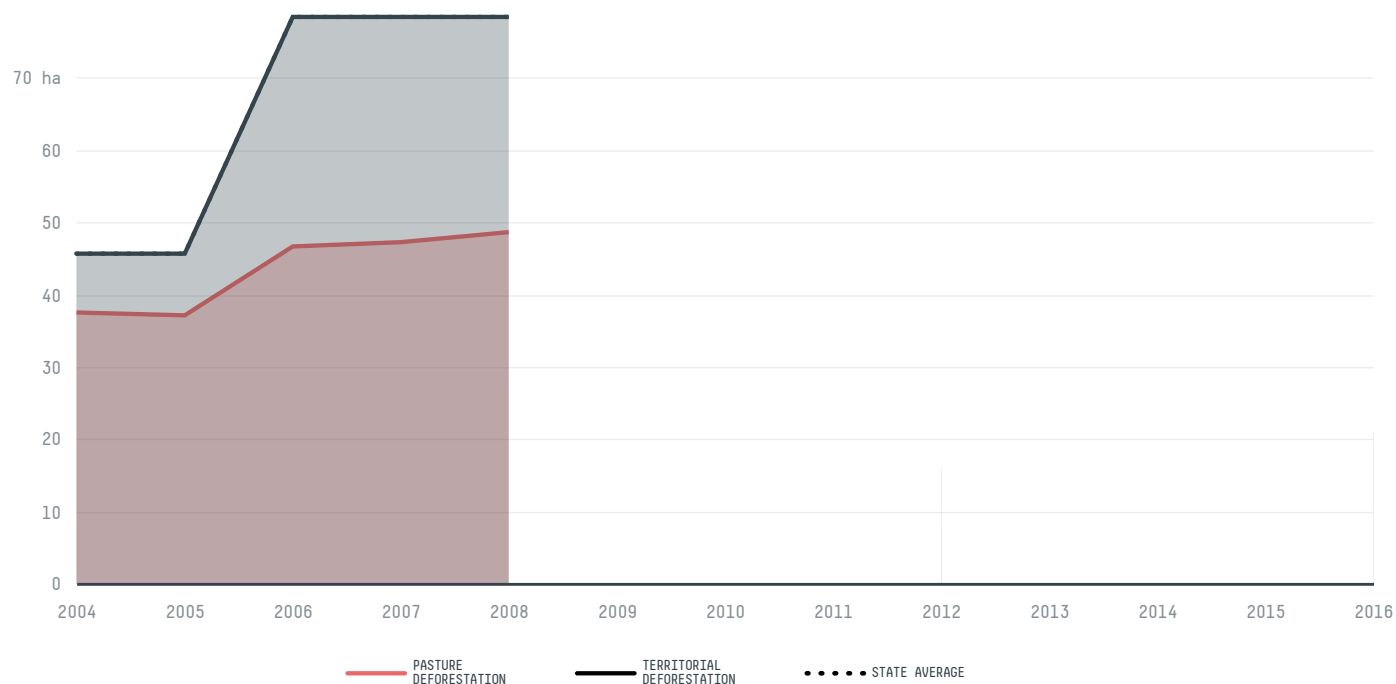

The largest exporter of beef in Ibicui was Jbs, which accounted for 60.0% of the total exports, and the main destination was China (Hong Kong).

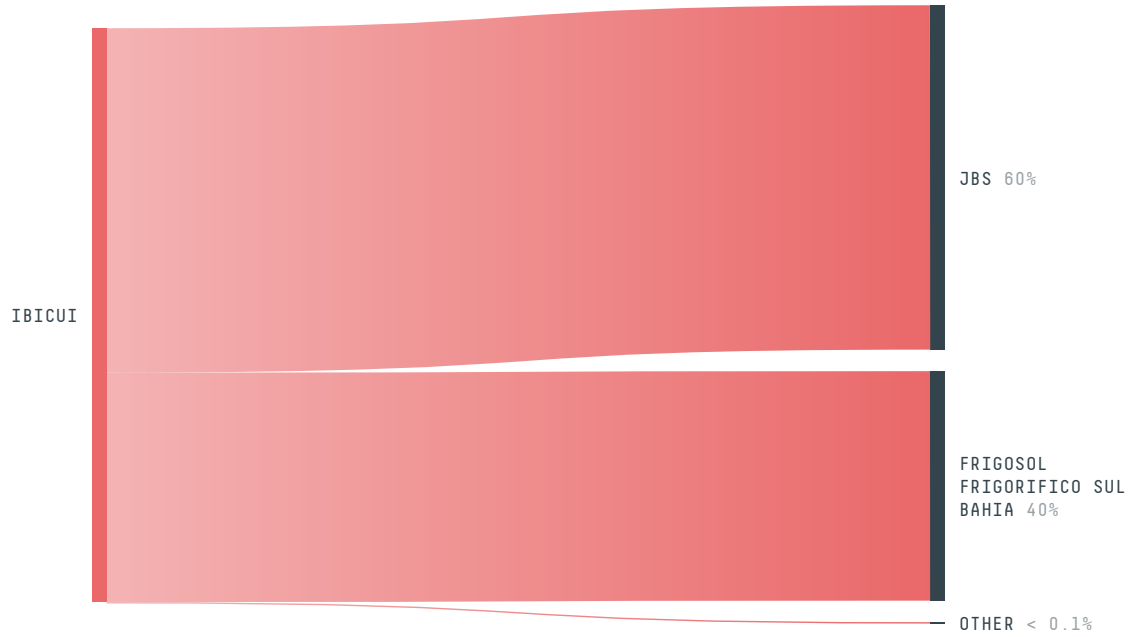

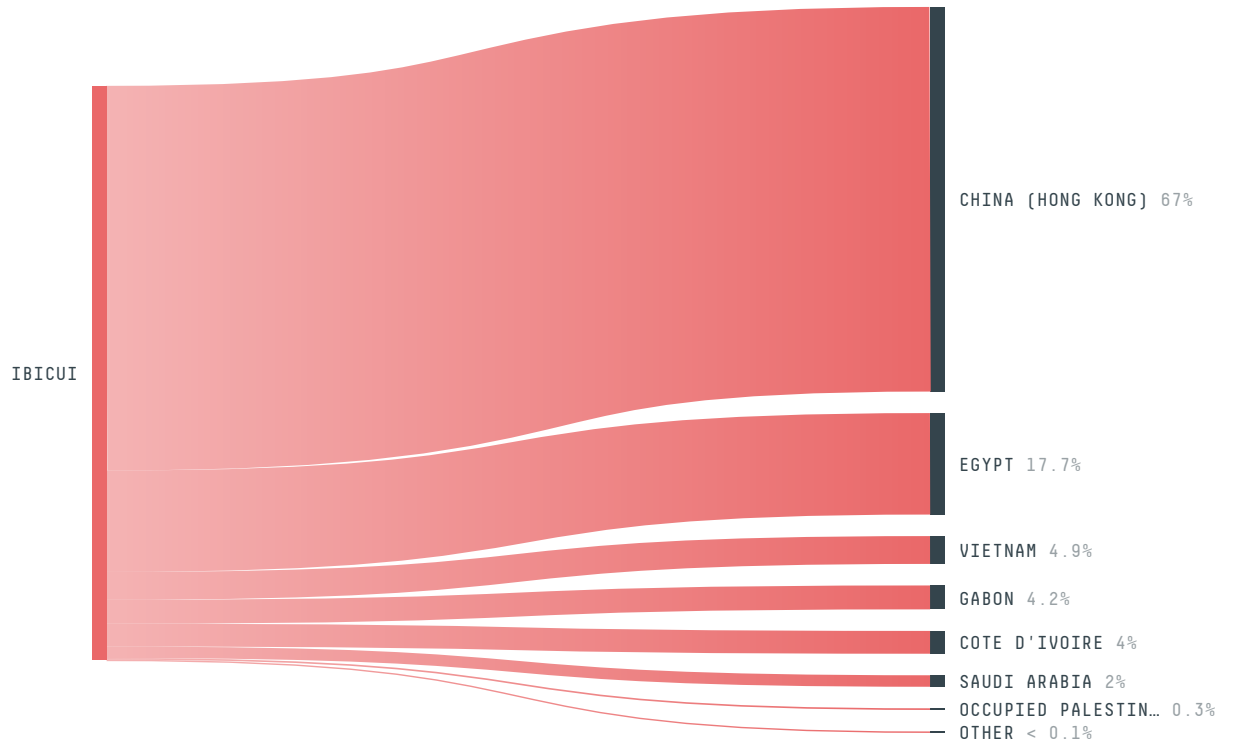
DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF IBICUI
