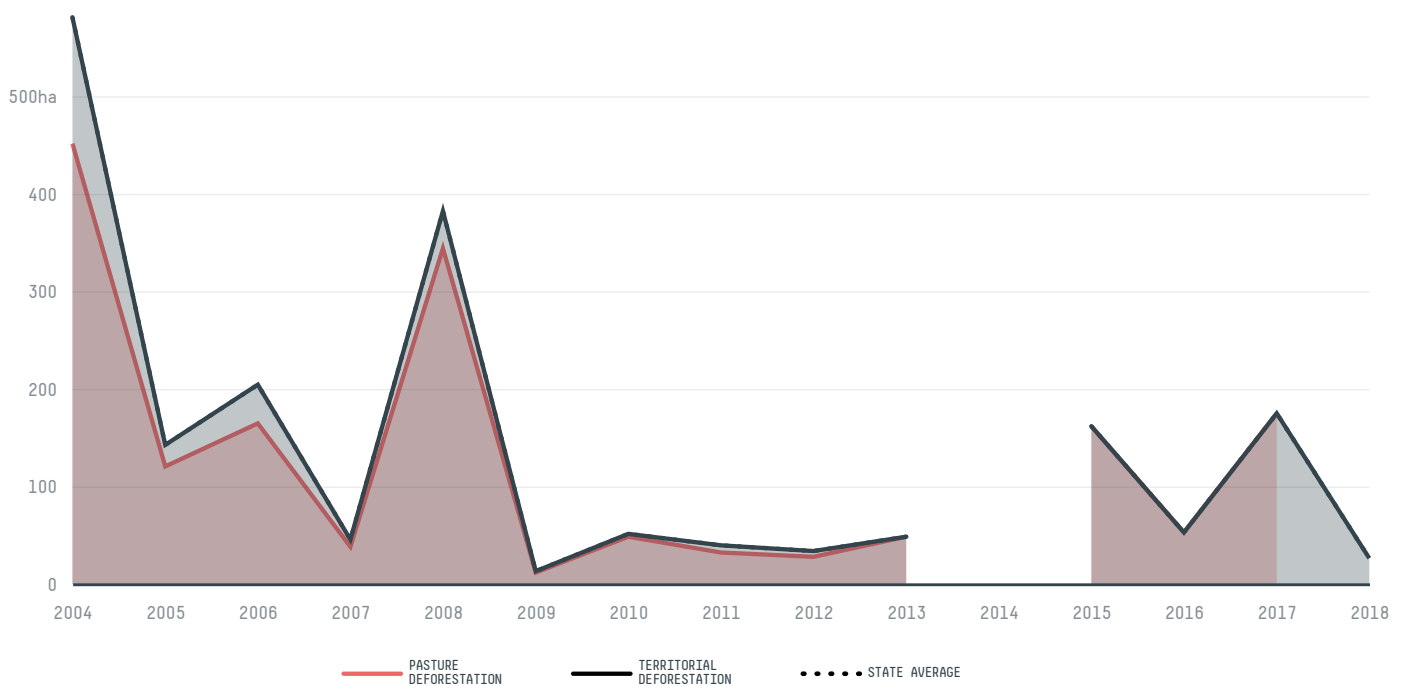

The largest exporter of beef in Peixe Boi was Mercurio Alimentos, which accounted for 83.6% of the total exports, and the main destination was Egypt.

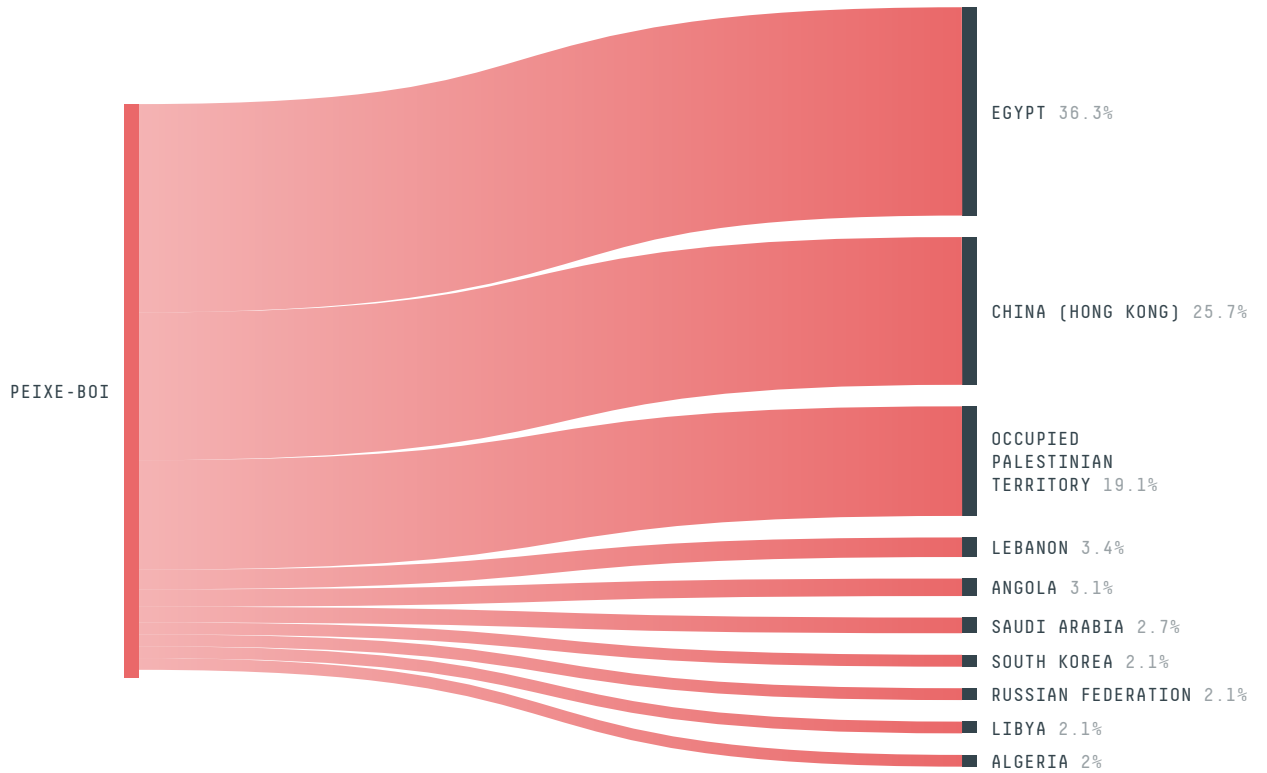

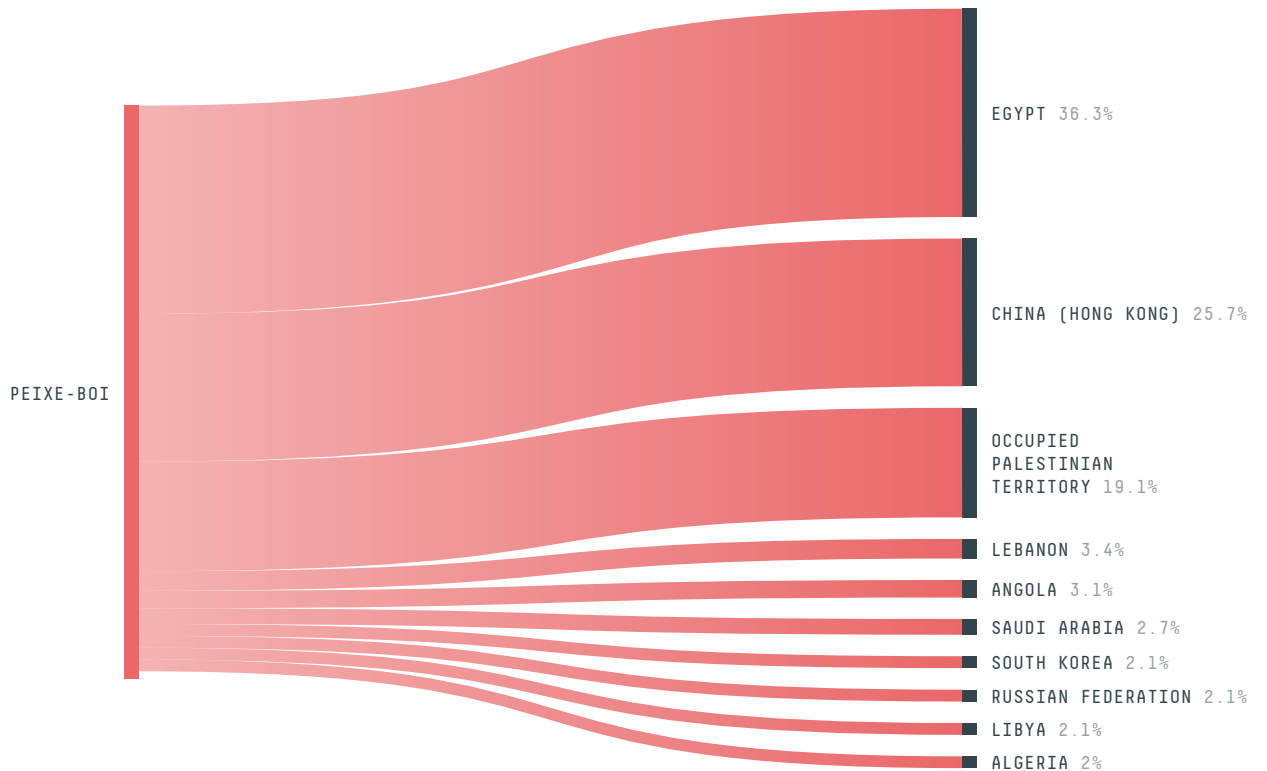
DEFORESTATION TRAJECTORY OF PEIXE-BOI
