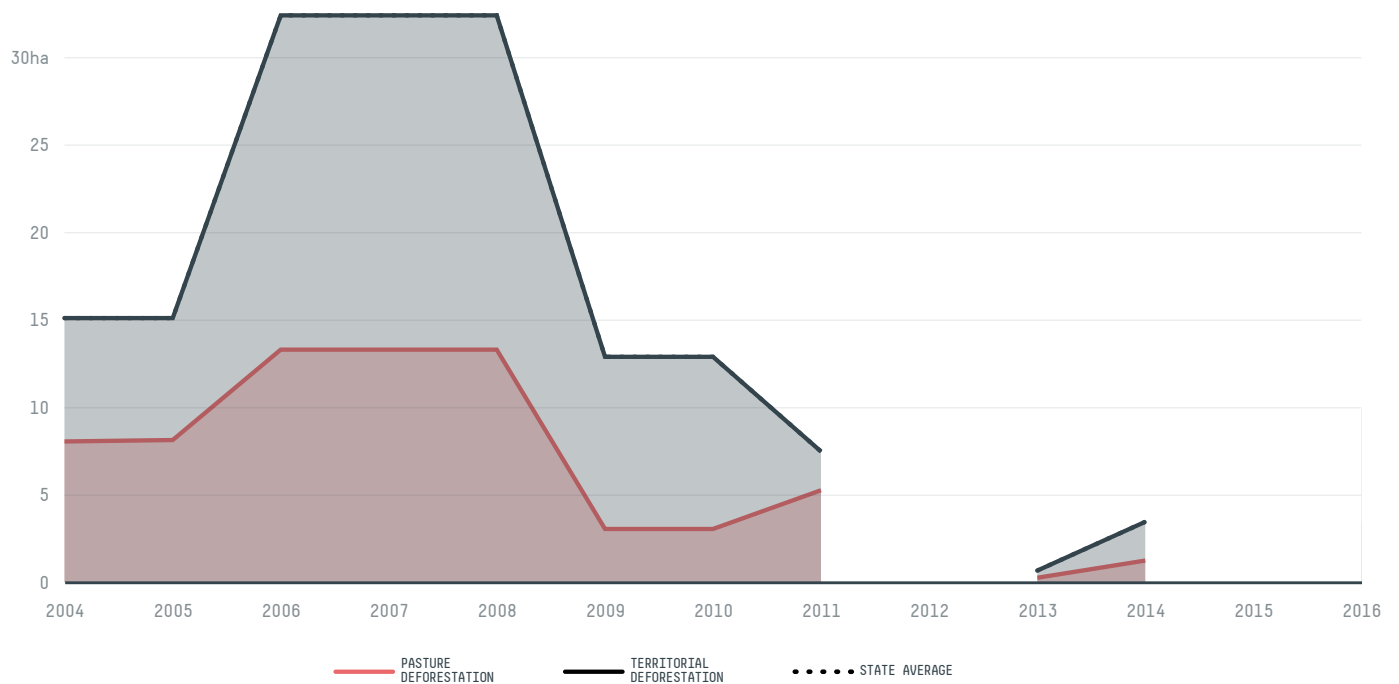

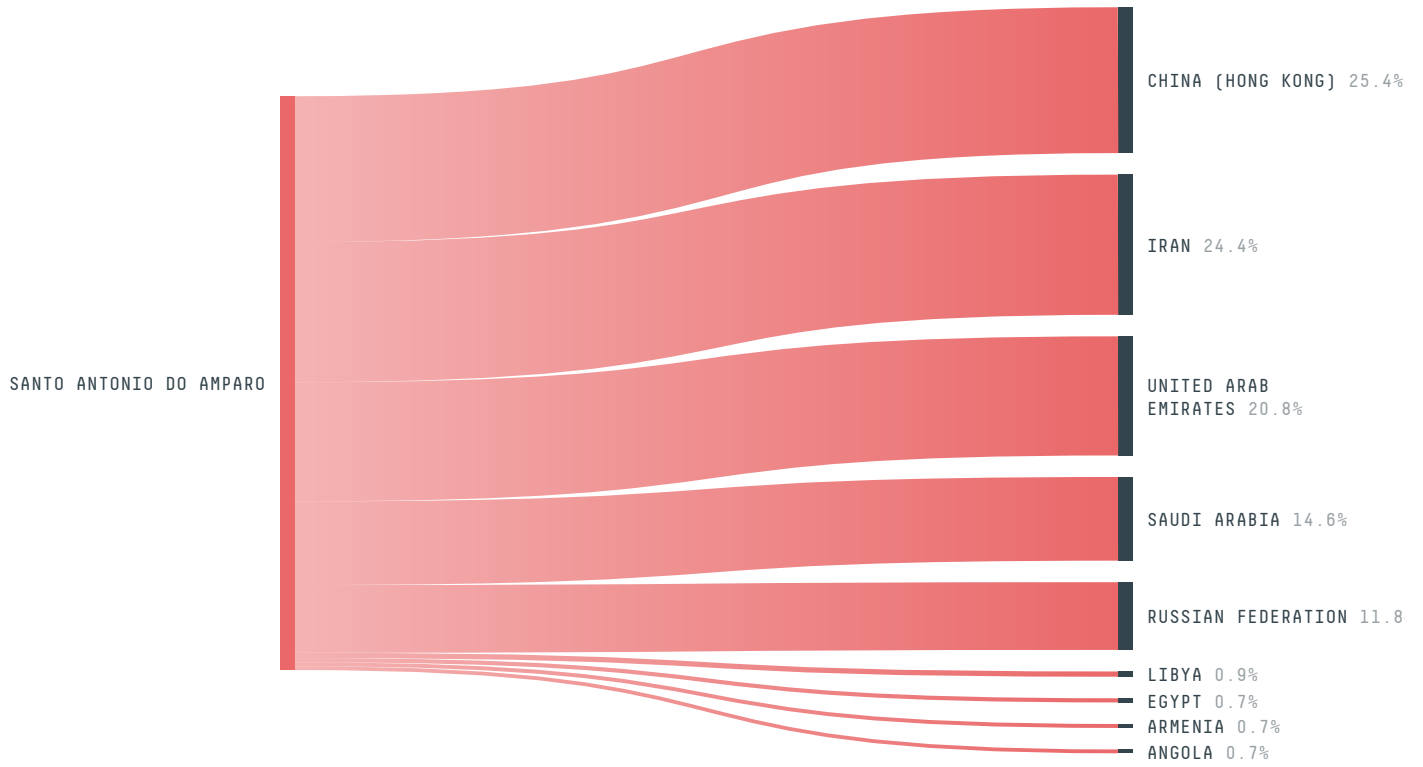

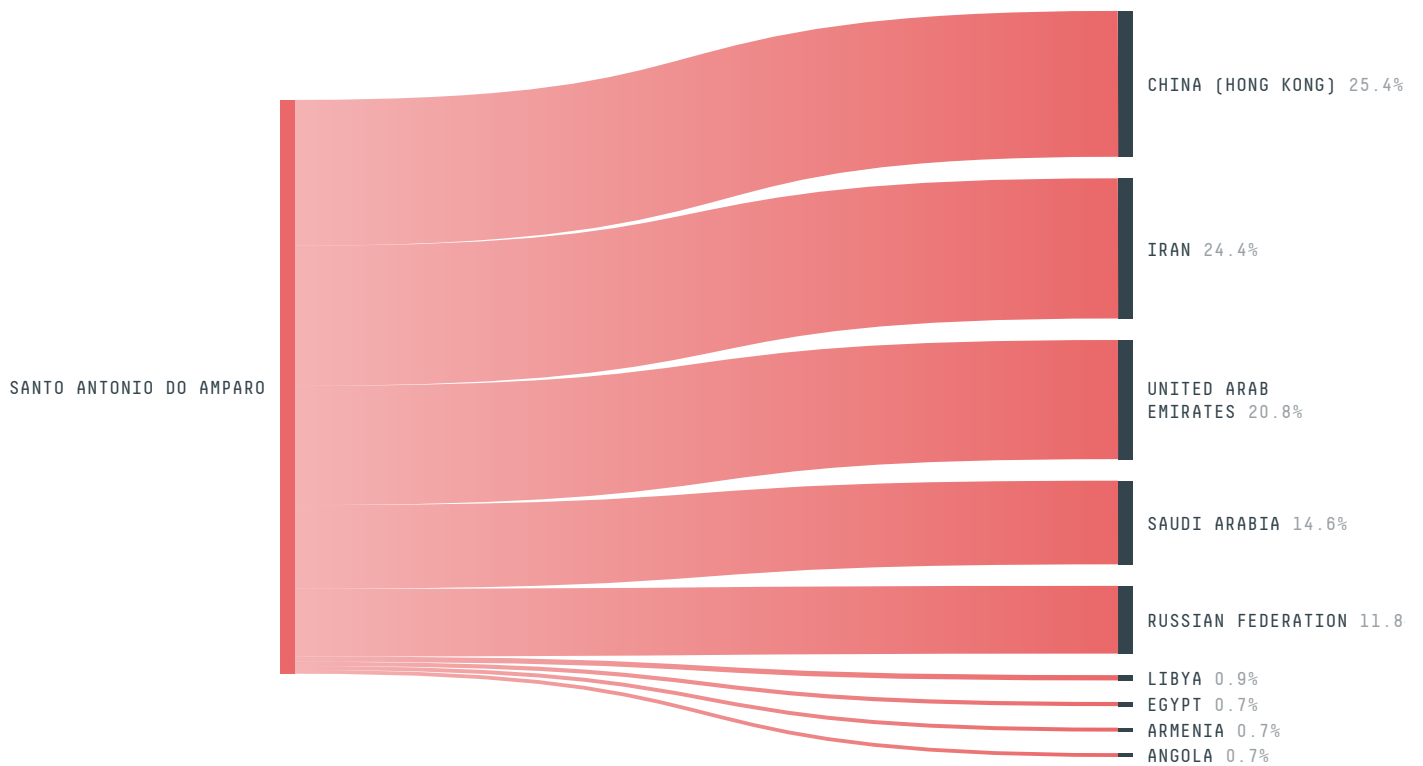
## DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF SANTO ANTONIO DO AMPARO
