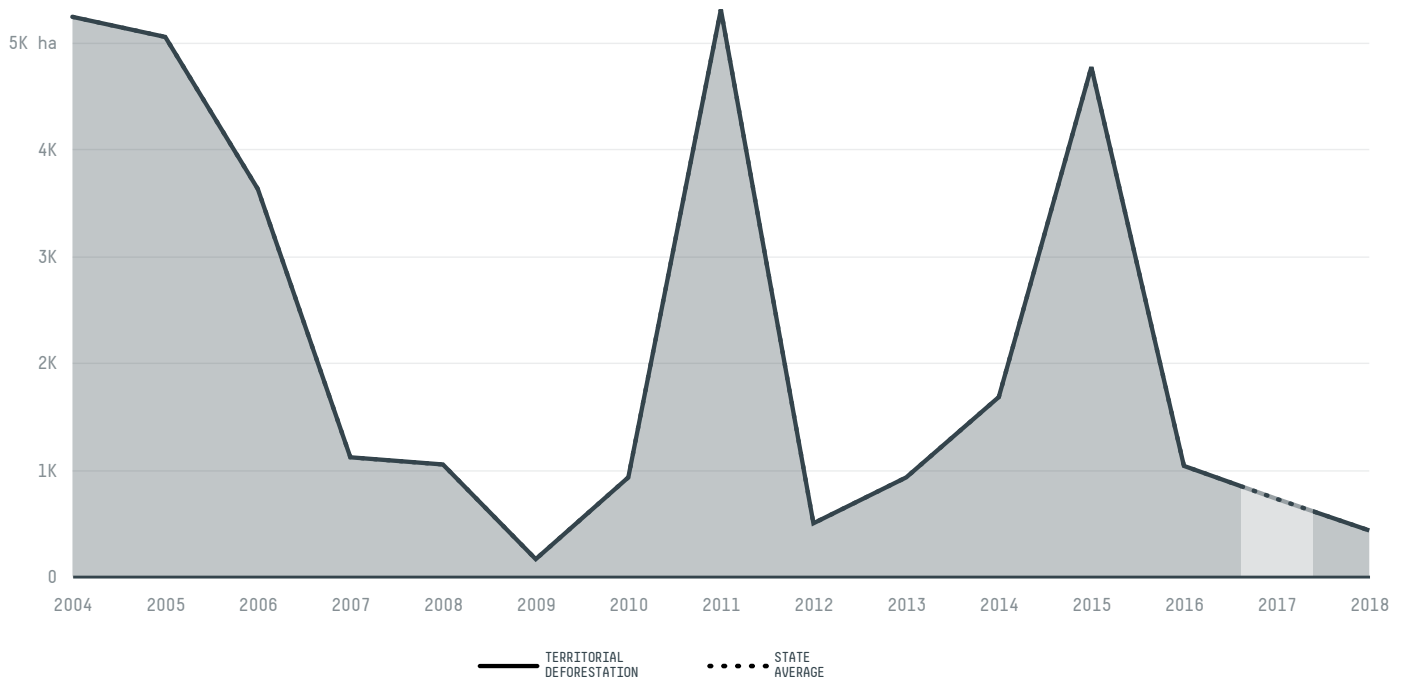

TOP TRADERS OF CORN IN VITORIA DO XINGU IN 2017

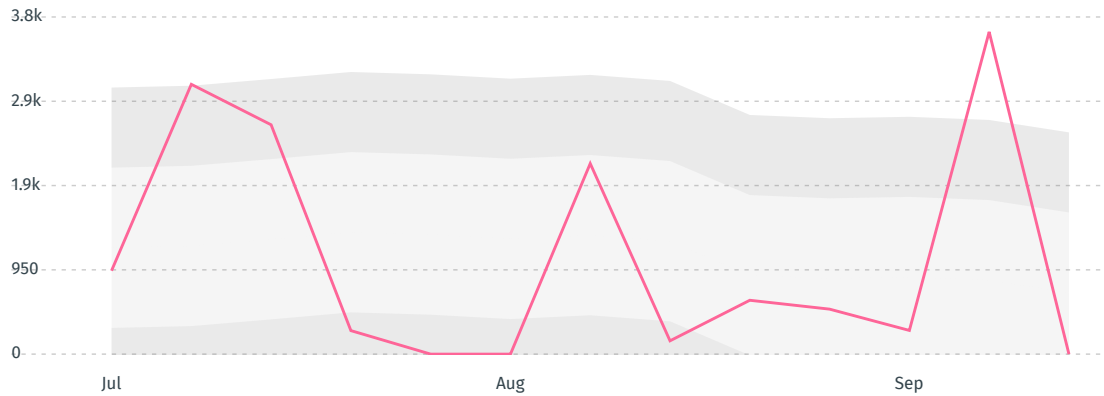


TOP IMPORTING COUNTRIES OF CORN FROM VITORIA DO XINGU IN 2017



DEFORESTATION ALERTS IN VITÓRIA DO XINGU, PARÁ, BRAZIL

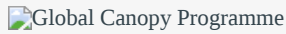
There were **0** GLAD alerts reported in the week of the **12th of October 2020**. This was **normal** compared to the same week in previous years.



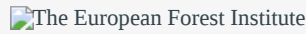
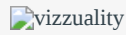
Caution: GLAD alerts from the last six months are preliminary. Revisions are made as unconfirmed alerts are removed from the data and alert totals are finalized six months after posting.
