The largest exporter of beef in Tocantinopolis was Minerva, which accounted for 100.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was Algeria.

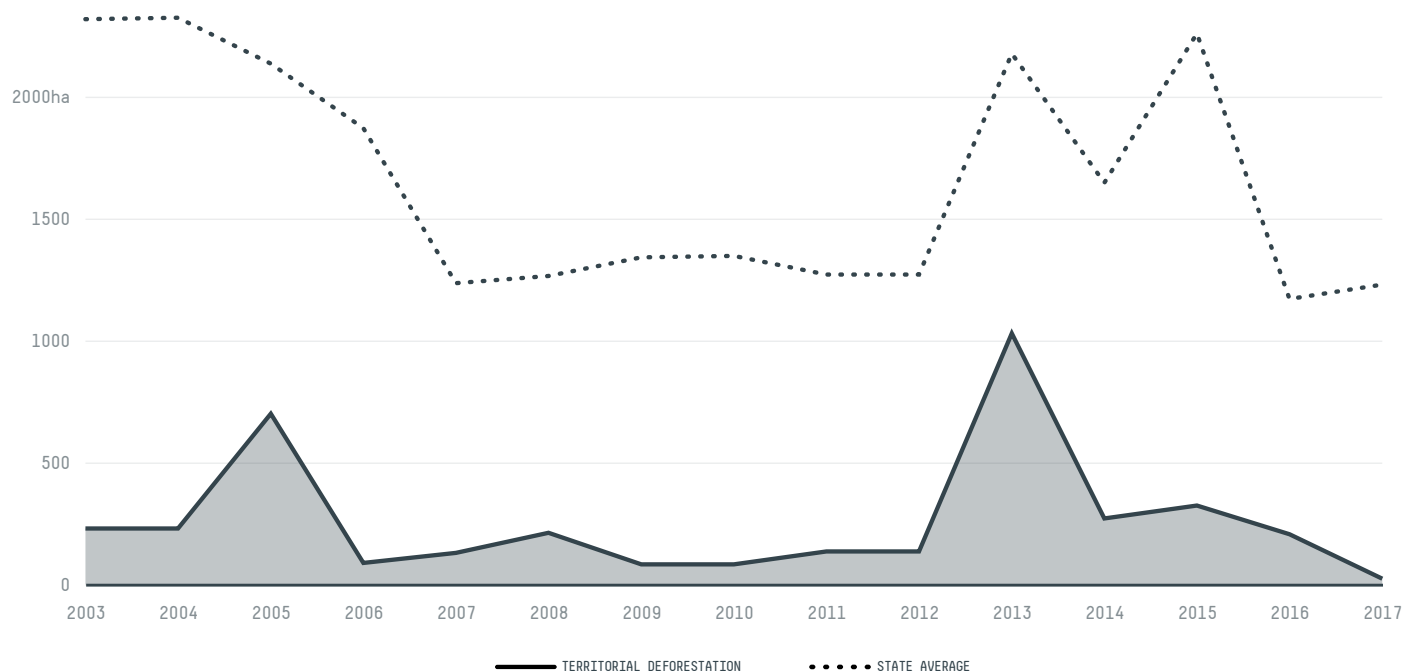
