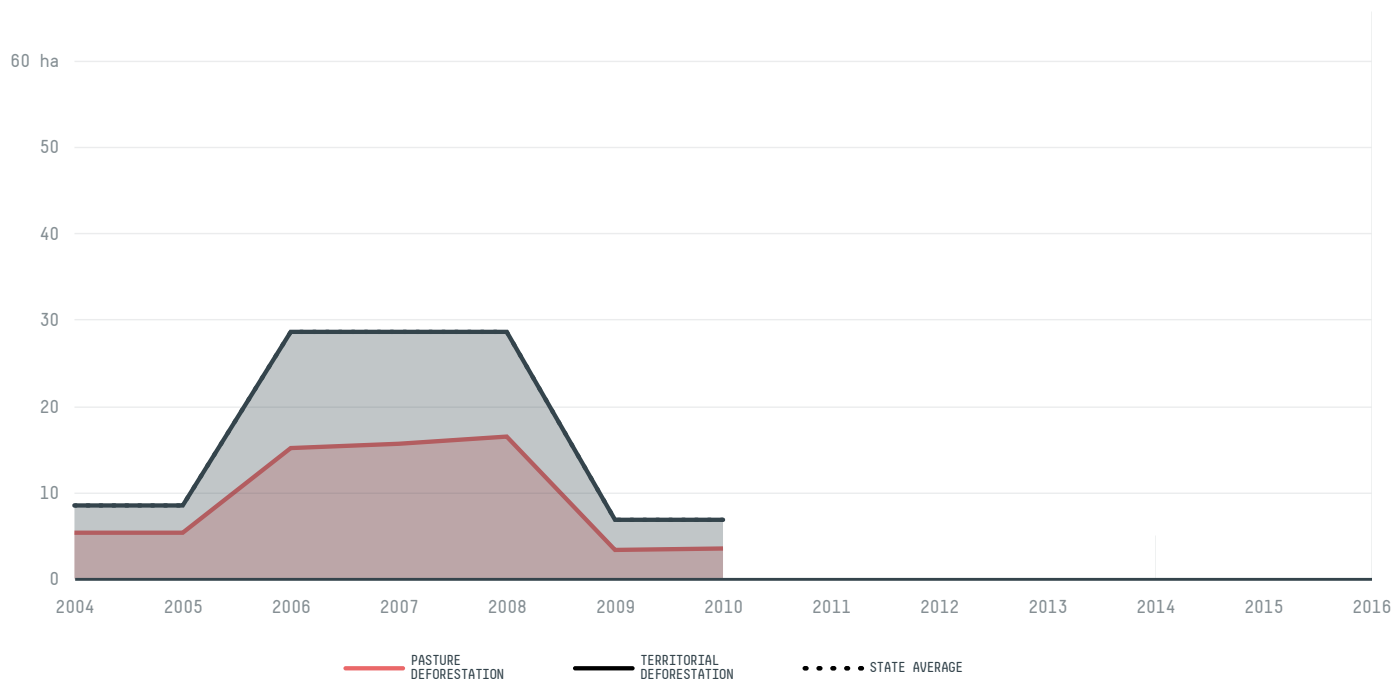

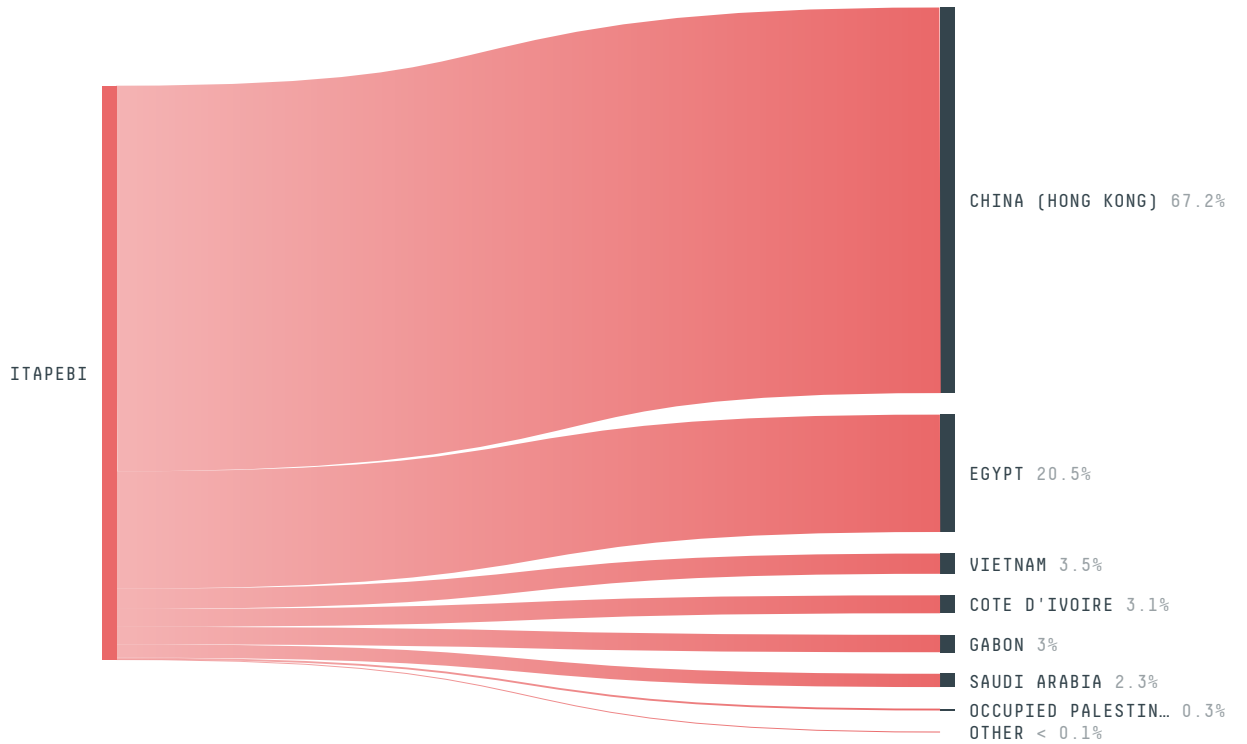
## DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF ITAPEBI
