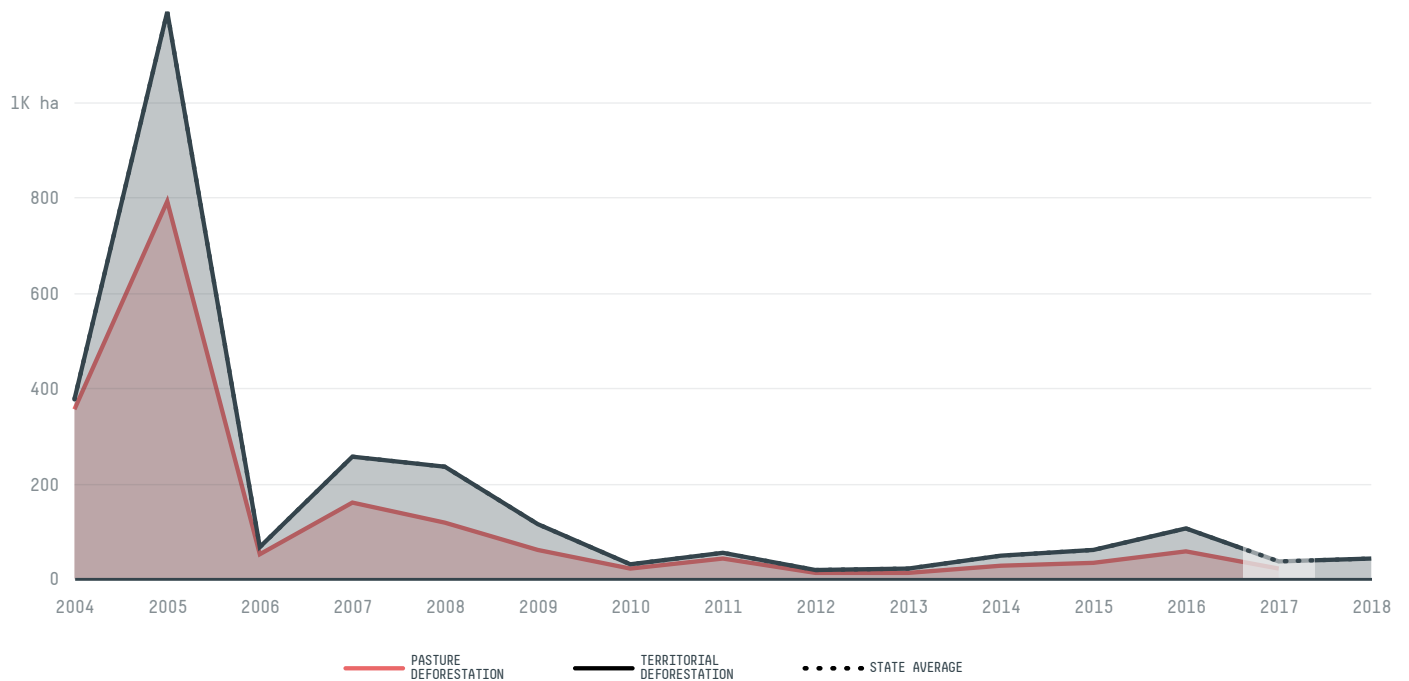

The largest exporter of beef in Pau D'arco was Minerva, which accounted for 76.2% of the total exports, and the main destination was China (Hong Kong).

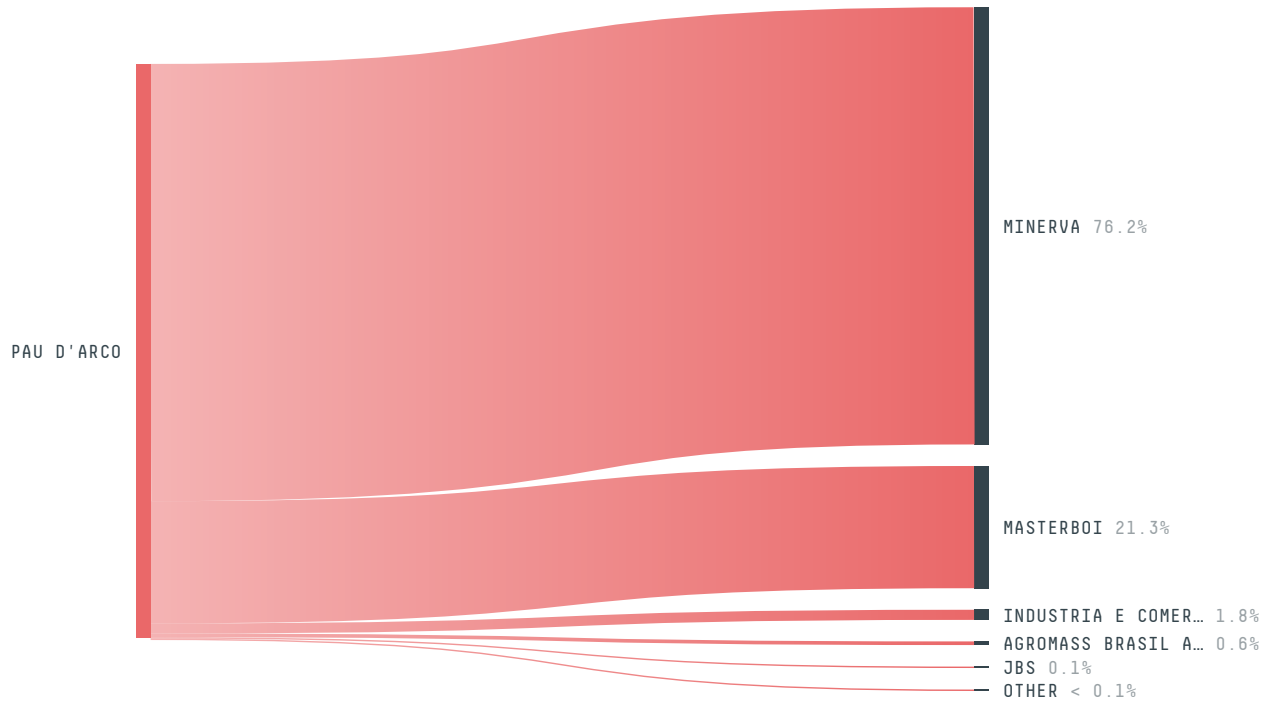

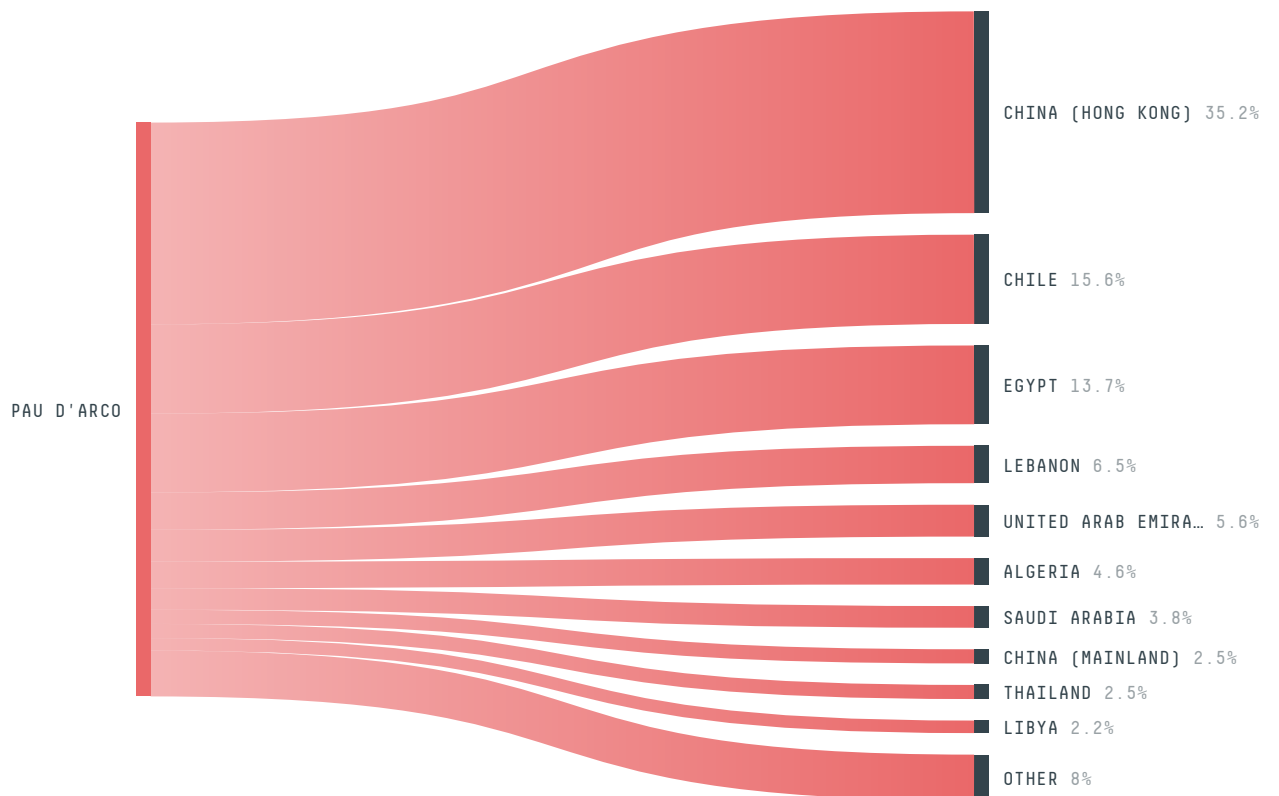
DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF PAU D'ARCO
