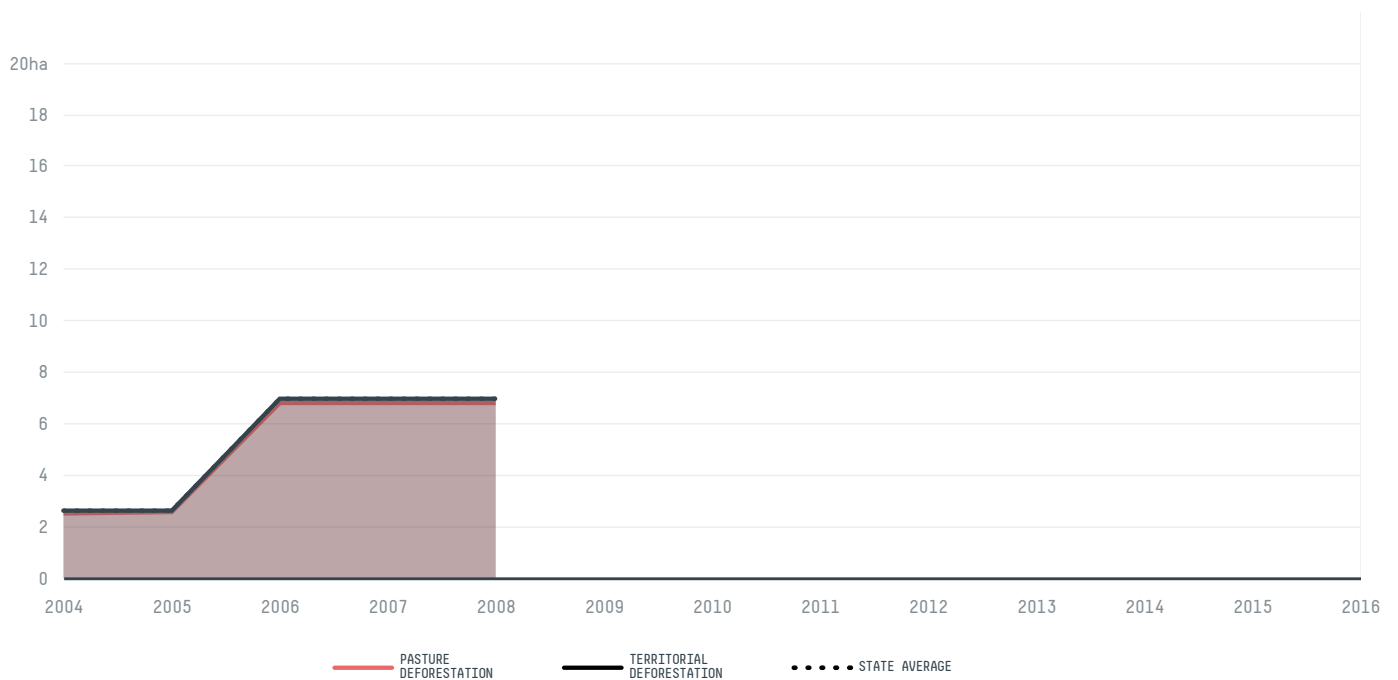

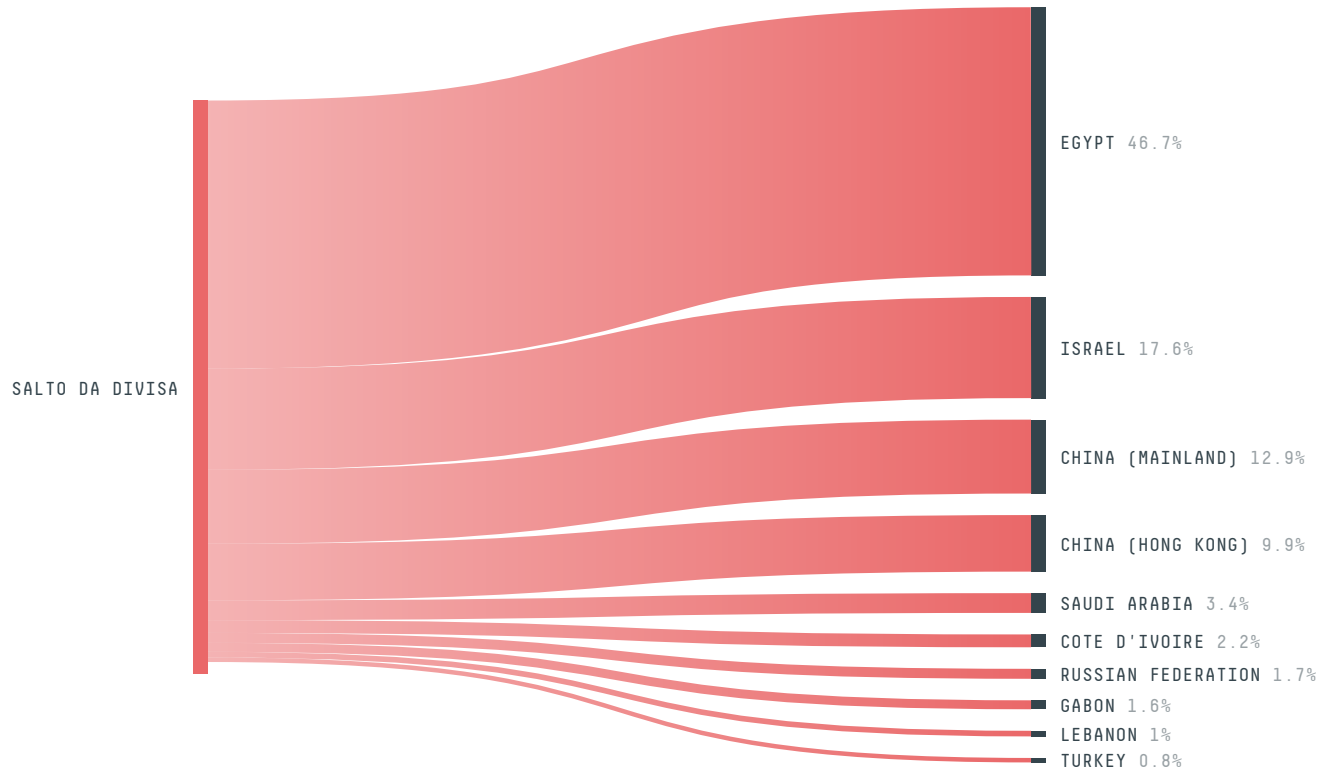

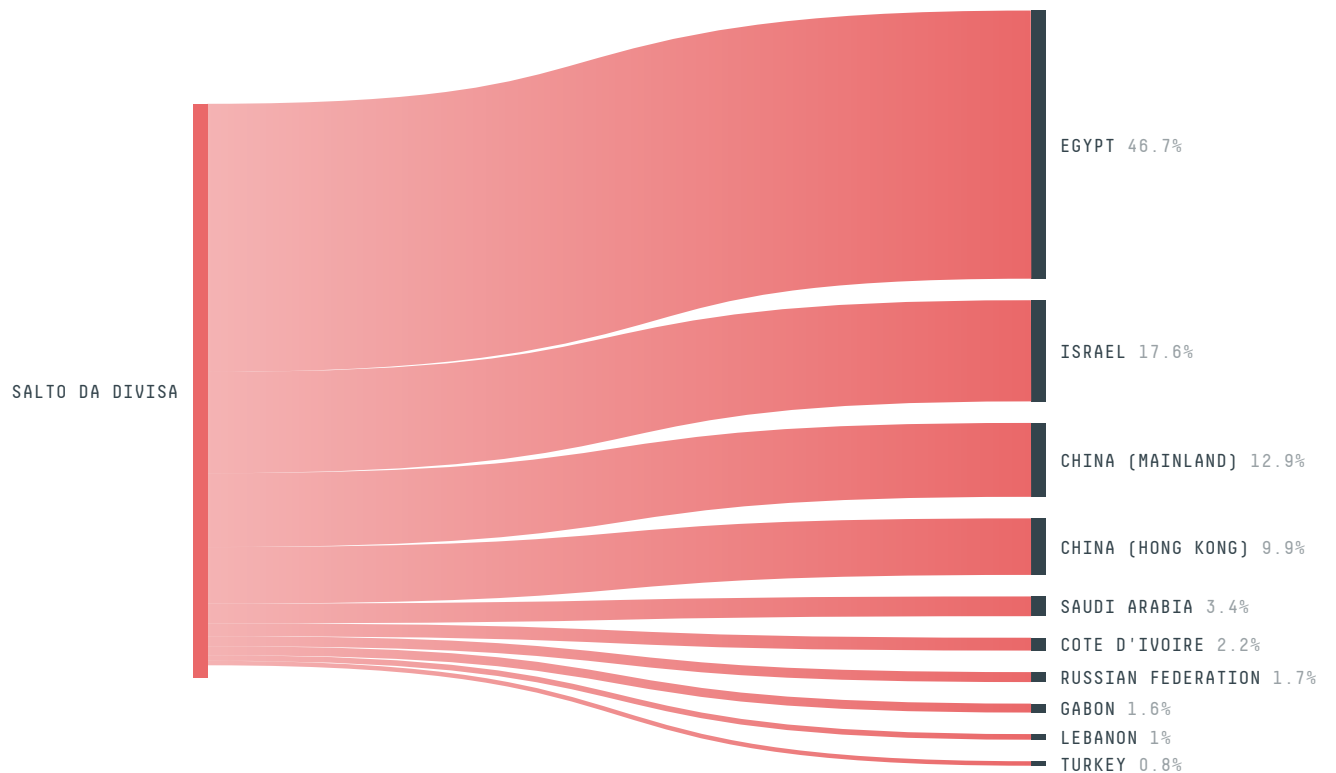
DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF SALTO DA DIVISA
